Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request of September 25, we shall henceforth omit from the cable sent to you every Monday the figure of total monetary gold stock in the United States.

It is not possible to send you weekly figures of total excess reserves of all licensed member banks as you request, for only monthly averages of daily figures are published, usually about 7 weeks after the month to which they relate. They currently appear in the Federal Reserve Bulletin, the averages for months up to and including July being given on page 544 of the September issue. We shall cable you the average for August about October 25 and thereafter those for subsequent months, following the code prefix (w). We shall also cable you, following the code prefixes designated in parentheses, adjusted monthly index numbers of (p) industrial production in the United States as follows and in the order given -- total, manufactures, minerals, iron and steel, textiles, food products, lumber, automobiles, leather and products, and cement; (r) factory employment; (t) department store sales; and unadjusted monthly index numbers of (s) factory pay rolls and (u) wholesale prices of all commodities and of farm products as compiled by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. of these indexes are based on the average for the years 1923-1925 as 100, with the exception of those for wholesale prices, which are based on 1926 as 100.

As you request the index numbers of production will be cabled to you as soon as available. If available on Monday, they will be sent in the regular weekly cable; otherwise a special monthly cable will be forwarded. Other monthly figures, including excess reserves of licensed member banks, will be sent in the weekly or monthly cable immediately following the date the figures become available. In general all of the indexes become available from two to three weeks after the month to which they relate and they are usually preliminary in the case of indexes for department store sales, total industrial production, and sub-groups under production as follows: manufactures, minerals, textiles, food products, automobiles, and leather and products.

I have made the attached reply to Affarsvarlden fairly complete, bearing in mind that we shall probably have to refer to it frequently since the procedure is somewhat complicated.

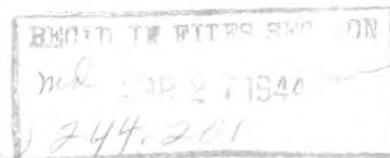

In the cables you are sending our paper every week on Monday night, a figure is included showing the total monetary gold stock of the U.S.A. As this figure is not now of the same importance to us as previously we ask you to omit the same and, if possible, include instead in the weekly cable the latest figure available regarding the excess reserves of all licensed member banks.

At the same time we take the liberty asking for several additions of monthly figures. You send us now every month by cable three index numbers of production, i.e. total, manufacturers, and minerals. We should be very much obliged to you for adding the adjusted production index numbers for the following groups:

Iron and steel
Textiles
Food products
Lumber
Automobiles
Leather and products
Cement.

Further, we should much appreciate if you would cable us the following monthly index numbers:

Factory employment, adjusted /F.R.B./
Factory pay rolls /F.R.B./
Department store sales, adjusted /F.R.B./
Wholesale prices /Bureau of Labor Statistics/:
a/ combined index
b/ farm products

As we are going to press just after receiving your weekly cable it would be of very great advantage to get the monthly figures in a separate cable once a month as soon as the figures of production indexes are released. We should then have better time to make our comments and prepare graphs &c. However, if all the monthly figures should not be available at the time the production index numbers are being released, please do not delay sending the monthly cable. The remaining figures could be sent in the next weekly cable.

In an appendix we bring together all the figures we should like to get and suggest a prefix in form of a letter /p, r, s, t, u/ for the different series of figures.

The first monthly cable in the new form, containing the figures for August, may be sent immediately. The September figures we await about the 23:rd October.

It is a lot of trouble we give you but we hope you will excuse us owing to the very great importance the development in your country will have upon the economic situation in the world. We dare say that all business men in Northern Europe with keen interest follow your index numbers in our paper. Your kind and helpful assistance would be very much appreciated.

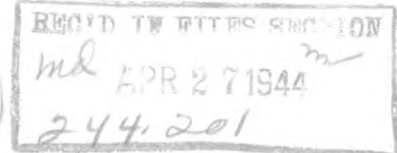

Gentlemen:

We have your letter of September 12th, enclosing draft in the sum of \$25.00, to establish a deposit to cover the cost of radiograms addressed to AFFARSVARLDEN - STOCKHOLM.

We are glad to get this and hope that the arrangement proposed will work out satisfactorily. At the same time there seem to be certain technicalities involved, and I send you herewith a copy of the letter which our New York office has just sent to AFFARSVARLDEN. The particular point which is stressed by our New York office is that they do not wish us to render an account direct to AFFARSVARLDEN covering the messages and the deposits, but to render the account to the Federal Reserve Board with the request that it be transmitted to AFFARSVARLDEN.

As far as we can see from our limited view-point here, there appears to be no objection to our handling the matter direct with AFFARSVARLDEN, but our Traffic Manager is convinced that this will lead us into difficulty, and points out that it will simply be necessary for you to mail the account on to AFFARSVARLDEN, and I trust this will work out satisfactorily.

My dear Mr. Goldenweiser:-

I am glad to learn from your letter of August 8th, that arrangements are being made for the continuance of the messages which have been sent for a long time past to "Affarsvarlden - Stockholm."

I do not see any reason why it is not entirely practicable for "Affarsvarlden" to put up a deposit either with you or with us to cover the cost of sending these messages.

In fact, I mentioned this to our New York office and the only point raised was a reminder of the fact that the discontinuance of the collect arrangement resulted in difficulties over exchange rates, and possibly we may have the same difficulties about the conversion of the deposit from Swedish money to American money.

Of course, the simplest plan would be to have them put up a deposit of, say, \$25.00 in U.S. money, paying for this deposit the rate of exchange which is current at the time they make the remittance. Heretofore, of course they have paid their collect bills in Swedish money on a gold basis, which corresponded to the exact charges as figured in Gold Francs. The rates for international messages are established not in the currency of the various countries but in Gold Francs, in accordance with schedules filed from time to time with the International Telegraph Union at Berne, Switzerland.

The handling of the funds which they are sending at present to you and will probably send to us in the future, may entail certain complications, but we shall do our best to work them out to the satisfaction of all concerned.

Thank you for your interest in the matter.

We understand that you are publishing every week figures regarding a/ monetary gold stock, and b/ money in circulation. We should be very much obliged to you for including these figures in your cable every Monday night.

The U.S. Bureau of Mines, Departement of Commerce, publishes every Saturday /or Friday/ an estimate of the weekly production of bituminious coal. If you use to have this figure at hand and if it doesn't make you any trouble we should be grateful to you for sending us this figure in tons /000's omitted

The monthly figures of production which you are sending us are most important and we should like you to cable these figures as soon as they are available in a special cable.

In order to avoid misunderstanding we enclose a table of the new form of the weekly cable Monday night stating at the same time the figures which were available January 25.

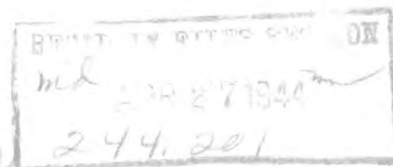
