SPECIAL ELECTION OF CLASS B DIRECTOR REPORT OF NOMINATIONS — VOTING PROCEDURES

To All Member Banks

in the Eleventh Federal Reserve District:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 4 of the Federal Reserve Act, as amended by the Federal Reserve Reform Act of 1977, and my circular dated January 23, 1979, in regard to the special election of a Class B Director of this Bank to succeed Gerald D. Hines who resigned as a Class B Director to accept appointment as a Class C Director of this Bank effective January 1, 1979, and to serve the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending December 31, 1980, there are given herein the names of the candidates nominated for such directorship and the names of the banks which made the nominations.

Except in the case of any member banks that are subsidiaries of the same bank holding company,* there is sent herewith to each bank in Group 3 a ballot for use in voting for a Class B Director. Also enclosed are an envelope bearing on its face the certificate in regard to the vote and a colored envelope marked "Ballot — Directors' Election," in which the ballot is to be sealed. When several banks are subsidiaries of a bank holding company, the voting forms are being sent only to the bank designated to participate in this election; therefore, banks in Group 3 that will not participate in this election are being sent this circular, without forms, for their information.

The ballot and certificate on the envelope must be executed by an officer who has been authorized to cast the vote. A list of the designated officers, revised to date, forms a part of this circular. In order that the balloting may be secret, the name of the bank and the voting officer should not be written on the ballot but only on the certificate envelope. If the official signature of the officer casting the ballot has not been filed with this Federal Reserve Bank, such official signature should be filed before the polls close.

Please follow carefully the instructions which are printed on the ballot, on the envelopes, and on page 3 of this circular.

The following procedure is required in the case of the Class B ballots:

- (1) The preferential ballot should be marked.
- (2) It should then be placed in the colored envelope marked "Ballot Directors' Election" and that envelope sealed.
- (3) Then after the certificate on the white certificate envelope is executed, the colored sealed envelope (containing the ballot) should be placed within the white certificate envelope and that envelope sealed.
- (4) The sealed white certificate envelope containing the sealed ballot envelope should then be returned to me in the enclosed self-addressed envelope.

"... That whenever any member banks within the same Federal Reserve district are subsidiaries of the same bank holding company within the meaning of the Bank Holding Company Act of 1956, participation in any such nomination or election by such member banks, including such bank holding company if it is also a member bank, shall be confined to one of such banks, which may be designated for the purpose by such holding company."

In this connection, the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System has ruled that a holding company affiliate, having one or more subsidiary banks in each of the three groups into which member banks of a Federal Reserve district are divided for the purpose of electing directors, may designate one such bank in each group to participate in the nomination and election of each Class A Director and each Class B Director chosen by the group of which such bank is a member, and such member bank so designated may validly participate in such nomination and election. Accordingly, banks in Group 3 affected by the foregoing provision of law are requested to take prompt action to have the appropriate bank holding company designate, if it has not already designated, one of such banks to participate in this election.

^{*}Section 4 of the Federal Reserve Act, as amended, reads in part as follows:

Under the law, the ballot must be returned so as to reach me within 15 days after its receipt. The polls will open on March 7, 1979, and close at 2 p.m. on March 22, 1979. At that time, the ballot box will be opened at this Bank, the sealed envelopes containing the ballots will be opened, the votes counted, and the results of the election announced. The candidates are invited to be present or represented on that occasion.

While the banks in Group 1 (consisting of banks having capital and surplus of \$6,000,000 and over) and Group 2 (consisting of banks having capital and surplus of \$1,000,000 and over, but under \$6,000,000) will not vote in this election, this circular is sent to them, without forms, for their information.

IMPORTANT

For your information, there is quoted below an extract from Section 4 of the Federal Reserve Act which sets forth the method of balloting:

"Within fifteen days after receipt of the list of candidates the duly authorized officer of a member bank shall certify to the chairman his first, second, and other choices for director of Class A or Class B, respectively, upon a preferential ballot upon a form furnished by the chairman of the board of directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of the district. Each such officer shall make a cross opposite the name of the first, second, and other choices for a director of Class A and for a director of Class B, but shall not vote more than one choice for any one candidate."

In the case of the Class B ballots (Group 3), where there are four candidates involved, a member bank, in making its first, second, and third choices, will be deemed to have indicated the other candidate as its fourth choice.

JOE D. BARBEE

Joe D. Barbee is President and Chief Executive Officer of Barbee Neuhaus Implement Company, Weslaco, Texas. Barbee Neuhaus Implement Company is the largest John Deere dealership in the State of Texas and serves customers in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas. Mr. Barbee is President of Agra-Leasing Company of Weslaco, a leasing and financing corporation serving primarily the same area as Barbee Neuhaus Implement Company. Mr. Barbee is Vice President and serves on the Board of Directors of Llano Grande Lake Park situated near Mercedes, Texas.

Mr. Barbee was born on December 26, 1923, in Weslaco, Texas. He attended the Weslaco Public Schools and graduated from the Weslaco Independent School District in May 1942. He entered Texas A&M University in September 1942. In February 1943, he enlisted in the Air Force for service during World War II. He served as a P38 fighter pilot in the 13th Air Force. His principal service was in the Pacific Theater of operations, with primary bases in the Philippine Islands and New Guinea. At the present time, he is a Major in the Air Force Reserve on inactive status. After service in World War II, he returned to Texas A&M University where he graduated in January 1949 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture.

After graduation from Texas A&M University, he returned to the Rio Grande Valley. Upon his return, he initially served in the Research Department of Rio Farms, with principal work in citrus and avocadoes. Following his employment with Rio Farms, he was the south Texas representative for the Niagara Chemical Division of Food Machinery Corporation in its fertilizer and insecticide divison. In 1956, he terminated his relationship with Niagara Chemical to join his present company.

Mr. Barbee has been active in area community affairs, being a past member of the Weslaco Kiwanis Club, a former director of the Weslaco Chamber of Commerce, and a former director of the Rio Grande Valley Council of Boy Scouts. He is an elder in the First Presbyterian Church of Weslaco.

Mr. Barbee is married to the former Loretta Chenik of Weslaco, Texas, and they have two children. Mr. Barbee's son, William Terry, is a business graduate from Southern Methodist University and is associated with Mr. Barbee in the Barbee Neuhaus Implement Company. Mr. Barbee's daughter, Susan Jenkins, is a business graduate of Stephen F. Austin University and is employed by Cushman & Wakefield in Dallas, Texas.

KENT GILBREATH

Born in Central Texas, Dr. Gilbreath was reared in in Valley Mills, Texas, where he worked throughout his youth in his father's general store and on the family farm. He graduated from Valley Mills High School as valedictorian of his class. He was also active in sports in high school being selected to the Super Centex Football Team. After high school, he attended Baylor University where he earned his B.A. degree in Economics magna cum laude. One year later he received his Master's degree from Baylor, and then went on to earn his Ph.D. in Economics at the University of Florida. Throughout his collegiate years, Dr. Gilbreath earned numerous awards, including an Humble Oil Company scholarship and several fellowships.

Before joining the faculty of World Campus Afloat, he was a professor in the School of Business at Northeastern State College in Tahlequah, Oklahoma.

The University of Oklahoma has published a book by Dr. Gilbreath dealing with small business development. He has also published several articles dealing with such topics as world commodity markets, international finance, population projections for Texas, and tax reform in Texas. He has received research grants from various organizations including the General Mills Foundation and the World Order Foundation.

At Baylor, he has served as Chairman of the University Council and Chairman of the Steering Committee of the Institute of Environmental Studies. He has also served on the School of Business' Executive Council and served as Chairman of the School of Business Alumni Committee.

In addition to being a member of several professional and honorary associations, he is a member of the McLennan County Mental Health Association and the Central Texas Zoological Society. He has also served as an advisor to the Heart of Texas Council of Governments. He founded and coached the Baylor Soccer Team and helped organize the Y.M.C.A. youth soccer program in Waco. He also served as Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Texas Collegiate Soccer League. He is a member of the 7th and James Baptist Church in Waco.

Dr. Gilbreath is married to the former Shirley Nims of Santa Fe, New Mexico. They have two daughters both of whom are still in school. The Gilbreaths live in Waco, but Dr. Gilbreath enjoys spending as much time as possible at the family farm in Valley Mills.

Pete Morales, Jr., President and General Manager, Morales Feed Lots, Inc., Devine, Texas, served as a director of the San Antonio Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas from 1973 to 1978 and as its Chairman in 1975 and again in 1978.

A native of San Antonio, Mr. Morales was educated in San Antonio schools and received his B.B.A. degree in Productions Management from St. Mary's University.

Mr. Morales has been involved in the cattle business since completion of his high school education. He started with his father, operating a 625-acre ranch south of Devine, and Mr. Morales worked with the cattle operation while attending St. Mary's University. Since graduation, he has devoted full time to the business and is now the owner of Morales Feed Lots, Inc. Currently, the feedlot handles 8,000 head of cattle at a time and processes about 24,000

head each year. One of the unique features of the operation is the recycling of feedlot waste as fertilizer on 500 acres of Coastal Bermuda grass located around the feedlot. The coastal hay, along with alfalfa pellets produced at the company feedmill, is used for feed in the feeding operation as well as being sold in the south Texas area.

He is a director of the Medina Electric Cooperative, currently serving as its President, and a member of the Board of the Devine Independent School District. In addition, he serves as a Trustee of St. Mary's University; is a member of the National Rifle Association of America, Devine Chamber of Commerce, Texas Feed and Grain Dealers Association, the Coastal Bermuda Processors Association, and Texas Cattle Feeders Association; and is a past officer of Sembradores de Amistad.
