Replying to your letter of the t hirtieth will say that the business done through the banks of this city indicate that Indianapolis would be t he place preferred for the federal reserve bank, while personally they would have no preference just so that the money would be forthcoming when they wanted it——it would be a question among the bankers as to the locat ion of this reserve fund.

Indianapolis does 66% of the Rushville banking business, Cincinnati 25%, Chicago 9%, while Louisville and Saint Louis really does none at all with Rushville.

Indianapolis does the bulk of the wholesale business in Rushville with the exception of
special lines which, of course, must be purchased
at their respective cities----but staple articles
are mostly purchased in your city and nat urally
