Dear Mr. Everson:

Thanks for the opportunity to get to the proper agency, the knowledge gained from several years raising tomatoes, that nursery seed for tomato plants should be in the ground right now.

From I believe, the United States News, Washington, comes the information the Government wants in 1942, 80% of last year's tomato pack. This fruit is very essential to our armed forces in certain climates.

If one is to plant some idle Alien farm lands, they should be quickly notified and placed. If equipment at Manzanar (trucks and tires) was available as well as tractors and tools stored or left for sale with implement dealers, time would be saved.

As the Calif. planting season is getting away from us, I would recommend that efforts be made to plant shortage crops farther inland and eliminate concentration of tin on the coast.

Should you have in mind some general program which you believe will be helpful in connection with the evacuation which is in progress, we will be pleased to pass it on to the proper agency, if you care to submit it to us.

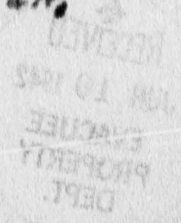

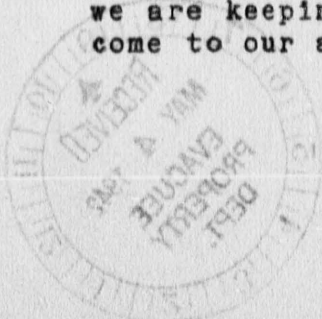

In acknowledgment of your postal card dated March 21, 1942, we have noted your interest in the rental of a five or six room house in Berkeley, Oakland or Alameda, and your understanding that we are handling the property of Japanese.

In our program of assisting persons who may be required to evacuate the military areas which have been established, we are encouraging the equitable sale or leasing of property of aliens, including Japanese by private negotiation wherever possible.

Inasmuch as, up to the present at least, we have no real properties of evacuees under our control, we suggest that you contact reputable real estate firms in the cities above mentioned. Consultation with your local bank might also be helpful.

However, we will be pleased to hold your inquiry in our files and should occasion arise, will communicate with you later.

We are forwarding a copy of the subject matter of your postal card inquiry, together with our reply thereto, to our field representative, Mr. Mason Case, 2459 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, in the event you might find it more convenient to contact him direct.

Gentlemen:

It has been suggested that we make a report covering the activities of this bank in connection with the evacuation of the Japanese from Florin and Perkins in Sacramento County and from Clarksburg in Yolo County. No attempt has been made by us to keep a record of the transactions handled by us or of the new accounts that we opened, and it is therefore impossible to furnish any figures.

In Perkins a representative spent two mornings at the control center. A number of travelers checks were sold and several new accounts secured. We were able to assist a number of evacuees by cashing their checks.

In Florin the number of evacuees was larger and more time was spent at the evacuation center. Commencing with May 19th and continuing through May 28th, the writer and his secretary spent several hours each day in Florin. During this period a number of new accounts were secured and a number of travelers checks were sold.

The evacuation from Florin and Perkins occurred at the height of the strawberry season and the Japanese in these communities were without any banking service. It is estimated that in excess of \$150,000.00 was paid to the berry growers during the month of May and the bulk of this sum was distributed shortly before evacuation. We therefore feel that we were able to render a definite service to the Japanese in cashing their checks and handling their other banking problems. Many of these people were our clients and one of the berry distributing firms which purchased approximately half of the berries grown in the area, carried its account with this bank.

Our efforts in the Clarksburg area were not entirely wasted as we opened several new accounts and sold some travelers checks. However, most of the Japanese in Clarksburg had arranged their affairs before the order was made. Our representatives were in Clarksburg on three days for several hours on each day.

The value of our efforts cannot be estimated, at this time, in terms of dollars and cents. We feel that we have made many new friends for our institution and the future will determine the value of this good will.

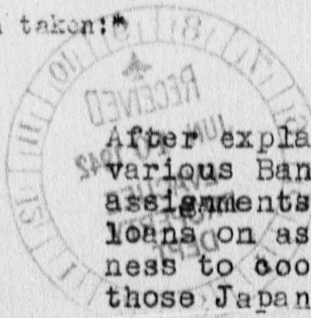

Mr. Johnston stated, "that they would cooperate in every way possible and as these cases developed he would check the claim filed at the bank, registering same, and the banks of Sacramento would then be in a position to accept the claim and assignments and to make liquidating ~~payments~~ dividends in full to leaning bank. This would be collateral against loans in which the banks stated that they would loan up to about 50% of claim. We feel that through the efforts of Mr. Everson that we will be able to clear a number of cases here in Sacramento under this arrangement.

The Japanese people now fully understand that it will be the effort of Mr. Chargin to fully meet any such emergency, and that if necessary costs for same can be deducted from the income on their properties or charged to these properties against any future income, or that if these properties do not earn the costs of maintenance, they would be treated in the same manner as had been previously arranged or considered in their respective leases. This will probably mean some of these properties will divert back to the landowner as some of these people are delinquent with payments at the present time.

To conclude this report, I have the promise from the Japanese of 100% cooperation in turning all their properties over to Mr. A. V. Chargin and they are now doing this even though some had previously made other arrangements.

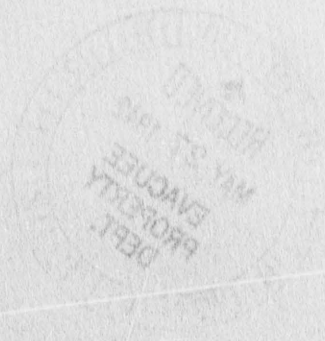

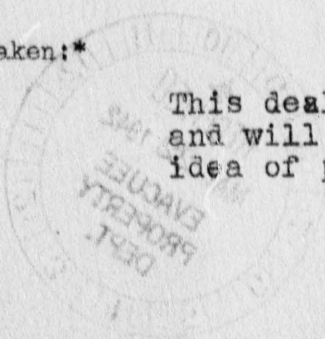

Dear Sir: I had a long talk with a Mr Reed, of the Federal Reserve Bank, with headquarters at Sacramento and he is the man who is handling all of the Japanese National property adjustments.

He said that you could give a power of Attorneys to any person but that if one was given that it be a "Special Power of Attorney" limited to certain matters only. *No*

He also stated that they were trying to have one man in each of the landowners area handle the various matters for all of those who have buildings on leased ground, to avoid much confusion and trouble in having a landlord deal with several representatives, in as much as the question of ground rental, taxes, etc was involved.

They expected to have the Brown interests and the Dye Brothers interests handled in that way and suggested that the Ostrum Etc interests be handled the same way. This would let one man have the say, do all the necessary renting of the property, pay the landlord his ground rental, and pay the taxes on the houses etc.

In my judgment it would be the best way to handle this matter. Let all the house owners make a special power of attorney to one man to take care of their interests, etc.

If you could get in touch with Mr Reed and ask him to come down and meet with all of the owners in the Ostrum etc, area. See if the land owners will meet with him on that kind of a proposition and then phone him and ask him to drop down.
