

RE: HIROKO IKEDA

Reference is made to our letter of June 15th, to  
Mr. E. A. Rose, Camp Manager at the Rodeo Grounds in Salinas.

Mr. C. F. Hashagen came in this morning to report  
that with our help and the fact that Mr. Rose permitted  
Hiroko Ikeda to appear in the case and identify her belong-  
ings, he had been able to get the court to issue an order to  
the Filipinos, who robbed the Ikeda's belongings, to return  
them.

Mr. Hashagen had a little difficulty with the va-  
rious attorneys and the judge at first but upon a fuller ex-  
planation of the situation and the possible consequences, the  
court ordered the Filipinos to make restitution and gave them  
a suspended sentence and probation. This finally wound up  
in the Filipinos giving Mr. Hashagen a good many things they  
had stolen from him also.

He was very much pleased when he left here and  
felt sure that he would not be bothered any more in that way  
and neither would the Ikeda family whose affairs he is trying  
to represent. The effect will be salutary all over.

This will introduce Mr. C. F. Hashagen who has the power of attorney to look after the affairs for the Hiroko Ikeda family. Mr. Hashagen is well known to us and we know that he is trying to do a difficult job in a very good manner and we appreciate his efforts.

It seems that the personal belongings of the Ikeda family left in one of the buildings on their ranch have been robbed by some Filipinos who broke in. It is felt that this must be stopped and restitution made.

After talking to the District Attorney, it is apparent that some examination of the belongings will have to be made so that a sworn statement can be made as to what is missing and for that purpose it would be necessary for some member of the Ikeda family familiar with the circumstances to inspect the furniture that is left.

Anything that you can do to help us and Mr. Hashagen and get this statement made promptly, will be greatly appreciated.



Bx 1401, Salinas, phone 4900, operating the Butane Gas Service Co. on 101 North of some equipment and tractor, etc. for \$1,050 dated April 2, 1942. Ikeda alleges Flyler took all the articles enumerated on the bill of sale signed for by both parties but did not pay anything for same and now claims he will not pay until a 250 ga. butane tank is included in the deal which is not mentioned in the bill of sale. He claims this was omitted through error. Ikeda claims Flyler wrote the bill of sale himself and nothing was said about the butane tank.

Ikeda owns a gas range and gas refrigerator which he bought from Flyler and on which about \$182 is due, on which the payments are up to date and if necessary he will complete them at any time.

4-8-42 Talked to Mrs. Flyler this morning and later Flyler called up and said it was a misunderstanding with Ikeda and that he would clear it up. He appeared to resent his being told what to do by Japanese and claimed that he had been misrepresented. Discussed the case over the phone with the D.A., Tony Brazil, who said he would act, if necessary. Later, W. C. Theile, an attorney, representing Ikeda came in with him and stated that he would see that his client, Ikeda, received proper treatment and payment so that unless we hear further complaint, we will consider the matter closed.





The above subject formerly operated the T. Saji Co., Ltd. and the Saji Trading Co., Los Angeles, California. At the time of evacuation Ikemoto entered into an agreement with one James Reese to operate the business on a fifty fifty basis. It appears as if each party would share alike in goods purchased and gross receipts. Reese was to care for the overhead.

Ikemoto says that H. C. Jones, an examiner for the Treasury Dept. and a Mr. Lee, he thinks from the Federal Reserve Bank, supervised the deal.

Ikemoto says the business arrangement was recently terminated and the stores closed but that in the final settlement he estimates he has been taken for around ten thousand dollars for goods purchased during the last few weeks of operation.

Apparently an attorney by the name of J. Marion Wright, whose address is in the Citizens National Bank bldg, Los Angeles, is representing Ikemoto and drew up the agreement.

The subject is an alien and it is rather hard to understand him or even just what he is driving at, even thru an interpreter.

I neglected to mention above that this business was operated for a time by the Treasury Dept. until, I understand, all liabilities had been satisfied.

I thought you might want the Los Angeles Branch to call on Wright or Reese and probably get a clearer picture there.

Reference is made to your letter dated July 7, 1943, requesting information as to any government controls which might affect the disposition of money held or acquired by Sueo Ikenaga and Wamiko Ikenaga, or their representatives.

It is our understanding that both of the individuals involved are American citizens, one of whom is in the armed forces of the United States, and the other residing at the Relocation Project at Rivers, Arizona.

Foreign Funds Control regulations apply only to persons having the status of nationals under Executive Order No. 8389, as amended, a copy of which is enclosed for your information, or to the transactions covered by the Order. It would not appear that either of the individuals involved would fall within the definition of the term "national" as used in the Order, and, if such is the case, the Order would apply to their activities only with respect to prohibited transactions.


I talked with Mr. Malcolm Gordon on the telephone this afternoon and learned from him after consultation with his attorney, he has decided to advance the \$230 payment due the Vendor of the real property on July 27 and thereafter to make further demand on the lessee, Mrs. Jilson, for the rent owing to the Ikenaga's. He has in mind instituting suit if the rental demand is not met.

He has returned the power of attorney forwarded by Mr. Harold Johnson to Merced with the request that it be completed as to the notarial affidavit and returned to him. He is relying upon the power of attorney submitted by Mr. Johnson for protection to him in the steps which he contemplates taking, in view of the fact that the power of attorney previously given to him by the Ikenaga's was limited.

The operation of our freezing power was explained to Mr. Gordon, it being pointed out that this power did not contemplate holding property in status quo for the duration of the war, but was intended as a more or less temporary protection to evacuees pending settlement of controversies with respect to the property frozen.

Under present circumstances he does not expect to call upon us to exercise our freezing power.

You have from time to time received letters from the undersigned advising of the difficulties being experienced in the collection of the rentals due to my client by Mrs. Louis Jilson who has leased the properties belonging to the above persons known as the Park Inn Cafe.

Every effort has been made to effect a satisfactory settlement of the rental due under the lease with out success.

As of this day there is due under the lease the rent for the months of May, June and July at the rate of \$102.50 per month or a total of \$307.50 less the sum of \$32.55 credit allowed for a payment made on the Butane equipment.

This morning Mrs. Jilson called the writer on the phone as asked that I call and collect the rent. I did call on her at approx. 5:30 P M and was offered thru her daughter a bundle of bills which they said contained \$100 on account and they would pay the balance next month. This offer was refused by me as not being according to the lease.

There is due on Monday July 27 1942 a balance due of \$230 to Alice Chadbourne the seller of this land. This payment we are not able to meet to conform to the requirements of the agreement.

A copy of this agreement between Alice Chadbourne and the Ikenaga's is enclosed which document is self explanatory.

At this time I wish to ask the aid of the Federal Government WCAA in the freezing of this property for the duration.

The principal owner of this property is Sueo Ikenaga who is in the Service of the United States of America. He is located at and is also known as

Fort Meade, South Dakota.

Inasmuch as this property was purchased before Oct 1940 it would be my personal opinion the the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act would operate against the probable loss of the land and buildings.

AGGREEMENT OF PURCHASE AND SALE.

This agreement of purchase and sale of the hereinafter described real property, made by and between ALICE CHADBOURNE, a widow, of the County of Solano, State of California, the party of the first part, hereinafter designated the seller, and SUBO IKENAGA and NAMIKO IKENAGA, both of the said County of Solano, the parties of the second part, hereinafter designated the purchasers;

WITNESSETH: That whereas, the seller did on the 27th day of July, 1940, agree to sell to the purchasers, for the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars, and on the terms hereinafter set forth and specified, all of the real property hereinafter particularly described and set forth, and

Whereas, at the time said sale agreement was so made, said real property was in probate, as part of the assets of the estate of R. H. Chadbourne, deceased, #7459, Records of the Superior Court of the State of California, in and for the County of Solano, and it was agreed between the parties hereto, that upon distribution in said estate to the seller who was the sole distributee therein and owner of said real property, that this agreement should be made and executed, and

Whereas, on making said agreement on said 27th day of July, 1940, the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars was paid on said purchase price of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars, and receipt of which sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars is hereby acknowledged, and

Whereas, distribution of said real property was heretofore made to the seller in the matter of the said estate, on the 13th day of January, 1941, and it is now the purpose of the parties hereto, that said agreement shall be executed in accordance with the understanding of the parties, when the aforesaid payment of \$500.00 was so made.

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS ISTO WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the premises and of the payment to her by the purchasers of the balance of said purchase price or Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars, with annual interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum, at the times and in amounts as hereinafter provided for, the seller hereby agrees to sell to, and the purchasers hereby agree to buy from the seller, all of that certain real property situate in Suisun Valley, said County of Solano, State of California, comprising approximately eight and one-half (8½) acres of land, and described as follows:

On the east by the lands now formerly owned by J. T. Cooper, now deceased, and lands of Richard Eaton; on the south by lands of said Eaton; on the west by lands jointly owned by said estate and by F. A. Chadbourne and on the north by the State Highway.

The purchasers hereby agree to pay said balance of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars, and said interest at six per cent annually, in five (5) annual payments of principal and accrued interest on all unpaid balances, at the rate of six per cent per annum, annually on the 27th day of July of each year, according to and as provided for in the schedule of payments, hereunto annexed, marked Exhibit "A" and hereby made a part of this agreement for all purposes hereof.



The purchasers also hereby covenant and agree, as part of this contract, and of the consideration for the conveyance hereafter, to them by the seller, of said real property, as follows:

That they will pro rate as of July 27, 1940, the date of their possession of said real property, all accrued taxes then due or payable and will henceforth pay all taxes, assessments or liens of every kind and nature that are now, or may be hereafter levied upon, or become liens or assessments on said real property, or on any part thereof; that they will keep said real property clear of all claims for labor or material furnished or to be furnished for any work or improvements thereon, and all of said work or improvements shall be done and performed at the sole cost of the purchasers, with the right to the seller to enter upon said real property, or any part thereof, at all reasonable times, for purposes of inspection or examination thereof, and to post the same with notice of non-responsibility of the seller for any claims for labor or material furnished for work or improvements on said real property.

The purchasers will, at all times, carry public liability and workmen's compensation insurance in amounts and insurance companies to be designated by the seller, whereby the seller shall be protected and indemnified against all claims for personal injuries of individuals, while on said property, as patrons or otherwise, of the purchasers, and for work, labor or services performed by any employee of the purchasers; the purchasers will also keep the buildings and other structural improvements erected or placed by them on said real property, insured in amount to be fixed by the seller, and loss to be

payable according to the interests of the parties hereto in said real property. If, on demand of the seller, the purchasers fail, neglect or refuse to secure any of the insurance or indemnity, as herein provided for, then the seller may secure such insurance in such company as she may select and at the sole cost of the purchasers, such costs to become part of the purchase price and to be repaid to the seller on demand, with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent annum.

The purchasers may lease or underlet said real property or any part thereof, but only with the written consent of the seller first had and obtained; that they will not assign this contract, nor any of their rights hereunder, without such written consent first had, that any and all improvements or additions to said premises and real property, of every kind, shall, for all purposes, be deemed a part hereof, and that if for any reason, this contract shall be cancelled, terminated or ended, that then such improvements shall be deemed part of said real property and pass to the seller,

It is further mutually agreed and understood, that no partnership nor the relation of landlord and tenant between the parties hereto, has been or will be created hereby, and that their relationship is solely contractual, being that of seller and purchasers of said real property.

It is hereby further mutually agreed, that time shall be of the essence of this contract, and of all of its terms, covenants and conditions, and that it shall bind and benefit the heirs, administrators, executors and assigns of the respective parties; that all payments due or to become due hereunder,

may be paid at any time, notwithstanding the term payments herein provided for; that on failure to make any of said payments to the seller, or on failure of the purchasers to make any other payments as herein provided for, or on their failure to do and perform any of their other covenants or agreements called for hereunder, that then, and in that event, and thereby this contract and all of its terms, may, at the option of the seller, be deemed wholly cancelled and ended, for all purposes, and the seller may thereupon, without previous notice or demand, enter upon said premises, take possession thereof and remove all persons therefrom or she may take such action, in law or in equity, as she may deem advisable in the premises, with a reasonable attorneys fee to the seller as part of her cost.

The purchasers hereby further covenant and agree to pay, at their sole cost and expense, for any division fences and any survey that may be necessary, to determine and fence off the boundaries of said real property.

The seller hereby agrees that upon receipt by her of all payments as provided for herein, and upon the doing of all other things by the purchasers, as herein required of them, that she will thereupon deliver to the purchasers a good and sufficient deed of conveyance of a merchantable title of the whole of said real property.

Inclosed please find power of attorney forms executed by Sueo Ikenaga to Mamiko Ikenaga and Mamiko Ikenaga to you. I would like to suggest that you have these forms recorded at once and be careful to have the one from Sueo to Mamiko recorded first and the one to you last.

After discussing this case with the Ikenagas today and talking the matter over with the Bank in San Francisco we have come to the conclusion that drastic action must be taken at once in this case hence the power of attorney forms giving you the absolute right to go ahead and take care of the matter without consulting the Ikenagas.

It was agreed that the best thing to do was to first contact the renter showing her the power of attorney, an extra copy is inclosed and can be certified by the County Redorder for that purpose, and demand the rent. If she refuses to pay get a lawyer and follow his advice. The Ikenagas agreed to pay a reasonable fee which shouldn't be more than \$25.00 or \$30.00 in the Justice Court to force the renter to pay up and keep her agreement.

Incase it takes past the 27th to get action in the court you should contact the seller, Alice Chadbourne, and see if she will give a reasonable extension for the making of the payment. If she won't play ball and the lawyer can't do anything with her call Mr. Armstrong in the Evacuee Property Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco and he will let you know if it is possible to freeze the property. Freezing would only be the very last resort and all other means to straighten the matter out should be taken first.



I feel that you should be immediately informed of any difficulty that may arise in the continued handling of the Park Inn Property, now being leased by Mrs Louise Jilson.

Thursday Mrs Jilson informed me that she would not pay the rent to me upon the advise of her attorney. That she intended to withhold certain moneys for certain repairs to the equipment which is not in agreement with the provisions of the lease.

The Butane company of Vacaville, through the owner, Mr Ed Uhl, telephoned me at home last Wednesday night and stated that they intended to repossess the Butane Gas installation for the reason that the installments are now 100% delinquent.

Mrs Jilson was instructed by Yozo Ikenaga to withhold \$50 for the April rent and \$32.17 for the May rent and to pay the sum to the Butane people. I was given to understand that the \$50 was withheld for the April payment, but from the statement made by Mr Uhl, he never received such payment.

Not being paid any money is going to result, possibly in the loss of the entire business together with the buildings valued at about \$6000, because a default on the payment due on July 27 for the land.

As you can see this whole project is becoming seriously involved only because no voluntary payment of the rent is being made.

Your advise and instruction would be very gratefully received.

Dear Mr. Reid:

In view of the uncertainty of the definite time of evacuation of our community, I wish to ask your advice as to the disposition of my professional equipment, including my medical library. My office consists of a suite of six rooms and it would take several thousand dollars to similarly re-equip another office if I were to lose what I now possess.

In your opinion, would it be wise or even necessary for me to crate and store my entire equipment immediately, against the date of evacuation of this area, or should I retain my office fully equipped in order to serve my community? In rendering your decision upon this point, it would perhaps be of some aid if I were to enumerate briefly the reasons for not being packed or partially so at this time.

In the first place, as you know, since I have practiced several years longer than the other Japanese doctors in Sacramento, the Japanese community expects me to act in a more or less liaison capacity between your various Federal Agencies and themselves.

Secondly, Dr. Zipf, the County Health Officer, acting for Dr. W. T. Harrison, of the U.S. Public Health Service, contacted me about a week ago, to select the medical staff and the nurses for the North Sacramento and the Marysville Assembly areas. Following several conferences with Dr. Zipf, we were able last Monday, April 6th, to select the required units of three doctors and four nurses for the Sacramento area and three doctors and three nurses for the Marysville area. This arrangement leaves only two practicing Japanese doctors in Sacramento, and leaves me as the only available Japanese surgeon in this area. The decision is a difficult one for me in that if I were to close my office, it would place me in the light of a rat deserting a sinking ship, whereas if I continue to practice, I may stand to lose my equipment because of the possible inadequacy of time when evacuation is ordered.

Dear Mr. Everson:

This is in answer to your letter of the 14th. instant and in further reference to the problem of guarding the automobiles of evacuees here in Tulare.

I just called on Chief of Police Perry and acquainted him with the Bank's problem. Chief Perry has not discussed the forty hour week with the men employed, although he has made arrangements with the "extra" men on the force to fill in should there be need of it. To date there has been no necessity for a substitute as the three men employed have worked every day. Chief Perry stated his willingness to accept the job of keeping time sheets on the men, paying them with funds furnished by the bank and taking care of relief and the extra help needed to maintain the forty hour week from his extra men on the local force. Chief Perry emphasized the fact that he would do this as a courtesy and as an individual and that no liability would accrue to him or the City of Tulare. He also stated his willingness to have the job handed to the Burns people but I doubt that it could be handled as economically or smoothly as it would by Chief Perry or some other individual. The Burns' people's nearest agency is Los Angeles so far as I can ascertain. It is hardly likely that they could send sufficient men here and handle the job at the price now being payed. I notice you mention the guards reporting in to local police headquarters. The lot here is out in a field about one mile from the city limits and it would be necessary to install a phone. As an afterthought, it might be feasible for the Burns people to put these men on their payroll but someone would still have to arrange for relief and time off. Things will run here as heretofore until I hear further from you. Chief Perry will see that the cars are guarded twenty fours a day. If there is anything further I can do please advise me. I can look after it, myself, if necessary, or if you desire.

Mr. Everson. continued:

A party by the name of Johnny Imamura, having an equity in a 1942 Mercury just came in with a notice from the Bank of America stating a payment of around \$52. was delinquent. He says he recently received a certification of balance due or some such paper from the Federal Reserve Bank, which he signed and returned. He is now wondering if he should make this payment. He seems to think, that as he signed to sell to the Army, the Bank has intentions of paying the remainder of his contract. I advised him to pay this installment and promised to advise him further concerning future payments. I should thank you to advise me concerning this.

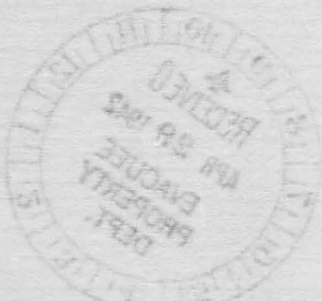

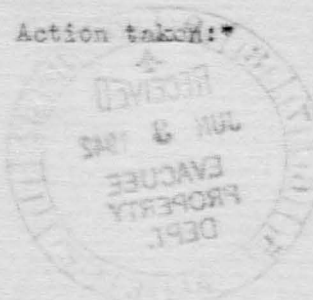

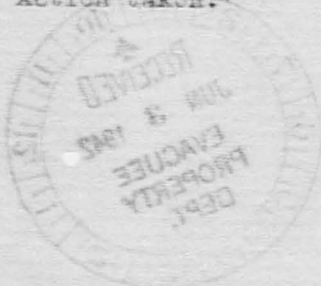

Reference is made to your letter dated September 5, 1942 wherein you were referred to us by Mr. Gordon Williams, field representative at the Pomona Assembly Center, with reference to your nursery property on East 14th Street, Oakland, California.


On August 17, 1942 we addressed a memorandum to our Los Angeles branch indicating a course of procedure that might enable you to salvage from \$100 to \$150 through the sale of the property, thereby avoiding foreclosure proceedings, then threatened. This memorandum, we were advised, reached our Los Angeles branch just too late to reach you before your departure for Wyoming.

Shortly thereafter Mr. Blumenstiel called upon us and your relationship with the American Trust Company was carefully reviewed. He was conversant with your property and felt that if monthly principal payments due the American Trust Company under their engagement with you could be reduced somewhat, that he might be interested in purchasing your equity. As a result of this conversation and subsequent discussions with the American Trust Company in Oakland, it is our understanding that Mr. Blumenstiel wired you, offering you \$100 for the delivery to him of a warranty deed to the property, he assuming all encumbrances against the property. Your letter confirms the receipt of this offer and your acceptance thereof.

We learned today from the American Trust Company that they had been advised of the receipt of your wire and understood that Mr. Blumenstiel had placed the closing details in the hands of the Alameda County East Bay Title Insurance Company. You will no doubt hear from them as to the procedure to follow in the closing of this arrangement, and we are glad that you have been able to recoup the sum of \$100 and avoid foreclosure proceedings.

As a resident of a War Relocation Project, your property problems are under the jurisdiction of the War Relocation Authority, Hotel Whitcomb Building, San Francisco, California. We are sending a copy of this letter to that Authority for completion of their records, and are writing you direct solely because of the immediate and continued contact we have had with this matter in recent months. We suggest that if it is necessary in completing the present negotiations to seek any further assistance at this end, that you address your letter to the War Relocation Authority at the above address.



MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. Everson

SUBJECT: Property located adjacent to the northeast corner of East 14th Street and 55th Avenue, Oakland, California, owned in fee by Mr. Haruo Imura, an evacuee.

This property was sold to Mr. Imura on June 14, 1940 for the sum of \$6,500; \$300 was paid in cash and a deed of trust given to the American Trust Company by the purchaser for the remaining amount of \$6,200. The terms of the deed of trust provided for payment of \$250, including interest, to be paid during the calendar year ending June 30, 1941; \$40 per month thereafter (inclusive of interest) from June 30, 1941 to June 30, 1942; and \$50 monthly including interest from June 30, 1942 to maturity date, June 14, 1945. No payments on the deed of trust have been received subsequent to March 16, 1942. As of July 1, 1942 the status of the loan shows a principal balance due of \$5,812.18 with interest paid thereon and credited up to March 1, 1942. Modest additional costs would be involved relating to a declaration of default, which was given June 11, 1942.

The property in question, according to the description given us by the Oakland office of the American Trust Company, is a plot 166.13 feet fronting on East 14th Street, with a depth of 100 feet. The southern boundary of the property is approximately 100 feet north of the corner of 55th Avenue and East 14th Street.

There is an inside lot with a Standard Oil station occupying the corner immediately adjacent. The property in question is in a deplorable condition so far as improvements thereon are concerned. An old greenhouse, size approximately 14 X 50, is of practically no value and a large portion of its glass frames are broken. Nearby residents indicated that boys in the neighborhood are responsible and further damage can be expected.

There is a smaller combination building fronting on East 14th Street which contains some hothouse facilities and which undoubtedly is the improvement that the Japanese stated he had erected thereon, costing approximately \$1,000. This improvement in its present condition would not justify such an appraisal value. The present value of the existing improvements is negligible.

The history of the property, which we have checked with one of the earlier owners, is as follows:

Prior to 1929 this property was acquired as a speculation by a group of Oakland men who paid approximately \$35,000 therefor. A mortgage was given back to the American Trust Company for \$12,000. In 1936 or 1937 the property was foreclosed under this mortgage and title has been held by the American Trust Company until sale was effected to Mr. Haruo Imura in 1940. Bank officials stated to us that they appraised the property at \$7,000 in 1936.

The property lies directly across East 14th Street from the KGO Radio Station of the General Electric Company. While there are some substantial industrial concerns in the same general area, the improvements and type of occupancy on East 14th Street, generally speaking, in this area are distinctly second grade and no improvement in the area generally is indicated during the past ten years.

Inquiries made of well-informed realtors conversant with the area indicate that little improvement can be expected at least for the duration of the war. Prior to December 7, 1941 the East Bay Shore Highway running south from the business center of Oakland had been authorized. This is a high speed highway and would have diverted a large section of the present traffic now using East 14th Street. The improvement has been postponed for the duration, due to the heavy steel requirements. Its completion following the end of the war should adversely affect later valuation.

These well-informed sources indicated that this particular property (known to parties consulted) might be worth \$4,500 as a speculation to be held for an extended period of years but there would be no equity in the property now mortgaged for approximately \$5,900.

We were informed that subsequent to evacuation, Mr. Imura advised the American Trust Company of his willingness to execute a deed to the property to the American Trust Company, expressing the hope, however, that in so doing he might be able to retrieve some portion of his investment he indicated he had made in the improvements, together with interest and principal payments of approximately \$2,000 since acquiring the property.

The Bank apparently feel that in order to regain possession they should pursue the proper legal formalities rather than accept a voluntary deed from the owner, in view of their former ownership of the property.

It is the opinion of the undersigned, after viewing the property and consulting with the authorities referred to, that there is no apparent market for the property in its present condition at a price in excess of the amount of the trust deed indebtedness against the property.

The nursery situation generally, due to Japanese evacuation from this area, is in a chaotic condition and the speculative value of the land alone has already been indicated above.

Mr. Imura might consider advertising the property for sale in the Oakland newspapers in the hope of reaching some specially interested buyer. Frankly, however, the authorities consulted do not believe such effort will be successful.

Reference is made to various memoranda dealing with the above evacuee and more specifically with our memorandum to you under date of August 12, 1942.

We now find that it will not be possible to interview Mr. Blumenstiel until August 26 inasmuch as he is out of the city until that date. His wife, however, states that he is definitely interested, together with a partner, in the lease of the property under review, inasmuch as their present nursery is inadequate for their requirements. It will be necessary, of course, for the prospective new lessee to spend a good deal of money on the rehabilitation of the property, which is in a deplorable state at the present writing, as was indicated to you in our earlier report.

In the present instance we have the evacuee owner in the Pomona Assembly Center, the mortgage lien holder, with notice of default outstanding, located in Oakland, California, and the prospective new tenant busy with outside duties and difficult to contact. We reviewed the situation again with the vice president of the American Trust Company in Oakland in an endeavor to work out a preliminary program that would avoid further delays, if a common meeting ground can be reached between the three parties of interest referred to above. The present deed of trust, now in default, provides for the approximate monthly interest payments of \$24.00, with approximate monthly principal payments of \$26.00, or a total of approximately \$50.00 a month. Taxes total approximately \$10.00 a month. Without some modification of the principal payment it is clearly evident that the minimum rental required to service the property will approximate \$60.00 per month. The Bank, we believe, recognizes that any new tenant taking over at this time would have to expend a substantial sum in the rehabilitation of the present run-down improvements; also unlikely that in addition a rental of \$60.00 could be secured. While, of course, the Bank would naturally like to secure this maximum rental, they would, we feel confident, consider a modification of the present monthly principal payment. In other words, a rental somewhere between \$35.00 and \$50.00 per month.

Imura, present evacuee owner, has, based on disinterested appraisals secured by us, no equity in this property, irrespective of the modest payments he has made on account of the purchase since he acquired the property. Within a relatively short time the Bank can proceed with its

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GENERAL FILE

notice of default and through sale, quite probably wipe out any interest the evacuee might have in the property.

After discussion with the Bank, we suggest the following procedure:

Promptly contact Imura and place before him the substance of this memorandum, copy of which is enclosed, supplementing the previous information that your representative has already conveyed to him; if acceptable, we would suggest that your representative have Imura approve in writing the sub-leasing, or execution of a new lease for any monthly rental amount that may be agreed upon between the contemplated new lessee and the Bank, provided the rental involved is adequate to service the taxes, monthly interest and monthly principal requirements, if any, that may be agreed upon between the Bank and the new lessee. In the event there is any monthly surplus above such servicing requirements, such surplus shall be applied by the American Trust Company in the reduction of the indebtedness due it from Imura.

The effect of such approval by Imura at this time would permit negotiations to be carried on promptly and effectively between the prospective new lessee and the American Trust Company as principals with this bank acting in an advisory capacity. We, of course, have no definite knowledge at the moment that such a lease can be arranged and on terms sufficient to service the loan, however, there is a possibility of doing so and this suggested procedure should save a material amount of time and effort to all parties of interest.

It is suggested that Imura set a sales price on the property, to be conveyed to us promptly, option at this price to hold for three to five years. It is quite probable that Blumenstiel will wish such an option to buy contained in any lease agreement.

Reference is made to your letter of July 24th regarding the above evacuee, wherein you enclose report received from Mr. Everson in San Francisco.

We referred this report to Mr. Imura and after considerable thought by him on the basis of the memorandum, he has come to the conclusion that he would like us to again take the matter up with the American Trust Company and see if they would reconsider their former decision in not accepting a deed from Imura for some nominal amount, say \$100.00 or \$150.00, which would save them lots of time and trouble on the foreclosure proceedings. We suggested that this was something that he would have to do himself and believe he has done this.

In the mean time he has received copy of letters from another flower grower in Oakland name, J. Blumenstiel, who operates the Central Flower and Cactus Shop, 2312 Coolidge Avenue, Oakland, indicating that he would like to enter negotiation with the owner to the lease the place with an option to buy at a later time. He would like to know what kind of deal could be worked out, and at what price, particularly on a rental basis.

Unfortunately the evacuee does not feel that he can enter into any negotiation at present time because of the American Trust Company's action as well as the fact that he is not on the spot to negotiate with anyone on the outside. Furthermore, he will be evacuated further away in the near future and consequently feels that possibly the American Trust Company would like to follow up the inquiry of J. Blumenstiel and might reconsider their earlier decision in making some cash settlement with the evacuee, so that he might receive something for his property. In this he asks our help, but as mentioned above, promised him nothing of a definite nature.

Is there anything you can suggest to pass along to Mr. Everson, to give the evacuee Imura, any assistance in effecting some salvage from this piece of property?

We are returning the memorandum Mr. Everson sent us along with two letters the evacuee received from Mr. Blumenstiel which gives full particulars.

Your letters July 17 and August 10 - our letter July 21.

Reference is made to your memorandum dated August 10, 1942 relating to certain nursery property, title to which is vested in Haruo Imura, together with enclosure of a letter from your field representative, Gordon C. Williams, at Pomona Assembly Center, Pomona, California.

We have reviewed the subject matter of the letter in question with Mr. Crichton, vice-president in charge of the Mortgage Department of the American Trust Company, main branch, Oakland, California, which has the Imura property under its jurisdiction.

It has been clearly indicated to us that the American Trust Company wish in every reasonable way to cooperate with the evacuee in question in aiding him to retain title to the property, providing a satisfactory lease can be arranged that will permit the prompt payment of taxes and servicing charges on the existing deed of trust, irrespective of the fact that notice of default was filed by the American Trust Company early in June, 1942. The actual servicing charges on the present loan approximate \$40 per month, with taxes in addition of approximately \$15 a month.

It therefore would appear that the property would have to be leased for a minimum consideration of \$55 per month. In the event that this figure could not be secured, the question arises whether Imura is financially able to meet, from his own personal resources, any monthly deficit that might be involved.


With regard to Mr. J. Blumenstiel, we are endeavoring to contact him in connection with his indicated interest in possibly leasing the property with option to buy, for a five-year period. We find, by contacting his home, that he is rather difficult to reach during business hours, but will make every effort to learn his views as soon as possible. He called on the American Trust Company a few weeks ago to learn Imura's address, indicating that he might be interested in leasing the property, but expressed no ideas as to price.

With reference to the suggestion as to a sum of \$100 or \$150 to be paid by the American Trust Company to Imura in consideration of the last named executing a warranty deed, thereby saving foreclosure sale costs, etc., no definite opinion can be reached on this point

until after the lease possibilities of the property have been exhausted. Quite frankly, we are not very optimistic as to the interest of Mr. Blumenstiel in the lease of the property at an approximate lease rental adequate to service the present loan and meet taxes in view of the numerous recent contacts we have had with other nursery properties in the same general area which were in much more efficient operating condition than in this instance.

We hope, therefore, to be able to advise you within a relatively short time as to what can be done with Mr. Blumenstiel. In the interval we suggest that you arrange to have Laura advised of the further effort we are making in his behalf, making it clear to him that the attitude of the American Trust Company, as evidenced to us, is cooperative and helpful.

In the event that you may wish to refer it to your field representative, Mr. Gordon G. Williams, at Pomona Assembly Center, a copy of this letter is enclosed for your convenience.

Dear Mr. Bold:

Prior to evacuation, Mr. Harno Imura owned in fee the property located approximately at corner of East 14th Street and 55th Avenue, Oakland, California.

He had this leased to another Japanese who operated a nursery thereon and was paying him approximately \$50.00 per month for rent, which was just about carrying the payments Mr. Imura had to make covering principal, interest and taxes.

Just before evacuation, Mr. Imura thought he had a deal whereby someone would take over the nursery and pay between \$40.00 and \$50.00 a month rent which would carry his expenses, but at the last minute apparently the deal fell through, and since coming up here has been in a quandry as to procedure to try and protect his interests.

It seems the American Trust Company, 14th Street and Broadway, Oakland, California, holds trust deed against this property which was originally \$6,500.00 at the time of purchase, but subsequent payments of approximately \$40.00 a month, principal and interest, have reduced it to approximately \$5,800.00. However, since Mr. Imura originally purchased the property, he has added approximately \$1,000.00 in additional improvements such as hot house, etc.

On June 11, 1942, the American Trust Company filed Notice of Default and Intention to Sell Under Deed of Trust, because of non-payment of principal, interest and taxes, and have so advised Mr. Imura by letter under date of June 16.

Since coming up here Mr. Imura does not know in what condition the nursery or the property is, and has come to us for guidance and assistance in trying to work out his problem which has gotten beyond him because of evacuation.

Mr. Imura's address before evacuation, was 2225 Pacific Ave., Alameda, California, which house he owned, paying for on H.O.L.C. terms. This property, however, is rented for sufficient amount to carry itself.

Could we take this up with Mr. Everson of our San Francisco office who might be able to send a man over to check the property and what is on top of the ground? Possibly we could find a buyer for the nursery, or failing that, the F. S. A. might be able to offer a suggestion as to how this equity can be protected by carrying on the nursery some way or other.



Dear Mr. Johnson:

We are enclosing a copy of a letter from R. A. Inaba, W.C.C.A. Assembly Center, Merced, as well as a copy of our reply letter of even date.

You will observe that he appears to have a substantial equity in certain store equipment and fixtures (presumably grocery store property), and is confronted with the problem of whether to dispose of it at this time or to pay off the balance on the property looking toward the use of it at some time in the future. He also indicates that he would like to make arrangements for Government storage of the property if he decides to pay off the balance.

It is our thought that you might get in touch with the evacuee and discuss the situation in person. Obviously, evacuation operations in the Fresno area having been completed, it becomes questionable how far we should go in now accepting goods for storage. Any such action would be contrary to the policy previously established.

From the standpoint of the evacuee, it becomes highly uncertain when he might be able to make use of the store equipment and fixtures, and if he knows someone who would be in a position to negotiate a sale of the property on reasonable terms, he might be able to realize a satisfactory sum for his equity and conclude that it would be advantageous to dispose of the property in such a manner.

There is a bare possibility that the War Relocation Authority might in due course be interested in having property of this character available at Relocation Centers. If so, this might warrant the evacuee in retaining the property. The War Relocation Authority would have the problem relating to policy in whether or not the goods stored privately would be picked up by that agency for delivery to a Relocation Center, which step they have been unwilling to take to date.

Please contact Mr. Inaba and explore the situation with him more fully, giving him the benefit of any suggestions which seem to be appropriate. He might wish to communicate with the War Relocation Authority to get their views on the possible future need for this type of equipment.

As Executor of the Estate of L. H. Todhunter, Deceased, we desire to report the facts as we see them regarding the tenancy of George S. Inouye.

During the life of Mr. L. H. Todhunter, he entered into leases with Japanese on his ranch which apparently were in violation of the California Alien Land Law. Not only were these leases made to minor children of Japanese aliens but also to Japanese citizens who took the leases in their names for the benefit of alien Japanese.

The tract of land in question is being farmed by S. Inouye, an alien, father of George S. Inouye, whom Mr. Todhunter gave a three year lease to on January 1, 1939 and, at that time, had not reached the age of twenty-one years.

After our appointment as Executor of said estate, we realized that violations were permitted and early in December of 1941 advised the Japanese on the ranch that we could not renew such leases and not to do any farming unless we agreed to a lease and, further, that the matter was being taken up with our attorneys for instructions. Not only on this occasion but many times since we advised the Japanese that any leases would not be permitted to tenants where they had either leases in dummy names or to their young sons and daughters where the mother and father were on the ranch and the real parties in interest. This action was taken upon advice of our attorneys, Messrs. Downey, Brand and Seymour, also Archibald D. McDougall, who stated that if we permitted such leases that the Todhunter Estate would be liable as well as the Bank individually. A delegation of the Japanese tenants called upon the District Attorney of Yolo County, Woodland, California, for an opinion on this matter and were likewise advised that leases could not be permitted to them under the Alien Land Law.

We are permitting one Japanese tenant who is farming in his own name, whose father is deceased, to complete his crops of onions, lettuce and spinach, and the balance of the land is being farmed to sugar beets, tomatoes, corn and barley, with the possibility of some of the acreage being planted to beans.

All of the Japanese tenants are being permitted to remain in their homes on the ranch until evacuation orders are given them and all have cooperated, with the one registered objection coming from George Inouye.

The acreage involved in this case consists of one and one-half acres made up in two separate tracts, one-half acre being in small onions and one acre in cabbage plants which have not even commenced to head. These patches have not even been kept up, either by weeding or irrigation. If they are permitted to remain, they would interfere with the planting of sugar beets in this area, and certainly would not be fair to those who abandoned their farming last year after being advised that new leases would not be forthcoming.

5/11/42- Mr. Louis Moore, assistant D. A., phone 6208, phoned in regard to some personal belongings of the Japanese family by name of T. Irino who are now in camp at our Rodeo Grounds here, which are stored in a house on the Somavia Farms #1. He said the mice were eating the furniture and it soon would be destroyed if it was not moved.

Mr. Moore wanted us to remove this and store in the bank's warehouse which we explained we could not do, but offered to discuss the matter with the evacuee at the camp.

5/12/42- The furniture is stored on the Somavia Ranch #1 in building #2. It appears that the Somavias, or the Moores, feel they do not want the furniture in the house as they need the room. I think that is the principal reason for wanting that stuff moved. The evacuee had permission to leave it there before going to camp.

We again explained to Mr. Moore that we could not accept the furniture for our warehouse and told him to make other arrangements with the evacuee. He thought they might arrange to store the stuff somewhere else or the evacuee might make arrangements for private storage. In any event, Mr. Moore said if there were any difficulties he would let us know.

5/18/42- Mr. Moore had not yet received a reply to his letter to Irino at the camp about the furniture.

6/1/42-Mr. Moore advised by telephone today that Irino had written him it was all right to move the furniture into another room on the farm and he has moved it and will continue to take care of the stuff for them as per original oral arrangement, except for changing the location.

These people did not come to us with this problem before they went to the camp although we do remember meeting them and having them tell us at the time that the

I enclose herewith memorandum from S. Bernard Gill, Deputy District Attorney. I have no knowledge of this case beyond the fact that the land is located some seven miles south of Mojave in the desert. Mr. Gill wanted to talk about this case today, but I requested him to write the enclosed, as it was necessary for me to be in Delano, at the request of Mr. Evans, to issue travel passes to Kern Japanese to transport Tulare Japanese to the Assembly Center at Tulare, Tuesday and Wednesday. Except in the case of the workers on the Sierra Vista Ranch no provision was made by the Army for such transportation.

The representative of the Provost Marshall at Tulare approved this method. I believe if we have the same problem in Kern County, we can arrange with the Delano Union (WCCA) High School to provide busses, for 10¢ a bus per mile and the payment of any extra Insurance premium.

MEMORANDUM TO WARTIME CIVILIAN CONTROL  
ADMINISTRATION c/o GLEN JOHNSON

The State of California and the District Attorney's Office of the County of Kern have instituted escheat proceedings in the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of Kern against real property owned by Y. Ishihara and Tami Ishihara.

This is Civil Action No. 37607. The ruling on the Order to Show Cause why such property should not escheat to the State is to be heard at 2:00 P.M. on the first day of June, 1942. The Ishiharas last address was c/o Mrs. Torri, 1525 West Front Street, Selma, California.

As a practical matter, it will be impossible for the Ishiharas to attend the hearing of the Order to Show Cause, due to the restrictions placed on the travel of Japanese in this area. To date, the Ishiharas have apparently made no attempt to be represented by counsel at said hearing. Normally in such a case, a default judgment would be entered and the title to the property would then vest in the State. However, the possibility is present that such a default judgment might not be valid until approval by the Alien Property Custodian.

The preparation of facts in this memorandum were made in order for us to know in advance of the hearing on said Order to Show Case what the position of the W. C. C. A and the Alien Property Custodian will be.

Reference is made to the subject application in which a license is requested authorizing the transfer of the assets of the El Amigo Company to your son, Robert Tadashi Ishii.

This application should be supplemented by a statement showing the consideration to be paid for the assets of the company and indicating the purpose of the transfer.

It would appear that the area in which your business is located is within the area designated by the military authorities for the evacuation of Japanese aliens and citizens of Japanese extraction. The possibility seems to exist therefore, that you, as well as your son, will be subject to the evacuation order which will probably come in the relatively near future.

While the government desires those affected by evacuation orders to arrange their affairs in the manner which they consider, under the circumstances, most advantageous to their own interests, there appears to be some question whether the subject application is consistent with the situation which may be anticipated. We would appreciate a statement from you covering your own ideas on this aspect of your case.


