TO THE MEMBER BANK ADDRESSED:

At the meeting of the Board of Directors, held Tuesday, the 10th instant, the following changes were made in our official staff.

The office of Deputy Governor and Cashier, formerly held by Mr. Lynn P. Talley, was divided and two separate positions created.

Mr. Talley was elected Deputy Governor.

Mr. Sam R. Lawder, formerly Manager of the Houston Branch, was elected Cashier. Mr. Lawder will assume his new duties about March 1st.

Mr. Paul G. Taylor resigned as Assistant Cashier, effective February 7th, to accept the position of Cashier of the Tenison National Bank of Dallas.

Mr. Dwight P. Reordan, Assistant Cashier, in charge of the War Loan Department, has been also placed in charge of the District Clearing House and Mailing departments.

Mr. E. F. Gossett, formerly Cashier of the Houston Branch, was elected Director of the Branch, and designated Manager, succeeding Mr. Lawder.

Mr. Paul S. Miller, formerly Assistant Federal Reserve Agent and Auditor of the Houston Branch, was elected Cashier, succeeding Mr. Gossett.

Mr. J. H. Niendorff, formerly Assistant Federal Reserve Agent and Auditor of the El Paso Branch, was appointed to the same position at Houston, succeeding Mr. Miller.

Mr. R. L. King, formerly Auditor of the War Loan Department, was appointed Assistant Federal Reserve Agent and Auditor of the El Paso Branch, succeeding Mr. Niendorff.

The changes mentioned, affecting the branches, become effective as soon as the gentlemen concerned can be conveniently relieved of their present duties.

The name of the "War Loan Department" of the bank has been changed to "Fiscal Agency Department."
