OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

TO ALL BANKS IN THE ELEVENTH FEDERAL RESERVE DISTRICT:

The Board of Directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas has elected Robert H. Boykin as First Vice President of this Bank, effective December 1, 1976. Mr. Boykin, whose election has been approved by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, will succeed Tom W. Plant who will reach compulsory retirement age at that time after serving 47 years with the Bank, the last 8 years as First Vice President.

Mr. Boykin is currently Senior Vice President of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas. He was employed by the Bank in 1953 in the Legal Department and was elected to the official position of Assistant Counsel in 1959. He became Assistant Secretary of the Board in 1961, was elected Assistant Vice President and Assistant Secretary in 1965, was named Secretary of the Board in 1967, was elected Vice President and Secretary of the Board in 1968, Senior Vice President and Secretary of the Board in January 1971, and Senior Vice President in January 1976. He served as Secretary of the Conference of Presidents of the Federal Reserve Banks during the year 1963-64.

Mr. Boykin was born in Carlsbad, New Mexico, and attended high school in Big Spring, Texas. He holds B.B.A. and J.D. degrees from The University of Texas and is also a graduate of the School of Banking of the South at Louisiana State University. Mr. Boykin has attended management courses at Texas A&M University and the American Management Association in New York.
