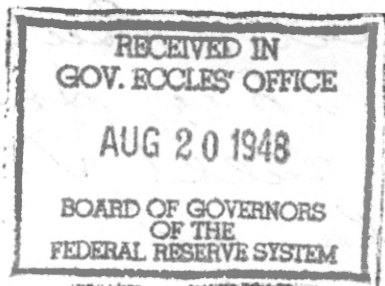
Dear Governor:
