Minutes of the meeting of the Federal Reserve Board held on October 3rd, 1922, were read and on motion approved.

Mr. Crissinger stated that had he been present he would have voted

against authorizing the establishment of branches and agencies in California

as recorded in the minutes.

The Vice Governor reported the reserve positions of the several Federal Reserve banks as at close of business October 2nd and 3rd.

Letter dated September 23rd, from the Federal Reserve Agent at San Francisco, submitting with favorable recommendation, the application of the Mercantile Trust Company of San Francisco, for the Board's tentative approval to establish from sixteen to thirty local agencies in San Francisco, Berkeley and San Jose. Also letter dated September 28th, from Mr. Perrin, recommending the approval of the establishment, by the Mercantile Trust Company, of the following branches in San Francisco:

Upon motion, the Secretary was directed to transmit the following telegram to the Federal Reserve Agent at San Francisco, Mr. Crissinger voting "no":

"Referring your letter September 23 subject plan of Mercantile Trust Company to establish agencies in San Francisco, Berkeley and San Jose Stop Board will make no objection to plan in so far as it concerns San Francisco and Berkeley but it is not prepared to approve agencies in San Jose since these are outside metropolitan area of San Francisco. Stop Referring your letter September 28 Board interposes no objection to the establishment of the five agencies listed, these agencies being located in San Francisco. "

Letter dated September 28th, from the Federal Reserve Agent at San Francisco, transmitting with favorable recommendation, the application of the Pacific Southwest Trust and Savings Bank to establish an agency branch at the Northwest corner of York Boulevard and Avenue 51, in the storeroom known as 5059 York Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, it being understood that this is one of the twenty-five branches or agencies for which approval has been tentatively given by the Federal Reserve Board.

Approved, Mr. Crissinger voting "no".

Telegram dated October 4th, from the Assistant Federal Reserve Agent at San Francisco, replying to Board's telegram of October 3rd, and advising that the examination of the Bank of Italy is being made by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco with the assistance of State Examiners.

Letter dated October 4th, from Dr. George W. Edwards, offering his resignation as an employee of the Federal Reserve Board, Division of Analysis and Research, effective as of October 1st, 1922, and suggesting that his salary also terminate as of that date.
