Voted that the Board waive the requirement that the Merchants National Bank dispose of stocks criticized by the National Bank Examiner.

Telegram dated August 29th from the Governor of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, advising that with the approval of the Federal Reserve Board, it is the intention of that Bank to utilize the services of express companies or local representatives as a medium for the immediate collection of checks on all non-par remitting banks of the Eleventh Federal Reserve District.

Voted that the Board interpose no objection to the plan proposed, provided it has the approval of the Directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas.
