939. The Torreon Trading Co., Laredo, Texas, to same, New Laredo, Mex., \$15,000 gold coin. Tabled.

940. Mexico Northwestern Railway Co., El Paso, to same, Juarez, Mexico, monthly, \$8,000 gold coin and \$2,500 paper currency. Granted for month of January.

941. First National Bank, Nogales, Ariz., to Bosworth & Bunker, San Blas, Mex., \$10,000 silver and minor coin, during January, 1918. Granted.

Mr. Kent presented the case of J. S. Smith (\$860) who had been refused shipment of \$20,000 gold to Yucatan. Tabled till January 12.

942. First National Bank of Nogales, to J. P. Scally, San Blas, during January, 1918, \$5,000 silver and minor coin. Granted.

943. Cia Minera Fundora y Afinadora "Monterrey" S.A., Monterrey, Mex., from Laredo, Texas, to same, Mexico, \$300,000 during the next three months, at rate of \$100,000 monthly. Granted for January, \$100,000 gold.

944. Equitable Trust Co., New York, to order of itself, Colombia, \$150,000 gold bars or coin. Granted; Trust Co. to be notified to inform the Federal Reserve Bank of New York of arrival of shipments that may come in.

945. Equitable Trust Co., New York, to order of itself, Chile, \$30,000 gold bars or coin. Granted; Trust Company to be notified to inform Federal Reserve Bank of New York of arrival of shipments that may come in.

946. American Smelting & Refining Co., New York, to Mocatta & Goldsmid, London, England, 1,000,000 ounces silver bullion, value about \$900,000 during January, 1918. Granted.

Judge Hoff of Kansas City was admitted to the Committee room and stated the situation of the Moctezuma Copper Co., as to gold. He agreed to file a written application.

Mr. F. Vizcaya made a statement in behalf of the application of Lopez & Co. Referred to Mr. Kent.

577. Chemical National Bank of New York to Pombo Hermanos, Cartagena, Colombia, \$100,000 gold. Granted.


Telegram from Collector Cobb, El Paso, asking whether unused balance of export license could be used. Voted to authorize use of unused balance.


Mr. Kent discussed the question of releasing earmarked gold for the Javasche Bank. Matter referred back to him for
