Your circular letter of the 31st, as well as several similar communications from other organizations in your city, received.

The National Banks of Albany will join the Federal Bank System. I do not understand how the Bankers will be benefited as you state. "We have never had any trouble to get all the money we wanted on high grade commercial paper," and in many times more than we were entitled to, taking into consideration our balances or that the law allowed.
