





My dear Mr. Johnson:

Your telegram received and I really have not done anything regarding the matter. I have been about three quarters sick the last few days and it has been an effort for me to even get around.

I believe myself that the natural point for us would be in the region of the Twin Cities, but it has occurred to me that there might be a scrap as to which city would have the Regional Bank, whether Minneapolis or St. Paul and controversy might drive it to some other point.

I am in receipt of a telegram today from Seattle in which they are anxious that we should be in the region of Seattle as the Reserve city.

I really feel, however, that the powers in Washington have this all figured out and that they know just how they are going to arrange this thing, so that I don't believe any amount of telegrams on our part will change their plans in any way. They have had a plan on this proposition and it has gone through practically as first outlined with some few dhanges, so that I guess it will not amount to very much for townsthe size of Billings to offer any recommendation or protests one way or another. I believe, myself, that St. Paul or Minneapolis would be the most available points for us.




