To the Member Bank Addressed:

On Monday, July 5, all Federal Reserve banks and branches will be closed in observance of Independence Day, which falls on Sunday, with the exception of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta, since there is no provision in the laws of the State of Georgia for the observance on Monday of a holiday that falls on Sunday.

In addition, we are advised by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System that Saturday, July 24, Pioneer Day in Utah, will be observed as a holiday by the Salt Lake City Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.

While Tuesday, July 13, Forrest's Birthday, is a legal holiday in the State of Tennessee, the Nashville Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta and the Memphis Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis will be open for such business as may be legally transacted.

This information is being transmitted to your bank for its guidance in connection with transit operations and transfers of funds.
