**To the Member and Nonmember Clearing Banks  
of the Eleventh Federal Reserve District:**

Please refer to the time schedule effective March 28, 1955, which is part of our Bulletin No. 6, dated April 1, 1954. On this schedule it is stated that if any Federal Reserve bank or branch should adopt Daylight Saving Time, the time shown on the schedule would automatically be advanced one hour for the period of time the Daylight Saving Plan is observed by such Federal Reserve bank or branch.

For your information the Federal Reserve banks and branches in the cities shown below will observe Daylight Saving Time as indicated:

Boston . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
Cleveland . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
Baltimore . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
St. Louis . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
Louisville . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
San Francisco . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
Los Angeles . . . . .	From April 29 to September 30
New York . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28
Buffalo . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28
Philadelphia . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28
Pittsburgh . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28
Nashville . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28
Chicago . . . . .	From April 29 to October 28

During those periods, our time limit for the acceptance of wire transfers to such Federal Reserve banks and branches, for completion on date of receipt, will be one hour earlier than the time shown on our schedule.
