## RETURN OF MINT AND FEDERAL RESERVE MONEY SACKS

## TO THE CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, EACH BANK IN THE ELEVENTH FEDERAL RESERVE DISTRICT:

As you are aware, bank operating costs continue to rise and supplies of some materials are not always available when ordered. The cost of money sacks has risen sharply in the past few months, and some difficulty has been encountered in obtaining deliveries by suppliers. In order to hold our new sack purchase costs within reasonable limits and to get as much use as possible out of the sacks already purchased, we would appreciate your asking your staff to return to your Federal Reserve office the empty money sacks bearing Mint or Federal Reserve Bank designations. Shipments of these sacks can be made by armored carrier at the time money deliveries are made, if car space is available, or by fourthclass mail. Your bank will be reimbursed for any mail expense incurred. As in the past, we will continue to return money sacks bearing the name of your bank to you at our expense.
