AMENDMENT TO REGULATION V

TO ALL BANKS IN THE ELEVENTH FEDERAL RESERVE DISTRICT:

The Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System has amended Regulation V, "Loan Guarantees for Defense Production," effective February 4, 1976.

The amendment, which effects Section 1, substitutes two newly-created agencies for the Atomic Energy Commission in the listing of agencies authorized to guarantee V-loans. The new agencies are the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the Energy Research and Development Administration.

LOAN GUARANTEES FOR DEFENSE PRODUCTION

AMENDMENT TO REGULATION V †

Effective February 4, 1976, Section 1 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1 — AUTHORITY

This regulation is based upon and issued pursuant to the Defense Production Act of 1950 (referred to in this regulation as the "Act"), and Executive Order No. 10480, dated August 14, 1953 as amended (3 CFR 1949-1953 Comp., p. 962) (referred to in this regulation as the "Order"), and after consultation with the heads

of the guaranteeing agencies designated in the Act and the Order, namely the Department of the Army, the Department of the Navy, the Department of the Air Force, the Department of Commerce, the Department of the Interior, the Department of Agriculture, the General Services Administration, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the Energy Research and Development Administration, the Defense Supply Agency, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.
