Dear Mr. Worthington:

In Mr. Smead's absence I am replying to your wire of May 19.

Weekly reports of bank changes on Form B-12 requested in letter B-1093 of July 25, 1935 were intended to take the place of weekly reports of changes in the lists of licensed and unlicensed banks requested in telegrem TRANS 1818 of June 9, 1933. It was not intended that the weekly mail reports on Form B-12 would replace wire advices of banks terminating existence, requested in letter B-1002 of July 28, 1934. I am sorry that our letter B-1093 did not make this clear.

In the ordinary case mail advice of a bank terminating existence (on Form B-12) is sufficient for our purposes, but there are instances in which earlier advice is necessary. As stated in your wire, since our letter B-1093 your bank has not been furnishing wire advices of bank closings as requested in letter B-1002. Apparently no occasion had arisen in your district, until the conversion of the Routt County State Bank, where prompt wire advice was found necessary. We usually are able to obtain any information desired from other sources such as the Comptroller of the Currency or the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, pending the receipt of reports on Form B-12. Furthermore, your mail reports come in with sufficient promptness to serve our purposes ordinarily. It will be appreciated, however, if you will resume furnishing the telegraphic information regarding banks which cease banking operations requested in our letter B-1002, in addition to reporting bank closings and all other bank changes by mail on Form B-12.

Dear Sir:

In lieu of reports on changes in status of banks now furnished in response to the Board's wire TRANS 1818 of June 9, 1933, it is requested that in the future weekly reports of bank changes be submitted on the attached form(B-12), a supply of which has been forwarded to you under separate cover. It is also requested that in the case of consolidations, mergers, absorptions, etc., the report show whether or not the bank or banks terminating existence became branches of the absorbing institution. Each change should be listed under the appropriate one of the following headings and only such headings need be shown on a given report as are necessary to cover changes occurring during the report period:

New banks (primary organizations)
Successions and conversions
Reopenings of unlicensed banks
Reopenings of suspended banks
Suspensions and receiverships
Liquidations (except incident to absorptions, successions, etc.)
Consolidations, mergers, absorptions, etc.
Admissions of State banks to membership
Withdrawals of State banks from membership
Changes in title or location

In case none of the captions appear to cover a given change adequately, kindly give available information under an appropriate caption.

To assist in the preparation of uniform reports for all districts, there is attached hereto a specimen copy of a report illustrating the manner of reporting the various types of changes on Form B-12.

Reports on forms St. 6386-b and c were discontinued in June 1933, as authorized in TRANS 1818 of June 9, 1933. In view of the information requested in the new reports of bank changes, reports on Form St. 6386-a (Bank Consolidations) may be discontinued effective immediately.



Reconstruction Finance Corporation has approved advance and satisfactory plan of reorganisation has been submitted. We are assiting final approved by Walpington Superintendent of Banks.

Before sutherizing any banks which have submitted satisfactory plans of reorganization to resume benking operations, the plans will be submitted to the Federal Reserve found for approved.

With the exception of the Yakima Valley Bank & Trust Company, the reorganisation plan of which is practically completed, it does not appear likely
that the other banks can effect reorganization plans for some time to come. In
view of the doubtful possibility of a satisfactory reorganization of the Pine
City State Bank, and the long period of suspension of the three remaining banks,
we believe that some steps should be taken looking towards the cancallation of
the memberships of these four banks. Section 9 of the Federal Reserve Act
reads in part as follows:

Board that a member bank has failed to comply with the provisions of this section or the regulations of the Federal Reserve Board made pursuant thereto, or has cessed to exactise banking functions mithout a receiver or liquidating agent having been appointed therefor, it shall be within the power of the board after hearing to require such bank to surrender its stock in the Federal reserve bank and to forfeit all rights and privileges of membership. The Federal Reserve Board may restore membership upon due proof of compliance with the conditions imposed by this section.

It is our suggestion that these banks be advised that unless satisfactory plans for reorganizations are submitted and normal business resumed forthwith, memberships will be cancelled after hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Roserve Act.

We shall appreciate advice of the Board's views and instructions as to proper procedure.





In the attached letter dated May 17, Mr. Hale, Cashier of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, makes two recommendations with respect to the printed lists, and supplements thereto, of member and nonmember banks that have resumed banking operations.

The first recommendation is that, to avoid the appearance of discrimination against member banks, the list be confined to the names of member and nonmember banks <u>licensed to resume full banking operations</u>, and that the names of nonmember banks operating under restrictions should either be omitted altogether or a separate list prepared which will include member as well as nonmember banks operating under restrictions.

The second recommendation is that, in the interest of economy, the Board take over the publication of these lists.

After we had discussed Mr. Hale's letter Mr. Smead called Mr. Sailer over the telephone and asked him whether he saw any reason for continuing these lists and, if so, whether he felt that they should be issued by the Board. Mr. Sailer advised Mr. Smead that he saw no reason for issuing the lists any longer, also that if they should continue to be issued the Board should take over their publication. He later definitely confirmed this view, after having discussed the matter with the department heads.

Mr. McIlhenny, Cashier of the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia, advised Mr. Myrick to the same effect, after having gone into the matter with the interested departments.

Dear Mr. Morrill:

In accordance with the Board's telegram No. 1678 of March 15, 1933, the lists of licensed banks published by the various Federal reserve banks indicate the names of nonmember banks which have been "licensed to resume banking operations under restrictions in addition to those applicable to all banking institutions". It appears to us that the inclusion of nonmember banks operating on a restricted basis discriminates against member banks operating under similar and identical laws and restricted to the same extent, as such banks are not reported.

Our wire to you on March 23, suggested a regulation by the Secretary providing for the revocation of the license to a member bank should such bank, already licensed, subsequently avail itself of a Conservator under the terms of the Act of March 9, 1933, or take advantage of any State Stabilization Act providing for limitation of withdrawals other than those affected by legal contracts between the bank and its depositors with respect to withdrawals or notice of withdrawals.

On April 3, Secretary Woodin directed the revocation of the license of any member bank taking advantage of any State Stabilization Act providing for limitation of withdrawals or otherwise operating on a restricted basis. This resulted in the deletion from our list of licensed banks of four State member banks in Oregon and Washington which had availed themselves of the terms of the respective State laws restricting withdrawals. Nonmember banks operating under the same laws and to the same extent as the four member banks whose licenses were revoked are reported on our list as "Licensed to resume banking operations under restrictions in addition to those applicable to all banking institutions under the Executive Order of March 10, 1933".

It occurs to us that to avoid the appearance of discrimination in the publication of these lists they should be confined to the names of member and nonmember banks licensed to resume banking operations without any restrictions other than those applicable to all banking institutions

under Executive Order of March 10, 1933, and to either omit publishing the names of those nonmember banks which are operating under additional restrictions or to prepare a separate list of banks, including both member and nonmember, which are operating under additional restrictions. We believe it particularly desirable not to use the word "licensed" in connection with banks operating under restrictions.

At the present time there are nonmember banks in Idaho and Nevada, and member and nonmember banks in Oregon and Washington restricting deposit withdrawals, and the names of the nonmember banks so operating are shown on our list as "Restricted Banks".

We shall appreciate your consideration of our suggestion to change the form of publication of these lists.

May we also suggest again, that, in the interest of economy, the Board take over the publication of these lists?

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

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

(D) Name and location of each normember state bank, trust company, stock savings bank, mutual savings bank and private bank under state supervision which suspended, went into liquidation, or was absorbed by another bank during the period Harch 1 to 12, 1933, together with the date and manner in which the bank went out of existence.

Please also mail a supplement to lists A and B above as of each Rednesday beginning April 19, 1933, in order to enable Board to keep original list up to date.

No corresponding data need be submitted covering national banks.

In lieu of telegraphic and mail reports of bank suspensions heretofore furnished please wire Board as soon as practicable name and location of each bank which, during period Yarch 13 to April 12 (1) suspended or went into liquidation after resuming full banking operations, code SAVE, (2) suspended or went into liquidation after resuming operations on a restricted basis or without having resumed any banking operations, code STRV, (3) was placed on a restricted basis after having resumed full banking operations, code SIMM! TRANS/657 To avoid congestion of leased wires tonight and else to relieve operators Board will not attempt to transmit telegraphic advice to all Federal reserve banks of all member banks in clearing house cities throughout country to which licenses are issued to resume banking functions tomorrow. Secretary of Treasury will, of course, wire each Federal reserve bank list of number banks in its district to which licenses are to be greated and it is suggested that early tomorrow morning each Federal reserve bank advise each other Federal reserve bank by commercial wire of names of such number banks. As promptly as possible each Federal reserve bank should advise all other reserve banks and Board, either by consercial wire or leased wire, of mames of nonmember banks in its district licensed to resume banking functions, not subject to any restrictions except those in the President's proclamation against payment of gold, gold certificates or bullish or the payment of currency for hearding purposes and foreign exchange transactions which apply to all banking institutions, member and nonnember, state or netional, until further notice.
