A hearing was given by the Federal Reserve Board in the office of the Board at 3:10 p.m., on Monday, May 29, to members of a committee from Baltimore, Maryland, who discussed the introduction of a bill in Congress, giving the Board the right to make changes in Federal reserve cities.
