


We are returning herewith your copy of personal property form which you gave our representative.

Tamiye Oda had just received communication from us. She claims that Cly originally offered \$700 for the truck, and he has had the use of the vehicle during the past month.

I explained Cly's decision to go to jail rather than pay over \$400 for the truck.

She feels that one of two friends in Los Angeles can sell the truck under a power of attorney she intends to supply. Either one will recapture the truck and pink slip of ownership. This action disposes of present controversy with the exception that she feels Cly is legally liable for difference between \$650 and price of resale.



Dear sir:

I am writing to you because I have read in the paper that you were helping the Japanese with their business problems. I would like some advice from you.

A few days before we had to evacuate we sold our truck to Mr. Monte Cley of 10781 Lelfair Ave, Pasadena, Calif, - ~~Residence~~ but the check I received from him was stopped at the bank. I wrote to the Federal Reserve Bank in Los Angeles and received a reply stating that the truck was mis represented and offered to pay \$400.00 for it. We sold it for \$650.00 and he told us if we wanted, ~~he~~ he will sell it for us for \$750.00, but since we had to evacuate the next day, we decided to accept the \$650.00.

He told us time and again of how much we could get for it, but as soon as we leave he stops payment on his check. Now, what can we do?

The chance of collecting seems slim because of my internment in this Reception Center. Can you help me?
