My dear Mr. Eccles:

Many thanks for your kind favor of December 21st. I appreciate very much the stenographic transcription of your address before the American Bankers Association Convention in New Orleans in November. It is an able and straight forward statement of the facts and certainly should be redounded greatly to the advantage of the Administration.

I hope the recent adverse decisions of the Supreme Court will not have a detrimental effect on Mr. Roosevelt's re-election. So far as we are concerned in this state the new registration shows two Democrats to one Republican and I trust that this is the way we will find the ballots when counted in November.
