

At a meeting of the Gold Export Committee of the Federal Reserve Board held in the office of the Board on Tuesday, June 18, 1918, at 10:35 A.M.,

PRESENT:

Mr. Miller, presiding.

Applications for permission to export coin, bullion and currency, with papers relative thereto, were presented and acted upon as follows:

A letter from the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis re funds to be carried out of country by travelers.

Noted; Secretary to reply.

The application of the Nacozari Railroad Co. to export during July, 1918, \$150,000 gold coin to itself in Mexico (No. 2111), with letter from Mr. Birkholz re, tabled at meeting of June 17th until today. Granted \$132,000 but nothing additional for reimportation.

A letter from Gillespie Brothers & Co., New York, returning license No. 1882, unused, authorizing shipment during May of 1,000 Mexican silver dollars to Trinidad Import and Export Co., and asking if they can procure license for same good during June and July (extension). Granted.

A letter from C. Diaz Ceballos, Mexico City, quoting letter of May 22d to War Trade Board, and reply of

War Trade Board dated June 1st, concerning the requirement for license to import silver into the United States and requesting such license; also letter from Federal Reserve Bank, San Francisco (Mr. Day) re import license for gold. (Papers in hands of Mr. Strauss).

A telegram from Eagle Pass Lumber Co., Eagle Pass, Texas, requesting permission to apply gold authorized for export under license No. 1933 to payment of duties on sheep. Also telegram from First National Bank, Eagle Pass, Texas, re the same. Granted.

A letter from Assistant Secretary Crosby, transmitting copy of letter from American Embassy, London, re remittances to Roumania. Noted.

2140. The National City Bank, New York, to Christiania Bank of Kreditkasse, Christiania, Norway, during June or July, \$16,500 silver bullion. Referred to War Trade Board.

2141. Guaranty Trust Co., of New York, to Banco Nacional de Cuba, Havana, Cuba, \$200,000 in \$10 notes. Granted except gold and silver certificates.

2142. Capt. C. G. Calles, Yuma, Arizona, to same, San Luis, Sonora, Mexico, \$3,000 National Bank notes and Federal Reserve notes. Noted.

2143. F. Lopez, \$600 gold to Mexico for
export duties on 50 head of mules. Granted.

Letter from Stein, Hall & Co. re sale of
consigned goods in Holland; read and referred to
the Bureau of Enemy Trade, War Trade Board; also
inform Stein, Hall & Co., of reference.

At 10:50 A. M., the meeting adjourned.
