Press Release (Official Announcement)

For immediate release May 25, 1956

Mr. William E. Peterson, Vice President of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, having reached retirement age, will retire on June 1, 1956 after more than 38 years in the service of the bank. While he has served in various capacities, most of Mr. Peterson's efforts have been in the field of bank supervision, where he has rendered distinguished service. In May of 1934 he was appointed Chief Examiner and since May of 1944 has been a Vice President of the bank.

Mr. George E. Kroner has been appointed by the Board of Directors as a Vice President of the bank effective June 1, 1956. He has held the official position of Chief Examiner since July 1952, and as Vice President will have charge of the bank's Examination Department, with which he has been connected since 1936. Mr. Kroner joined the bank's staff in 1918.

Mr. Orville O. Wyrick has been appointed by the Board of Directors to the official position of Chief Examiner effective June 1, 1956. He has been Assistant Chief Examiner since January 1954. Mr. Wyrick joined the bank's staff in 1943 and has been associated with the Examination Department since that time.
