**OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT**

*To All Banks in the  
Eighth Federal Reserve District:*

Victor M. Longstreet has been appointed an Assistant Vice President of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis and will join the Bank's staff on September 1, 1953.

Mr. Longstreet was born in Louisville, Kentucky on January 1, 1907 and attended public schools there. He was graduated from Harvard in 1930.

After one year's employment with the American Telephone and Telegraph Company in New York City, he joined the staff of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, where he served from 1931 to 1942, his last assignment there being Chief, Bank Credit Section, Division of Research and Statistics. He entered the services of the Army Air Force in 1942 as an officer of the Air Staff in Washington, D. C., leaving the services in 1945 as a Lieutenant Colonel.

In 1945 he became an Assistant Division Chief in the State Department, Washington, D. C. Since May 1952 he has been Deputy Director of the Finance Division of the Mutual Security Agency (formerly E.C.A.), Paris, France.
