



Sir;-

Having received solicitations from Seattle, Spokane, Denver and Omaha for the co-operation of Montana banks with these various cities for the securing of a Federal Reserve Bank, we were early prompted to call a special meeting of the Clearing House Association to discuss the question. As a consequence, we wired you as follows;-

"Secretary of the Treasury


Washington. D. C. Montana's Earliest Indian Traders and Merchants received their first capital and merchandise from the Twin Cities. Present day Bankers and Merchants testify that ninety percent of their foreign business arises in or passes through the Twin Cities, showing conclusively the natural commercial gateway to Montana. To hitch us to another wagon going in a opposite and unnatural direction would be a commercial erros, a hindrance to State development and Federal Reserve Bank activity. We unanimously choose to join the Twin City Federal Reserve Bank Distrist.

Billings Clearing House Association". We are also taking this matter up with other Clearing House Associations in the state in order to ascertain their wishes. We are very much disturbed lest we should be forced into a district, which would both fail to serve our commercial interests and the best advantage of your new system.

Montana is traversed by three main railways.-- The northern part of the state goes to the Twin Cities by way of the Great Northern --the central part goes to the Twin Cities by way of the Milwaukee--the southern part of the states goes to the Twin Cities by way of the Northern Pacific. Any attempt to sever us from these three main commercial arteries, would be like attempting to change the course of the Yellowstone River. May we be permitted to ask that, if any attempt is made to place us in any other district than that of the Twin Cities, we may be given a hearing.

We wish to assure you that the banks of this district desire to do all that is possible to make the new Federal Reserve Bank a success. The writer will recommend to the Board of Directors at our annual meeting in January, that this bank promptly file its application for member.





WHEREAS, the Federal Reserve Act, approved by act of Congress on December 23rd. 1913, created a Committee of Organization whose Duty will be to designate and establish Federal Reserve Banks and create Districts for each Reserve Bank, and

Whereas, the products of the great State of Montana, and especially Eastern Montana, including the County of Stillwater, are marketed in the East, at either the Twin Cities or Chicago, and

Whereas, all merchandise and finished products used in the State of Montana are purchased and paid for in the East, and

Whereas, all bank reserves of the Montana Banks are carried in the East, and all demands for exchange are Eastern Exchange, and Whereas, due to the fact that all Montana points are much more accessable by either mail or railroad to the Twin Cities, it would to a large extent stagnate the banking facilities and hamper business generally to be annexed either to a District with the Federal Reserve Bank at Denver or any West Coast City.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Stillwater Club of Columbus, Stillwater County, Montana, in meeting assembled this 14th. day of January 1914, what we appeal to the Honorable Committee of Organization to give the matter due consideration, and we urge of them,

> FIRST, to establish a Federal Reserve Bank at the TWIN CITIES. Second, to include Montana and especially Eastern Montana, including Stillwater County, in the Twin City District. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of these resolutions be

sent to the Committee of Organization, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the Twin City banks and business Houses soliciting their support and influence on behalf of these resolutions.
