

MINNESOTA:

Chapter 581. --- Acts of #1913.

In all mechanical and manufacturing establishments the working hours for women are:

Nine hours in any one day.

Fifty-four hours in any one week.
EXCEPTION: In canneries where perishable
fruits and goods are preserved—there longer
hours of labor are permitted.
