I am a veteran of two Warld Wars and I wish to make it very clear to you personally that I did not fight to preserve in Washington a public official who would dare to rob and steal and confiscate my capitel gains: you know that England have mever had a capital gains tay throughout this war. The men who have fought in War are not coming fome to be robbed by the government they

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have set up over them you may be give sure of that Mr. Eccles. If you make any more other than to ABOLISH the apital gains tax entirely you are going to be placed in the same category as a robber and a thick. you peofele have been in Washington so long you have grown viciously callous to the wilfare of those whose servants you are. you my be surprised to learn that we the people - set up this government for our own protection and not by the Widest stretch of the imagination did We suppose you could decend so low as to propose to rob and steal our private property.
