Time Limit on Telegraphic Transfers

We are in receipt of advice from the Federal Reserve Bank of New York that effective Monday, March 29, 1920, the daylight saving schedule will be observed by it, opening and closing at local time, namely, one hour earlier than standard time.

Our Circular No. 19, Series of 1919, "Time Limit on Telegraphic Transfers," therefore is amended as follows:

(\*Wire transfers cannot be effected on Saturdays as New York closes 9 A. M. El Paso time.)
