Gentlemen:

The restaurant sandwich slice that you have taken from the Western part of the state of Missouri, in order to give Missouri two federal reserve banks, and in order to make Kansas City the seat of the federal reserve bank for the Rocky Mountain region, is the most flagrant instance of Gerrymandering in our country of recent years.
