CHARLES V. AUSTIN

On January 1, 1919 he was transferred to Purchasing Department as a "Page."

He was transferred to the Transit (now Collections) Department as a "Clerk," on August 30, 1920. In 1921 he was made a Junior Clerk; in 1922, an Intermediate Clerk; and in 1923, Section Head and then Senior Clerk.

During 1933 he worked temporarily in the Liquidation Department as Senior Clerk.

Then in May 1934 he was transferred to the Analysis (Accounting) Department.* as Senior Clerk, and then to Analysis Clerk in 1936.

In 1942 he became an Accounting Clerk A in the Accounting Department until 1946 when he became Expense Clerk.

Following that he was made Supervisor of the Expense Unit of the Accounting Department in 1947.

Then on November 21, 1966 he was transferred to the Bank Examination Department to the position of Assistant Bank Examiner.

Mr. Austin will begin service retirement on November 30, 1968 and at that time will have completed fifty years, two months, and eighteen days.

On January 1, 1917 he was promoted to "Bookkeeper."


