The Committee on Unemployment Statistics for New York City, recently appointed in accordance with the recommendations of the President's Unemployment Conference, is now making its second report on unemployment in this City.

During October, you were kind enough to furnish us with confidential information concerning the number of persons on your payroll January 1, 1920, and October 17, 1921. In order that the Committee may accurately estimate the employment trend during the last two months, we desire to secure from you the total number of persons on your payroll as of December 15, 1921. As in the previous case, your name will not appear in the Committee's report and the figures which you furnish will be combined with other data so as not to disclose the source.

If you have instituted any successful remedy for relieving unemployment, we should be interested to learn of the details.



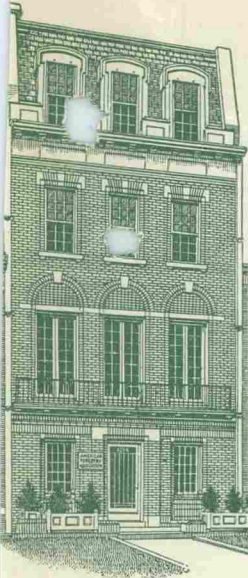

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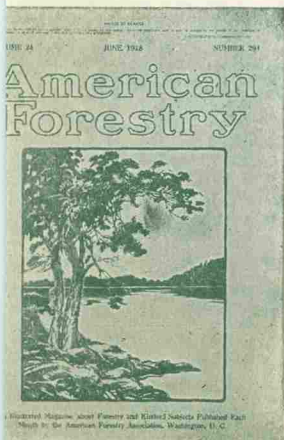
