

Minutes of actions taken by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System on Friday, July 11, 1952.

Minutes of actions taken by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System on July 10, 1952, were approved unanimously.

Telegrams to the Federal Reserve Banks of Boston, New York, Cleveland, Richmond, Chicago, St. Louis, Minneapolis, Kansas City, Dallas, and San Francisco stating that the Board approves the establishment without change by the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston on July 7, by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco on July 8, by the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond on July 9, and by the Federal Reserve Banks of New York, Cleveland, Richmond, Chicago, St. Louis, Minneapolis, Kansas City, and Dallas on July 10, 1952, of the rates of discount and purchase in their existing schedules.

Approved unanimously.

Memorandum dated July 7, 1952, from Mr. Bethea, Director, Division of Administrative Services, recommending the appointment of Mary C. Tippet as Telephone Operator in that Division, on a temporary basis for a period of two months, with basic salary at the rate of

\$2,950 per annum, effective as of the date upon which she enters upon the performance of her duties after having passed the usual physical examination and subject to the completion of a satisfactory employment investigation.

Approved unanimously.

Memorandum dated July 8, 1952, from Mr. Young, Director, Division of Research and Statistics, recommending that the temporary appointment of Pauline J. Fletcher, Clerk in that Division, be extended for a period not to exceed one month from July 11, 1952, with no change in her present basic salary at the rate of \$3,350 per annum.

Approved unanimously.

Memorandum dated July 7, 1952, from Mr. Bethea, Director, Division of Administrative Services, recommending that Madalena Bertolini, Charwoman in that Division, be granted leave of absence without pay for a period not to exceed 30 days, beginning July 6, 1952.

Approved unanimously.

Letter to Mr. Slade, Vice President, Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, reading as follows:

"The Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System has considered the recommendation of your Bank contained in your letter of June 25 and, pursuant to the provision of Section 19 of the Federal Reserve Act, grants permission to Mar Vista Commercial and Savings Bank, Los Angeles (Mar Vista), California, to maintain the same reserves against deposits as are required to be maintained by banks located outside of central reserve and reserve cities, effective as of the date of commencement of business by the subject bank.

"Please advise the bank of the Board's action in this matter, calling its attention to the fact that such permission is subject to revocation by the Board

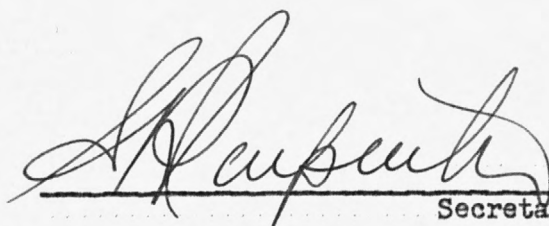
