At a regular meeting of the Federal Reserve Board, held in the office of the Board, on Wednesday, April 25, at 11 a.m.,

The minutes of the meeting of the Board held on April 23 were read and approved.

The minutes of a meeting of the Executive Committee held on April 23 were read and approved, and the action therein set forth ratified.

The question of the establishment of a branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco for the Pacific Northwest, made a special order for this meeting, was taken up and a telegram from Federal Reserve Agent Perrin, dated April 24, read as follows:

"At special directors meeting today by vote six ayes one may it was voted subject to approval of Federal Reserve Board to proceed to establish three full fledged branches at Seattle, Portland and Spokane. Dohrmann and McGregor were absent in subsequent informal discussion. It was decided to make no record of instructions as to which should be first opened or how long time should elapse before opening others but the view was expressed that that phase was administrative and should be left to discretion of Governor who indicated that first would be opened at Spokane and the others as quickly as equally favorable conditions were offered. President of Spokane Clearing House wired that all state banks of that city have agreed to apply for membership in branch located at Spokane. On May second Walton Moore reaches New York. Address Walton N. Moore Dry Goods Company, 72 Leonard Street, if you desire to discuss this or other matters with him. He would willingly run down to Washington on your request.

After discussion, Mr. Miller moved to approve the action of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco as set forth in the above telegram, the Secretary to notify the bank accordingly. The motion prevailed.

A letter from Federal Reserve Agent Rich addressed to Deputy Comptroller of the Currency Kane with reference to an order for Federal reserve notes and a letter of the Governor of the Board to Mr. Rich on the same subject were read, and noted.

A letter from the Bank of Commerce of Jackson, Tenn., with reference to the limit of capital required for state member banks in the smaller cities was read, and ordered referred to the Law Committee to consider a possible amendment to the Reserve Act designed to cover the subject.

A letter from Honorable John Burke with reference

to loans on grain stored in elevators was read and referred to the Governor of the Board for reply.

A letter from the Macon Ridge National Bank of Delhi, La., with reference to notifications as to the amount which it might be considered safe to loan on cotton, and it was agreed that no further action need be taken.

and avoided A report from Mr. Warburg as Chairman of the Committee on Investments with reference to a plan proposed by Bernhard, Scholle & Co. regarding domestic acceptances drawn against bills of lading was read and ordered circulated, eventually to go to the Governor of the Board, and to be by him answered along the lines of the report offered by Mr. Warburg.

A letter from Federal Reserve Agent Jay with reference to membership of New York trust companies in the rederal Reserve System, was read, and after discussion it was agreed that the Governor of the Board write to the Chairman of the Trust Company Section of the A.B.A. asking for the views of the trust companies with reference to the best course of action.

On motion it was voted that the article or circular relating to accounting printed in the Federal Reserve
Bulletin for April be reprinted, and sent out as a separate
pamphlet to those who apply for it.

Mr. Warburg presented a report on the recent examiners report as to the condition of the New York Reserve Bank, in the form of a letter addressed to Federal Reserve Agent Jay asking what action had been taken by the bank with reference to the criticisms expressed by the examiner. The report was noted and ordered passed to file.

On motion, it was agreed that in the future it should be the practice of the Chairman of each Committee on Operation to write a general letter of comment on examination reports addressed to the bank of which he is in charge.

A telegram from Mr. Edward Elliott accepting his appointment as a Class C Director in the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco was read to the Board.

After discussion the status of the proposed amendments to the Federal Reserve Act now pending in Congress,

it was agreed to suggest to the Governor that he get into
touch with the Chairman of the Banking and Currency Committees of both Houses and see whether anything could
be done to call the amendments more strongly to the attention of the generality of the members.

On motion at 11.50 a.m. the Board adjourned, to meet on Friday April 27, at 11 a.m.
