#### THIRD ANNUAL MEETING OF STOCKHOLDERS

OF

#### FEDERAL RESERVE BANK OF BOSTON

The third annual meeting of the stockholders of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston was held at the bank's building in Boston, on Wednesday, October 21. This meeting, like the first two meetings, was called by the Stockholders' Advisory Committee, which is elected by the member banks and is composed of active executive officers of seven member banks, two in Massachusetts and one in each of the other New England states, and the program for this meeting, like that for the other two meetings, was in the hands of the Advisory Committee.

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M. by Mr. E. A. Onthank, President of the Sefety Fund National Bank, Fitchburg, Mass., who as Chairman of the Stockholders Advisory Committee, presided. There were about 300 persons in attendance at the meeting, all of these, with the exception of the directors and the senior officers of the reserve bank who were invited guests, being officers and directors of member banks.

At the invitation of the Stockholders' Advisory Committee,
Mr. Frederic H. Curtiss, Chairman of the Board of Directors and Federal
Reserve Agent, and Governor Harding addressed the meeting, discussing
respectively the conclusions of the Federal Reserve Agents' Committee on
Reserves as set forth in a recent report of that committee to the Federal
Reserve Board, and the effect of legislation proposed at the last session
of congress dealing with the powers of national banks, reserve requirements
and the note issue powers of the Federal Reserve Banks.

The meeting was then thrown open to remarks from the floor, in

accordance with the suggestion of the Stockholders' Advisory Committee that the meeting be an open forum at which any representative of a member bank might bring up any matter of general interest. During the ensuing discussion, severalresolutions were offered from the floor, these being referred to a Resolutions Committee of twelve, created by vote of the meeting and consisting of one national bank representative and one state member bank representative wherever possible from each of the New England states.

After adjournment, luncheon was served in the bank's cafeteria, and later the Resolutions Committee came together in one of the conference rooms of the bank. The committee meeting was open to any member bank representative and a large number of officers of member banks attended the meeting of the committee, the ensuing discussion of the resolutions presented at the morning's meeting being interested and interesting.

At 3:15 the afternoon session of the Stockholders' Meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Onthank, and was largely given over to consideration of the report of the Committee on Resolutions.

Aside from a resolution dealing with the procedure to be followed in the case of resolutions presented at future stockholders' meetings, the resolutions which the Committee reported and which were adopted were one authorizing the creation of a standing committee on nominations for Class A and Class B directors of the Federal Reserve Bank, the members of the committe to be appointed by the Stockholders' Advisory Committee; one opposing the passage of the so-called second McFadden Bill, these two resolutions being unanimously adopted; and one approving the advocating the passage of the so-called first McFadden Bill, this resolution being adopted with four or five votes being cast in the

negative.

Copies of the three resolutions mentioned are appended.

After an announcement by the Chairman, Mr. Onthank, that the Advisory Committee had elected a new cheirman for the ensuing year, Mr. Onthank desiring to retire as cheirman, and Mr. Thomas H. West, President of the Rhode Island Hospital Trust Company of Providence, Rhode Island, being elected to succeed him, the meeting adjourned, the universal opinion appearing to be that the meeting had been a most successful one and the large attendance particularly gratifying in view of the fact that it was not in any way induced by entertainment extended to member bank fepresentatives, as was the case last year. A more detailed account of the meeting is given in the issue of the United States Investor for October 24, 1925.

"Resolved that a standing committee on nominations for directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston be and the same is hereby authorized. Said committee, which shall be known as the Committee on Reserve Bank Directors, shall be composed of seven members, who shell be appointed prior to June 1 of each year hereafter by the Stockholders' Advisory Committee, each such member to be an active executive officer of a member bank, end when possible a majority of such members to be officers of banks in the group which is voting at the regular election during the current year and such appointments to be so distributed that the member banks in each state in the First Federal Reserve District shall be represented by a resident thereof. It shall be the duty of said Committee on Reserve Bank Directors to present to the member banks in the respective groups participating in each election of Class A and Class B directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston hereafter, recommendations of one or more names for the directors to be elected. recommendations, in all regular elections of Class A and Class B directors shall be presented between the first and fifteenth day of October of each year, and in all special elections of such directors which may be held to fill a vacancy as soon as possible after said vacancy becomes known.

It is neither the spirit nor intent of this resolution that member banks shall refrain from making their ewn nominations in accord with the provisions of the Federal Reserve Act as freely as formerly."
