INFORMATION REGARDING QUALIFICATIONS OF AGENTS FOR SALE OF WAR SAVINGS AND THRIFT STAMPS

Agents of the First Class may order stamps in any quantity desired, basing their orders for WAR SAVINGS stamps in units of half sheets (40 stamps). THRIFT STAMPS in units of full sheets (300 stamps). Orders under this classification must be accompanied by Chicago Exchange.

CASH Agents of the Second Class are to be governed by the same regulations as agents of the first class, but must order not less than \$1000 par value certificate stamps. Such agents have the privilege of returning unsold stamps, as per conditions outlined in Circular #96. Copy of this circular is enclosed. You will find attached to it Forms 1025 and 1026, which, when properly executed and returned to this office, accompanied by Chicago Exchange, will insure immediate shipment of stamps.

Agents of the Second Class may obtain stamps on consignment in amounts of not less than \$1000 and up to \$50,000 by depositing Liberty Loan Bonds or U. S. Certificates of Indebtedness as collateral. For description of securities covering amounts of \$50,000 or over consult Circular #92, which will be mailed upon request. For details concerning agents of the Second Class see Circular #95. All forms in connection with this classification are enclosed herewith.
