I am just in receipt of a general letter from Garner M.
Lester, President of the National Tax Equality Association, 231 South
La Salle Street, Chicago, Illinois. This letter sets forth the urgent
need of more revenue for the United States Government, and cur good
friend, Marriner S. Eccles, whose judgment I will take against any man's
in Washington, advised that the loop holes should be picked up and closed.

So many institutions that are going under the cloak of religious institutions and other public or charitable concerns, are in competition with the free economy of our Government, and they should be picked up and their properties assessed, like all other revenue property from which taxes are being collected.

It is an unfair proposition to the every day man who is now burdened, to be forced to carry the burden for all these tax-dodgers in the United States of America, and we know they are plentiful.
