Fee changes for Federal Reserve accounting services

DETAILS

As of May 1, 1988, the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas will change its fee schedule for accounting services. The changes will affect the following accounting services: duplicate copies of reserve account statements, reserve account tapes, and duplicate copies of billing statements. Many service charges will be based on a monthly fee with single item fees charged only for special orders.

These monthly charges will reduce the work associated with tracking charges on a per item basis and, in some cases, may result in a cost reduction to the customer. The new fees for accounting services are as follows:

Reserve Account Drafts.....\$ 7.00/draft Stop Payments of Reserve Account Drafts.....\$12.00 each Standing Orders of Duplicate Copies of Reserve Account Statements\$75.00/month Special Orders of Duplicate Copies of Reserve Account Statements.....\$ 5.00 each* Reserve Account Tapes\$125.00/month Standing and Special Orders of Duplicate Copies of Billing Statements.....\$ 5.00 each* Billing Reconcilement Tapes.....\$ 5.00/each Offline Contemporaneous Reserve Requirements....\$ 5.00/assistance Offline Telephone Inquiries.....\$ 3.25/each
