

Dear Mesdames:

Your letter of December 10th, in reference to the recommendation of the Board regarding the employment of women as conductors in the Cleveland, Ohio, case, was presented to the Board at today's session. In reply, I was instructed to state that the order in question dealt solely with the Cleveland case, as presented to the Board for consideration, and that in issuing such order the Board in no way expressed an opinion as to the general question of the employment of women in industry, and did not consider its recommendation in connection with any reconstruction policy or program relative to women employed in war industries during the period of hostilities.
