# 20%

The share of goods imported to the United States from China in 2014, up from 8 percent in 1999.

# 13.5%

In 2014, the share of imports to China from the United States made up of electrical equipment.

# 23.3%

In 2014, the share of exports from China to the United States made up of electrical equipment.

# 23.7%

The share of all U.S. exports that went to Canada in 1999, making it by far the largest U.S. export market. (Mexico was second at 12.6 percent.)

# 19.3%

The share of all U.S. exports that went to Canada in 2014, still the largest U.S. export market. (Mexico was still second largest at 14.8 percent.)

# 19.0%

The share that exports from Canada to the United States made up in 1999, making Canada the largest exporter to the United States.

# 19.9%

The share that exports from China to the United States made up in 2014, making China the largest exporter to the United States.  
(Canada was second largest at 14.8 percent.)

# 61.6%

In 2000, the share of Mexico's exports to China made up by beer, making it the largest import from Mexico to China.

# 17.6%

In 2014, the share of Mexico's exports to China made up by motor cars and motor vehicles, making it the largest import from Mexico to China.

# 6.3%

In 1980, the share of Hong Kong's exports that went to China.

# 53.9%

In 2014, the share of Hong Kong's exports that went to China.
