Mr. Miller submitted to the Board a letter written in accordance with the action of the Board yesterday, addressed to the Managing Director of the War Finance Corporation, in reply to Mr. Meyer's letter of June 7th.

Memorandum dated June 9th, from the General Counsel, requesting authority to employ Mr. Edgar W. Freeman as Assistant Counsel, at a salary of \$5,000 per annum.

Approved, upon favorable recommendation of Mr. Hamlin.

Nemorandum dated June 6th, from Mr. Hamlin, submitting a letter from Mr. J. F. Curtis, Counsel for the Pension Committee of the Federal reserve banks, and also a draft of letter to be sent to Senator Smoot by the Federal Reserve Board, expressing the opinion of the Board in the matter of the proposed bill authorizing the establishment of a pension corporation by the Federal reserve banks. Mr. Hamlin called attention to certain amendments made by him to the original letter and stated that he and Mr. Miller were doubtful as to the advisability of incorporating an insurance feature into the bill, and called attention to the fact that Mr. Crissinger had stated that he desired to gow on record as being opposed to such a feature.

Upon motion, the Vice Governor was requested to prepare the letter to Senator Smoot in final form, and to send a copy to Mr. Curtis for his information.
