PERSONNEL

Number of officers and employees of the parent bank and branches on December 31, 1942, was 1,135, the salaries of 475 being reimbursable on account of fiscal agency operations.

MEMBERSHIP

During 1942, fifteen State banks became members of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, and one member State bank converted into a national bank.

On December 31 there were 450 member banks, of which 318 were national banks and 132 were State banks and trust companies.

The deposits of these member banks aggregate approximately 75 per cent of the deposits of all commercial banks of this district.
