Applications for permission to export coin, currency and bullion, with papers relative thereto, were presented and acted upon as follows:

A letter from Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, re delivery of License No. 1422 to Alamada Sugar Refineries. Noted.

A letter from Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, re shipments of gold by Alvarado Mining and Milling Co. Noted - Secretary to reply.

A letter from Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta, re travelers' allowance of gold, etc. Noted.

Letters American Express Company, New York, April 17 and 18, re certain applications to export Roubles to London. Tabled.

A letter from Graham, Hinkley & Co., New York, re shipments under License No. 1082. Noted.

A letter from The Panama Canal (Mr. A. L. Flint) re release of \$113,947.24 gold held at Christobal, for Equitable Trust Co., Colombia to Chile. Noted.

A letter Santo Domingo Silver Mining Co., Philadelphia, asking re form of proof desired by Board as to use of Gold in Mexico. Secretary authorized to reply.

A telegram from Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, transmitting amended request of J. B. Havre & Co., (Application No. 1385) to export \$3,135 gold for duties on fibre (recommended by bank) and \$3,600 to make refund account shipments previously made (no recommendation), instead of \$20,000 gold as originally requested. Granted, \$3,135; ask for more data on the \$3,600.

1646. American Express Company, New York, to British Bank of Foreign Trade, London, \$55,000 Russian currency. Granted.

1647. New Idea Publishing Co., Phila., to F. W. Johnston, Toronto, \$76.11 Canadian Silver and paper currency. Granted.

1648. J. M. Garcia, Laredo, to Mexican Col-

lector of Customs, New Laredo, Mexico, \$29,000 gold coin. Granted.

1649. R. W. Dowe, Eagle Pass, Texas, to Gen Fernando Peraldi, Piedras Negras, Mexico, \$2,000 gold coin. Declined.

1650. Mexico Northwestern Ry. Co., El Paso, to same, Juarez, Mexico, \$15,000 gold. Tabled; show to Mr. Strauss.

1651. S. A. Gardanier, Douglas, Arizona, to Mexican Collector of Customs, and Fiscal Agents, Agua Prieta, Mexico, \$25,000 gold coin. Granted so far as necessary to comply with reimportation decree.

1652. First National Bank Nogales, to J. P. Scally, San Blas, Mexico, \$1,000 gold coin, during April and May. Granted for silver or currency.

1653. Camphuis & Rives, Laredo, Texas, to same, New Laredo, Mexico, \$30,000 gold coin. Declined.

1654. Jose Angel Garza, Eagle Pass, Texas, to same, Piedras, Negras, Mexico \$5,000 gold. Granted.
