**AMENDMENT TO SAVINGS BOND REGULATIONS**

**To All Banking Institutions and Others Concerned  
in the Eleventh Federal Reserve District:**

There is enclosed a copy of the Third Amendment to Treasury Department Circular No. 905, Second Revision, pertaining to the inscribing of owners' identifying numbers on Series H savings bonds.

As stated in our circular letter dated January 24, 1963, tax account numbers must be shown on applications for the purchase of Series H bonds, for the reissue of Series H and K bonds and for the exchange of eligible savings bonds of other series for bonds of Series H.

Application Form No. FA 906 for the purchase of Series H bonds has been revised and now provides a space for showing the identifying number of the owner or first-named coowner, and a supply is enclosed for immediate use. Any of the old forms which you have on hand should be destroyed.

Additional copies of the amendment and supplies of the application form will be furnished upon request.

Section 332.10 of Department Circular No. 905, Second Revision, dated September 23, 1959 (31 CFR, 1962 Supp., 332), is hereby supplemented by the addition of subsection (c) as follows:

(c) *Identifying numbers.*—The applicant will furnish the appropriate identifying number of the owner or first-named coowner, as the case may be, required to be used on tax returns and other documents submitted to the Internal Revenue Service (an individual's social security account number or employer identification number), and the issuing agent will, in addition to the other data prescribed by Sec. 332.5, include such identifying number on the bond following the name of the owner or first-named coowner.
