Dear Chairman Eccles:

Because we believe that the security of every American is inextricably linked with the fate of England and her Empire, we beg you to do all in your power to support and sustain her cause. If she is in need of American credits to continue the war, please let her have them somehow - and immediately, for her morale must be maintained, and her weapons increased. There is no time to lose. We must not, and cannot let her lose. In the event of a German victory, the United States would stand alone in a world vowed to destroy it, and the American people would be forced to fight that most costly in lives of all types of war, the one that is fought on the defendant's own
