10 YEAR AVERAGE OF TEXAS




GENERAL AVERAGE OF ALL CONTESTANTS




LOWEST PRIZE WINNING YIELD

CARGEST PRIZE WINNING YIELD




GENERAL AVERAGE OF ALL CONTESTANTS

The Texas Industrial Congress, a voluntary association of Texas business men, firms and corporations for promoting better farming, through its executive committee, at a meeting held Jenusry 8, 1914, adopted the following resolutions, directing the secretary to mail a copy to the Board appointed by the President of the United States to locate the regional reserve banks, one copy to Mr. Oscar Wells, chairman of the committee of the Houston Chamber of Commerce, one copy to the Dallas Chamber of Commerce, and to give out a copy to the press:

Whereas. The State of Texas comprises an area of 252,000 square miles, most of it cultivable, and has 600 miles of coast line, many navigable rivers, and 14,000 milos of railroads,

And Thereas, Texas led all the States of the Union in 1912 in agricultural products valued at \$404,000,000, which was more than twice the value of the crops of the next following State, and now produces something less than one-fourth of all the cotton grown on the surface of the earth.

and Whereas, In the cattle industry, that has now become so important in providing the food supply of the nation. Texas leads all the States and has space for an indefinitely larger production,

And Whereas. The development of Texas in almost every line, notably in iron and steel production, in lignite coal from an area as large as the State of Missouri, in oil, in gas, in bituminous coal and in other minerals has just begun,

And Whereas, Louisians, Oklahoms and New Mexico, comprising with Texas about one-sixth of the United States, would also be served and their physical resources developed by a regional reserve bank; Therefore

Be It Resolved That the establishment of a regional reserve bank in Texas would in the judgment of the Texas Industrial Congress give easier access to its uses for the largest number of producers in the Southwest, upon whom the ultimate welfare of the Nation at large is coming more and more to depend through the utilization of the natural resources of this section.

The Congress therefore respectfully requests that the Board for the location of regional banks locate one of these banks within the State of Texas.
