The Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis is pleased to announce the following official appointments made by the Board of Directors of this bank.

Victor M. Longstreet, Assistant Vice President, was appointed a Vice President of the bank and designated Manager of the Louisville Branch, both effective May 16, 1954. Mr. Longstreet, a native of Louisville, attended the public schools there, and received his A. B. degree from Harvard University. He served on the staff of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System from 1931 to 1942, when he entered military service with the Army Air Staff in Washington, D. C., attaining the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Prior to his connection with this bank in September, 1953, Mr. Longstreet served with the State Department and with the Economic Cooperation Administration.

Fred Burton, Assistant Manager of the Louisville Branch, was appointed a Vice President of the bank effective May 16, and was designated Manager of the Little Rock Branch effective August 1, 1954, to succeed Clarence M. Stewart who will retire on that date. Mr. Burton has been attached to the Louisville Branch since 1920, serving as Assistant Manager for the past ten years. He was born in Shelbyville, Kentucky; is a graduate of the Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University, and a past president of the Louisville Chapter, American Institute of Banking.

Donald L. Henry was appointed an Assistant Manager of the Louisville Branch, effective May 16. Mr. Henry was born in Evansville, Indiana, attended the public schools there, and received his degree of Doctor of Philosophy from Purdue University in 1947. From 1942 through 1946 he served in the Army of the United States, attaining the rank of Captain. Since February, 1947, he has been on the staff of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis.
