#### Dear John:

I have your letter of January 17th and have done my best to go over the names. As far as the top deck of MEW is concerned, I worked nearly as closely with Lord Drogheda and Lord Selbourne as with Dingle Foot. I think it would be hard to distinguish between them, although if only one is chosen, Dingle Foot was the one with whom we had most intimate contact.

At the next level come Lord Finley, Lord Farrar and Sir Lionel Cohen. Justice Morton I would put somewhat after them. Lionel Cohen is particularly important because he was the responsible contact of MRW with American personnel. In the early days all the contact practically was with him, and he deserves much of the credit for the wide range of general contact that we had. Somewhere in the above group I would put Col. Vickers. Our contact was intimate.

At the immediate day-to-day working level there were Derrick Seebohn, Jack Richols, Jerry Villiers, and Jack Troutbeck. Of the remainder, on the Blockade side, I would rate the closeness of contact somewhat as follows: E. H. Bliss, Anthony Lausada, J. F. Cahan, Baker, J. B. Linden, Geoffrey Gibbs and Harold Abrahams. Parallel to them on the Intelligence side there was O. L. Lawrence, Turner, Owan (very important in Africa), Wood and probably Watson. The list you sent me also includes the name of Col. Bebb. He spent most of his time in Washington and I suppose will be cited from there, but should not be overlooked. He was extremely active in his contact with Americans. It would be a grand gesture to recognize Miss Solomon.

My very best to you. The telegraph strike held up Don Calder's cable announcing his marriage until the other day. That was one event that I deserved to be present at.

Dear Win,

As I mentioned in my recent letter to you Don Calder, Avery Peterson, and myself have been talking over the matter of decorations for certain members of M.E.W. who work particularly close with us at 40 Berkeley. We have concentrated our selection to a relatively small group that meets this requirements. This does not mean that we have made the tentative selections on the basis of relative importance of the individual in the M.B.W. Organization but rather on the close nature of the contact with us.

Tou mentioned the fact that the initiative would in any event have to come from the Ambassador. This is not quite the case as the U.S. Army has provided a decoration, The Medal of Freedom in varying degrees, for foreign civilian personnel and has asked for recommendations. Actually any recommendations which would be made would have to be over the signature of General Tindall, the Military Attache, with supporting certificates of citation from avery, Don, and myself, who are still in the Embassy. Final approval however, would be given by the Ambassador before forwarding to Washington.

So far the three of us have agreed whole heartedly on Dingle (Gold Palm), Derrick Seebohm (Silver Palm), Cecil Farrar (Silver Palm). In addition we believe that Ernest Bliss (Silver Palm) should probably be included, also Justice Morton (Silver Palm) who was and still is Chairman of the Blacklist Committee. Avery feels strongly that Cahan and Baker as members of the Dlacklist Section of M.E.W. should be included since they were the Officers handling the Liaison with the Washington Proclaimed List Committee. We had discussed possibilities of recommending Geffry Gibbs (Silver Palm), The Earl of Selborns (Gold Palm), Justice Lionel Cohen (Silver Palm), and Tom Dolan (Bronze Palm), who handled the Mechanical Day to Day Processing of Navicerts, but have not as yet agreed completely on these mames. We would of course have recommended Justice Finlay (Silver Palm) but as you probably know he died recently as a result of a germ picked up during his visit to the Belsen Prison Camp.

You will note that the above are all on the Blockade Side and none at all from the Enemy Branch. We do not feel particularly well equipped to choose in this category but imagine that perhaps Col. Vickers, V.C. and Mark Turner should be included as well as Lawerence, Chief of the Objective Department and Derrick Wood who worked closely with us on Transportation Objectives, Shipping, etc. No doubt you may have additional names in the Enemy Branch that should be included.

In going over the lists prior to sending this letter on to you I noticed that we have not mentioned either Anthony Lousada or Miss Solomon, Dingle's Secretary. You may feel that one or both should be added. In any event we would all appreciate your help in doing justice to M.E.W.'s close association with us. As recommendations should be completed fairly soon for forwarding to Washington, perhaps you would give us your advice on this whole matter at as early a date as is convenient.

Before terminating this letter I do want to tell you that just before Christmas I received The Legion of Merit for which you recommended me just before you left England. Again let me thank you for it.

Please give my very best to Mrs. Riefler and good luck to you. I shall be looking you up whenever I come to Princeton.




