March 12, 1942, inquiring as to the possibility
of renting vineyard or orchard property in
Stanislaus or Merced County.

It is suggested that if you have any particular piece of property in mind, to contact the owner or occupant in an endeavor to make your arrangements on a private basis, inasmuch as for the most part, the persons involved will be in a position to transact business on that basis. Consultation with your banking connections and responsible real estate agents should be helpful.

In our program of assisting persons who may be required to evacuate the Military Areas which have been established, we are encouraging the equitable sale or leasing of their properties by private negotiation wherever possible. While it is possible that some properties of the nature of which you have expressed a desire will come to our attention in the course of this program, we have no such properties before us at this time.

We will be pleased to hold your inquiry in our files for further reference should occasion arise.

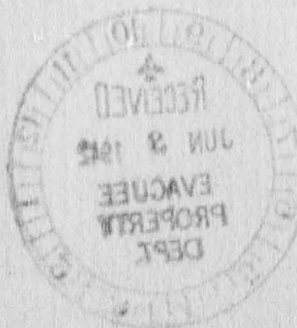



Mr. Mundell presents as problem and asks assistance for evacuees in matter of cashing checks just issued to over 1000 evacuees for services performed at Center. This is first pay day at this Center. No method established at present by which checks may be cashed. 4200 people at Center. Present issue of checks to 1030 about \$6000. He had been unsuccessful in arranging with local banks for the cashing of these checks at the Center. Many of the payees impatient. Mundell says other Centers have been serviced by their local banks. Rule of his Department is that all such disbursements must be by check.

The Banks' side of problem: There is no arbitrary stand by them. They want to cooperate. Matter was studied and decision made in Clearing House meetings. Physically impossible to perform messenger service due to lack of personnel. Men dropping out, women coming in. Service would require 2 men and guard. Messengers with endorsed checks would have to be bonded. Banks believe problem belongs to WPA. Bk of Am service at Turlock Center was dropped after unsatisfactory trial. Bank charters and insurance said to require such services to be performed within banks. Cooperative Suggestions by banks: Center issue one check for pay roll and cash it, or bring in all checks endorsed and they will cash them.

Action taken: In this case distribute them among all banks and lighten load on reduced personnel. Or spread them out over few days. Regardless of this question of immediate cashing, many payees are mailing checks to banks for deposit, the banks returning duplicate deposit slips. Informed Mr. Mundell that we could take no action in matter, but that we were hopeful of hearing of satisfactory solution.







Your letter July 31, 1942

We are enclosing the original and a copy of our letter of even date addressed to Mr. John J. Langenbach, Raymond attorney, in response to his communication of July 16, 1942 relating to the above-named evacuee.

In view of the remarks made by Mr. Hamilton in his letter of July 25, 1942, a copy of which you transmitted to us, and the pendency of litigation, we believe that we would not be justified in exercising any freezing power and have so stated in the enclosed letter.

If you are in accord with its substance, we should appreciate your transmitting the letter to Mr. Langenbach, or forwarding a similar letter over your own signature.

With respect to Mr. Hamilton's situation, we share the regret that a case has arisen in which a representative of this bank was placed in the equivocal position of having been nominated as an agent of an evacuee at the time he was an employee of this bank.

It is observed that there is an additional phase of the relationship which should undoubtedly have Mr. Hamilton's consideration in that he appears to represent the largest of the concern's creditors, which might create additional problems, particularly in the event it becomes necessary for that creditor to enforce its claims against the Eagle Oyster Packing Company.

This type of situation is one that we have endeavored to avoid in all of our dealings, both in our Foreign Funds Control operations and in the operations of our Evacuee Property Department. In the former case, the Treasury Department's policy is expressed in our Instruction Letter No. 1 to the Foreign Funds Control Examiners dated July 22, 1942, a copy of which is enclosed for your information; and we believe you will recall the provisions of our Evacuee Property Department Instruction Letter No. 24 which clearly indicates the attitude of the Wartime Civil Control Administration with respect to dealings with evacuees by persons connected with the Wartime Civil Control Administration in any capacity.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter dated July 16, 1942 advising us of the fact that a suit has been filed against the above named evacuee, and requesting information regarding the freezing power vested in this bank with respect to evacuation operations.

We believe you are aware of the fact that no moratorium legislation has been enacted which would prevent recovery on indebtedness owing from evacuees, and the only freezing provisions are those embodied in Special Regulation No. 1 as set forth in Evacuee Property Department Circular No. 1 of this bank, a copy of which is enclosed for your information.

We call your attention to the fact that the authority contained in this Regulation is effective only in cases where there is property of evacuees which can, in effect, be held in status quo pending completion of negotiations between evacuees and party or parties holding an adverse interest, looking toward a satisfactory settlement of the issue. It has no force in a case of the character presented by you, with the understanding that it is a suit for recovery of unsecured indebtedness owing from an evacuee, inasmuch as there would appear to be no property involved against which the force of the Regulation could be directed.

We believe we should point out that we do not feel that the powers vested in this bank under the Regulation were intended for use in cases where the rights of the parties are in the course of determination through due legal process.

We have corresponded with Mr. W. W. Hamilton, who, until June 30, 1942 was in our employ as a Field Representative, Evacuee Property Department, in particular at Raymond, Washington, concerning the information set forth in a letter dated July 16 addressed to you by Mr. John J. Langenbach, an attorney, regarding a suit filed against Richard Murakami. Copies of letters dated July 24 and July 25 received from Mr. Hamilton in reply are enclosed.

It is our feeling that Mr. Hamilton was somewhat less than frank with us in failing to inform us, either prior to his employment or thereafter, of his personal interest in the operations of Murakami. Although it appears from his correspondence that he did not solicit the power of attorney, nevertheless he did accept the appointment apparently during the period of his employ with us. We believe, however, that Mr. Hamilton, whom we consider a man of good judgment, would not represent himself as acting in our behalf in any undertakings which he would perform under the power of attorney.

We also are enclosing copies of interview sheets and correspondence from our files with respect to the Murakami matter.

In view of the information contained in the letter from Mr. Hamilton dated July 25, we believe that an application for special blocking is not justified.

You refer, in your letter of the 22nd, to a letter from your San Francisco office to communication from John Langenbach of Raymond in regard to action being taken against Richard Murakami.

At the time Mr. Langenbach talked with me about the suit against Richard Murakami I was not informed that changed conditions had been made regarding a note due a Dr. Bard in the amount of \$1,000.00.

This note originally was given by George Fujii to Dr. Bard in the above amount and endorsed by Eagle Oyster Packing Co. by Richard Murakami, Treasurer. When the note fell due Fujii could not pay it and the endorser was called upon for payment. This involved the legality of the endorsement (Eagle Oyster Packing Co. had not funds with which to pay it) and it was my impression that it was on this note that suit for collection was being brought against Richard Murakami, an individual. I am now informed that attorney for Dr. Bard obtained a note signed individually by Richard Murakami, to replace the original note signed by George Fujii and it is the note signed by Richard Murakami on which suit is being instituted in face of which I can see nothing that can be done for him.

This deal was originally entered into several years ago when George Fujii, a brother-in-law of Richard Murakami, was trying to finance a logging deal.

Dear Mr. Symms:

Reference is made in your letter of the 22nd to power of attorney which was given me by Eagle Oyster Packing Co., Nahcotta, Washington.

There is absolutely no basis or justification for the assumption on the part of anyone that my period of employment by the Federal Reserve Bank was used by me either to further my interests or to protect my interests, either past, present, or future. Neither can it be assumed that any position has in any way compromised to position of the Federal Reserve Bank.

To clarify this situation however I feel a responsibility and for which reason I am presenting the following facts.

In 1931 Japanese people first established themselves in the oyster industry on Willapa Harbor at which time we supplied their requirements in building materials. The following years as more Japanese located on this harbor, either in the oyster business or as workers therein we continued to supply their building material requirements.

In August of 1936 we commenced supplying the building materials for the plant and scows of Eagle Oyster Packing Co., this being the time when this company actually started construction of plant, etc., to operate in the oyster business. Our sales to this company ran into thousands of dollars from the above date up to August of 1941. During the summer of 1941 we sold to the Eagle Oyster Packing Co. a total of \$1,744.20 and we sold to the Murakami family, who are the major stockholders in this company, for improvement of their cranberry bogs a total of \$886.48. The sale to the Oyster Co. was on a credit basis and secured by chattel mortgage on all of the scows which they owned. The sale to the family was to be paid from the proceeds of the 1941 cranberry crop.

At the start of the oyster season in 1941 the industry was confronted with "union troubles" therefore, operation was delayed for better than 30 days before labor difficulties were settled. Shortly thereafter the war broke with Japan and the Eagle Oyster Packing Co. was again tied up. The

chattel mortgage which I had taken from the company amounting to \$1,744.20 I discounted with the Seattle-First National Bank, Raymond Branch, the monthly payments on which defaulted for the reasons covered above. The Raymond Branch also had in their bank Automobile paper on sale of a new automobile to Richard Murakami, manager of Eagle Oyster Packing Co., therefore, even before January, 1942, representative of the Raymond Branch and myself contacted Mr. Murakami to see what the status was with the Oyster Co. and to assist and advise them in any way expedient, circumstances considered.

When evacuation of Japanese was first discussed nationally a representative of the Raymond Bank and myself contacted the company and urged that they anticipate such an action and get their business in as liquid a position as possible but at this time had no idea of the heavy obligations which they had outstanding. At the time of this contact a discussion was carried on with them as to a capable party to represent their interests in event of evacuation, and at their request we made an appointment and attempted to get Mr. Lochrie, manager of the Ilwaco Bank, to take the job. Mr. Lochrie declined due to insufficient time and suggested that we contact Mr. Doupe of Ilwaco Oyster Co. which we in turn did and who likewise declined to act. During this same time the request was made of me by the principal stockholders of the Oyster Co. that I represent their interests in event that they were evacuated which I declined and due to the fact that the operation was too far from Raymond therefore would consume too much of my time going back and forth.

I did promise them at that time that I would, provided that they were unable to get anyone else, assist in any manner that I could.

The detail which I have above gone into is for the purpose of giving you a picture of the business relationship that had existed between the Oyster Co. and myself since their organization and which had, to say the least, predicated on mutual confidence.

It was on March 23 that I actually started to work for the Federal Reserve Bank and at no time during my period of employment by the Federal Reserve Bank did the Oyster Co. actually come to me and state that they were depending upon me to represent them until the day that they were actually evacuated from their home. On this day they informed me that a mutual friend would deliver to me certain records of the Oyster Co. You will find in your files correspondence in regard to negotiations with North Star, Inc. for lease of all of the Oyster Co's. properties. This lease was made and became effective as of June 1, 1942, which provides for the complete operation of the entire properties of the Oyster Co. on the basis of a rental of buildings, boats and scows, and a basis payment for the oysters.

It was not until about June 15 or 16 that the files of the Oyster Co. which I have referred to above, were delivered to me and to say the least I was very much surprised to find that on April 1, 1942, the Oyster Co. had their attorney make up power of attorney naming me attorney-in-fact, and I can only conclude that this had been held in their files or the file of their attorney to be given me as a last resort, and then with the major obligation of appeasing their creditors of which I am one of the largest. (I attach hereto a sample of letters which were sent out by the Manager of the Oyster

Co. the date of which, you will note, is June 1, 1942, and which was one day prior to their evacuation). At one time, during their negotiations on the lease with North Star, Inc., they had hoped that sufficient funds would be advanced by North Star to clean up all pressing obligations and it is my assumption that if they had able to consummate this arrangement, which did not go through, then they would not have had occasion to call upon me to act as attorney-in-fact. (My only obligation is to figure how \$16,000.00 in obligations can be paid with about \$500.00 in funds.) For which I receive no remuneration either at the present or as far in the future as I can see.

It is rather chargining for me to go into this detail in an attempt to explain to your satisfaction the circumstances under which I was drawn into this position, and it is only being done with the desire that no mar is made on the very pleasant relationship which I enjoyed while in the employment of the Federal Reserve Bank. It is my opinion that you, knowing the workings of the average Japanese mind, are in a better position to understand this circumstance than are many.

When you have found sufficient time to review this booklet I will very much appreciate your frank conclusion.

We are enclosing a copy of a letter dated July 16, 1942 from John J. Langenbach, an attorney at Raymond, Washington, in which he apparently seeks the exercise of our freezing power for the benefit of his client at the suggestion of Mr. W. W. Hamilton.

It does not appear that this is a case in which use should be made of the freezing power, particularly as the matter is now at issue in the courts. Before so advising Mr. Langenbach, however, we would appreciate any information your files may disclose on the subject, as it is, no doubt, one which has already come to your attention.

We have observed the remark that Mr. W. W. Hamilton holds a power of attorney from the evacuee and that Mr. Hamilton assisted this bank during the course of the evacuation operations. Presumably he was a Field Representative working out of your office.

It is, of course, highly undesirable from our standpoint to have any of our representatives representing the interests of evacuees, even though such representation may have been undertaken after employment with this bank has been severed. We would appreciate receiving information as to the circumstances surrounding the appointment of Mr. Hamilton as attorney in fact for the evacuee if Mr. Hamilton was in fact in the employ of this bank.

At the time he was evacuated, he was in debt to various local parties and suits were threatened. Now a suit has been filed against him.

Mr. W.W. Hamilton of Raymond, Washington has a power of attorney to represent him in connection with his local business interests. Mr. Hamilton also assisted your Bank in evacuation proceedings locally. He suggested to me that I write your Bank for information and forms, "E.P.4", for the purpose of further protecting the interests of this evacuee.

He was of the opinion that a proper presentation of Mr. Murakami's case before the court under federal regulations would prevent further harassment of his interests. We feel that if left alone, this matter will work its way out to the best interest of all concerned.

If these or other forms are available and pertinent in a case of this kind, will you kindly send me a proper amount of them for use in this matter?

DEAR SIRs:

There has been issued the following regulation of March 18, 1942:

Code of Federal Regulations
Title 31 Money and Finance: Treasury
Chapter 1—Monetary Offices,
Department of the Treasury,
Part 130.

Special Regulation No. 1, Under Executive Order No. 8389, April 10, 1940, as Amended, and Section 5(b) of the Trading with the Enemy Act, as Amended by the First War Powers Act, 1941, Relating to Transactions in Special Blocked Property.*

By virtue of the authority vested in the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, Fiscal Agent of the United States, pursuant to Section 5(b) of the Trading with the Enemy Act as amended by the First War Powers Act, by virtue of the authority vested in such bank by the Commanding General of the Western Defense Command and Fourth Army, and by virtue of all other authority vested in such bank, the following special regulations are hereby prescribed:

- (1) The acquisition, disposition or transfer of, or other dealing in, or exercising any right, power, or privilege with respect to, any property hereafter designated as Special Blocked Property is prohibited except as authorized by license expressly referring to this regulation.
- (2) Applications for any such license may be filed on Form TFE-1 by any person with the nearest office of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. Such applications should set forth (a) the interest, if any, of the applicant in the property; (b) the details of the transaction for which a license is requested, including the terms of any proposed settlement; (c) the manner in which the interest of the evacuee national in the property is being protected; and (d) whether or not the evacuee national is in agreement with the proposed settlement.
- (3) As used in this special regulation and in any ruling, license, instruction, etc.:
 - (a) The term "evacuee national" shall mean any Japanese, German, or Italian alien, or any person of Japanese ancestry, resident on or since December 7, 1941 in Military Area No. 1 or in specified zones in other Military Areas prescribed in or pursuant to public proclamations issued by Lieutenant General J. L. DeWitt, Commanding General of the Western Defense Command and Fourth Army. For the purpose of this regulation all evacuee nationals are nationals of a foreign country.
 - (b) The term "Special Blocked Property" shall mean property in which an evacuee national has an interest and which has been designated as Special Blocked Property by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco in one or more of the following ways:
 - (i) There is posted on or reasonably near such property an official Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco notice that such property is Special Blocked Property.
 - (ii) The person holding such property or having possession or custody thereof has been

For your information the following statement to the press was released March 17, 1942.

"In order to protect Japanese and other evacuees, the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, as Fiscal Agent of the United States, today issued regulations designed to bring about equitable settlements between creditors and West Coast evacuees.

The new regulations are intended to forestall unfair action by unscrupulous creditors which would be detrimental to the interests of the evacuee and to minimize his losses in connection with the disposition of his property.

It is anticipated that this will be accomplished to a large extent by direct appeal to the creditors' sense of fair play and the obvious necessity for complete cooperation in the administration of the evacuation program.

'We want any Japanese or other evacuee who finds that he has difficulty in reaching an equitable settlement with his creditors to come to the nearest office of the Evacuee Property Department of the Federal Reserve Bank. At the bank we can discuss his case and take the necessary steps to protect the evacuee from unjust losses,' William A. Day, President of the Federal Reserve Bank, stated.

Bank officials warned that the initiative under the new regulations will rest with the evacuee. After the evacuee has attempted to make an equitable settlement with his creditors and has failed, he should go to the nearest office of the Evacuee Property Department of the Federal Reserve Bank and lay all the facts before one of its representatives.

The bank will call in the creditor and hear his side of the case and make every effort to bring about an amicable settlement of the matter. If the creditor is unreasonable and insists on taking unfair advantage of the evacuee, the Federal Reserve Bank may freeze the evacuee's property by designating it as Special Blocked Property.

Following this step the bank will either post a notice on or near the property of the evacuee, stating that the property described in the notice is Special Blocked Property, or will notify the person holding or having possession of the property, or persons having an interest in it, that such property is Special Blocked Property. Federal Reserve Bank officials stated that persons dealing with evacuees may assume that their property is not Special Blocked Property unless they are affirmatively on notice to the contrary.


After the property has been declared Special Blocked Property, any acquisition, disposition, or transfer of that property is subject to a license issued by the Federal Reserve Bank. Applications for such licenses may be filed with the nearest office of the bank.

Because the bank wishes to protect the evacuee not only in transactions involving real property but also in those involving all kinds of personal property, the regulations make it possible for any kind of property to be designated as Special Blocked Property.

By these broad provisions the regulations enable the bank to protect the evacuee in such typical transactions as conditional sales, instalment purchases, or any other type of dealing in any kind of property, if the evacuee will first undertake the simple step of petitioning the bank to declare his property Special Blocked Property.

The bank made clear that it will be on guard for any attempt on the part of evacuees to avoid the payment of reasonable creditors' claims through today's regulations."

Due to our evacuation orders issued by the Government from this locale we have leased our entire operations to North Star, Inc.

Our affairs will be looked after by Mr. W. W. Hamilton, Raymond, Washington, with Power of Attorney authorizing him to act in behalf of the Eagle Oyster Packing Co., Inc.

We have an account with you for \$73.50 still unpaid and in accordance to our payment schedule to our creditors from our accounts receivable and sale of oysters to the cannery we believe that we can take care of your account by July 20.

However, in the event that we are unable to do so from this season's revenue we are requesting yours, as well as those of other creditor's approval for extension of time on such unpaid balance until next season beginning October 1, 1942. You will be advised from time to time of all developments.

Under these circumstances we are confident that it is the desire of our creditors to give their full support in making it possible for the liquidation of our obligations this way and the continuance of our business.

On April 20th, this company was contacted to ascertain progress being made in completing arrangements for property disposal by lease to North Star, Inc., sea food brokers, Seattle, Washington. With but minor changes, provisions of lease as has been drawn is acceptable to Eagle Oyster Packing Company, Incorporated, as lessor and North Star, Incorporated as lessee. These minor changes will be made a portion of the lease, after which it will be presented to the Federal Reserve Bank for their approval.

As was previously reported, subject is operating under special permit granted by Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, which permit terminated April 15th. Application for renewal of permit was made prior to April 15th, but had not been granted and in possession of subject as of April 20th. However, the company informed the writer that contact by telephone had been made with Mr. Symms, Assistant Manager, Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, Seattle Branch, who informed them to continue operations awaiting renewal of special permit.

The company is making some headway in meeting their obligations and informed the writer that within a period of six weeks, with continued satisfactory operations, pressing obligations would be taken care of, thereby relieving financial strain. Should this program be accomplished, there will be no problem on which it will be the responsibility of the Federal Reserve Bank with which to deal.

Dear Sirs:

Reference is made to your letter of April 11, 1942 enclosing a form of agreement which has been entered into between Mr. Doupe, one of your Directors, and a Japanese American evacuee.

We have not followed the practice of passing upon agreement forms tendered us by persons dealing with evacuees, inasmuch as the evacuees are in position to make their own private arrangements regarding the disposition of their properties and any agreement in that connection which is satisfactory to the evacuee requires no action on our part. Up to the present time no properties have been accepted by us in behalf of evacuees, who have been encouraged to make their private arrangements for the handling of their affairs through persons and institutions of their own selection.

We have contemplated that in the event we find it necessary to accept agencies for such persons we will accept their powers of attorney, and have in fact prepared forms of powers of attorney for the convenience of evacuees and others who desire them for use in their own negotiations. We are enclosing a small supply of both individual and corporate forms with the thought that they may be of interest to you.

It occurs to us that while the agreement forwarded with your letter relates in some detail the relationship between the evacuee and Mr. Doupe, perhaps from the standpoint of third parties the authority of the agent to deal in the properties might be enlarged if the principal shares that belief. In other words, it has been our intention to accept rather broad powers of attorney, together with supplemental instructions from the evacuee involved delineating the duties of the agent. The agreement submitted would appear to fall in this latter class rather than itself constitute a power of attorney sufficiently broad to cover all contingencies which may arise in the operation of the property involved.





AGREEMENT

IT IS HEREBY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED by and between Rickard K. Murakami as owner and J. H. Doupe as agent, as follows:

1. That the owner hereby employs the agent to manage, supervise and oversee his cranberry lands and premises in Pacific County, Washington, described as follows:

A strip of land 440 feet wide off the east side of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 11 North Range 11 West of the Willamette Meridian. Also the full and free right and authority of the grantee and his assigns the use of a strip 40 feet wide off the North side of the South half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 27, in said township and range, to be used in common for a drainage ditch and road purposes. The said strip extending along the South side of the quarter section line from a point on said quarter section line 440 feet West of the Southeast corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, eastward and connecting with the water of Shoalwater Bay. It is expressly understood that the drainage ditch now located on said strip of land last herein described shall be maintained and kept in repair at pro rata expense of the land benefited.

Also:

Commencing at a point 465 feet west and 560 feet 3 inches south of the northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 11 North, Range 11 West of N.M.; thence running west 855 feet; thence south 759 feet 9 inches; then east 270 feet; thence north 544 feet 9 inches; thence east 585 feet; thence north 215 feet to the place of beginning, containing 7.60 acres, more or less, as to government survey;

Also right of way 25 feet wide for road and drainage ditch from said land to Shoalwater Bay; also a right of way 10 feet wide inside and along the south line running east and west to main road leading to Shoalwater Bay;

Reserving and easement ten feet wide from the southermost portion conveyed for crossing purposes.

Also:

Commencing at a point 465 feet west and $509\frac{1}{3}$ feet south of the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 11 North, Range 11 West of Willamette Meridian; thence running west 855 feet; thence south $50\frac{11}{12}$ feet; thence east 855 feet and thence north $50\frac{11}{12}$ feet to the place of beginning, containing one acre more or less, as to government survey.

Also right of way 25 feet for a road and drainage ditch from said land to Shoalwater Bay.

Also:

Commencing at a point 465 feet West and 254 feet 8 inches South of the Northeast corner of the Northwest quarter of Section 27, Township 11, North, Range 11 West of Willamette Meridian; thence running West 855 feet; thence South 254 feet 8 inches; thence East 855 feet and thence North 254 feet 8 inches to the place of beginning of metes and bounds according to the government survey thereof containing 5 acres more or less. Also a right of way for a road and drainage ditch from said land to Shoalwater Bay. The expense of maintaining said road and ditch must be shared by said grantees in proportion per acre to all other owners using said ditch and right of way.

2. The agent hereby agrees to supervise and manage the same in a good and workmanlike manner and to supervise all necessary care, cultivation, harvesting and sale of the cranberries growing and to be grown upon said premises, and to secure and pay for all labor, materials and supplies necessary for the proper management of said premises, and further agrees to keep said premises free and clear of all liens and encumbrances and to pay all taxes, liens or assessments against the same prior to maturity and to keep and maintain said premises in a good and workmanlike state of repair.

3. The agent agrees to harvest and sell the cranberries growing and to be grown upon said premises and to apply the proceeds thereof to the cost of labor, supplies and maintenance of said premises, and to keep a correct and accurate book of accounts of the expenses and income from said premises.

4. In consideration for said services, the owner agrees to pay the agent at the rate of 10 per cent per annum from the net profits on the first \$1000.00 and 5 per cent on the remainder of said operations.

5. This Agreement shall run for a period of one year and shall be automatically renewed thereafter from year to year during the existence of the present war, unless the same is mutually terminated by the parties hereto, at which time a true and proper accounting shall be made concerning this Agreement.

6. The net proceeds shall be applied to the reduction of the first and second mortgages upon said premises.

Dear Mr. Shaw:

Mr. Richard Murakami as Treasurer-Manager of the above corporation, incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington, will call at your offices the latter part of this week accompanied by Mr. Sentz who operates in Seattle, North Star Incorporated, sea food brokers.

I interviewed Mr. Murikami yesterday and find numerous complications which I will briefly enumerate below so that you will have somewhat of the picture prior to the visit of Mr. Murakami and Mr. Sentz.

This corporation is operating an oyster company who are growers of oysters which are processed through their opening plant for the fresh oyster market; likewise, they have entered into a contract with the North Star Incorporated for the supply of certain oysters on an identified bed which will be processed through a steam plant at Nahcotta and packed in cans.

The operation of this corporation is on rather a large scale involving substantial payroll and a considerable turn-over of money each month.

The corporation has heavy financial obligation of various natures, statement of which I have requested Mr. Murakami to have in his possession at the time he interviews your office.

The creditors are largely, if not entirely, White United States Citizens, who have supplied merchandise, materials, equipment, etc. in good faith to this corporation.

Mr. Sentz of the North Star Incorporated, sea food brokers, is negotiating with the Eagle Oyster Packing Company for

a lease of their entire property in order that he may obtain the specific oysters for which he made contract with them, and which are yet to be processed, and the continuation of the entire operation of the Eagle Oyster Packing Company as it has in the past been carried on.

Some of the creditors have already taken legal action against the corporation.

The permit under which they are operating and which was issued by the San Francisco office of the Federal Reserve System is dated March 16th and terminates at the expiration of thirty days. This terminating date does not give the corporation the time to perform the necessary work involved to get to market the oysters which are now marketable or to execute the contract with North Star Incorporated; neither does it grant a sufficient amount of dollars turn-over to permit the corporation to carry on their existing business.

In as much as Mr. Murakami is going to Seattle Thursday to contact Mr. Sentz and endeavor to consummate an equitable lease arrangement, I advised him to contact your office, together with Mr. Sentz, and be prepared to present to your office in the most clear and most definite manner possible, the picture of this operation in anticipation of the possibility of a license permitting them the necessary time and turn-over of funds to liquidate the marketable oysters and meet to the fullest extent possible their obligations.

If a permit is granted to this corporation which will give them the privilege of operating and if the approval by the Federal Reserve Bank is made of the lease arrangement which will probably be submitted to you by Mr. Murakami and Mr. Sentz, I believe that I can handle all other details that will be involved from our Raymond offices.




Dear Sir:

I beseech you to inform me what steps I should take to be able to obtain my property.

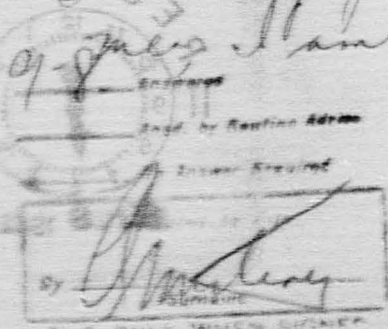

Reference is made to your letter dated November 5, 1942 inquiring as to the procedure in the settlement of a conditional sales contract on a Chevrolet Aero Sedan which was being purchased by the above named evacuee.


We received a letter from the Jones Chevrolet Company dated November 2, 1942, informing us that this vehicle was stored in Los Angeles and that they desired to make arrangements to sell the vehicle in order to liquidate the contract which was financed by your bank, remitting any equity to Mrs. Muramoto.

We informed the automobile dealers that Mrs. Muramoto would be in a position to enter into any agreement with them which she considered satisfactory in view of the fact that she is apparently an American citizen and not subject to Foreign Funds Control restrictions. It appeared from their letter that Mrs. Muramoto had authorized them to proceed with the sale of the vehicle.

In response to your inquiry, it would not be necessary to obtain any authorization from this bank to dispose of the vehicle. Your procedure would undoubtedly be to work out a private arrangement with the dealer concerned and the evacuee. So far as we are informed the fact of evacuation would have no effect upon the obligations of any evacuee, so that in the event a loss were sustained the terms of the contract would be controlling.

As the evacuee now resides in a War Relocation Project, according to the information provided by the Jones Chevrolet Company, any property problems relating to such an evacuee would come within the jurisdiction of the War Relocation Authority whose headquarters are in the Whitcomb Hotel Building, San Francisco, and which agency may be approached should any assistance be desired.

Reference is made to your letter dated November 2, 1942 relating to a desire on the part of Mrs. Mary Muramoto to dispose of her 1942 Chevrolet Aero Sedan, which is understood to be in private storage at Los Angeles, California.


Throughout the course of evacuation operations, the evacuees were, and continue to be, in a position to make private disposition of their properties on a basis satisfactory to themselves, subject to the necessity for obtaining a Treasury Department license with respect to transactions coming within the restrictions of Foreign Funds Control operations of the Treasury Department. Such restrictions do not appear to be involved in the case you mention, as you state Mrs. Muramoto is an American citizen and, therefore, entitled to enter into transactions relating to her property without regard to Foreign Funds Control licensing.

Mrs. Muramoto appears to be a resident of a War Relocation Project at the present time and, therefore, within the jurisdiction of the War Relocation Authority so far as her property problems may be concerned. The headquarters of that agency are in the Hotel Whitecomb Building, San Francisco.

You state that Mrs. Muramoto desires to sell the vehicle and, as stated, it would not be necessary to obtain the permission of this bank in disposing of it. No doubt Mrs. Muramoto will be in a position to provide you with the necessary authorization to take possession of the automobile.


It is my understanding that there is some doubt in your mind as to just what the balance on your account of \$13.80 covers. This morning, the local branch of the Federal Reserve Bank called me regarding this amount and asked me to write you a full explanation.

As I told two members of your family at the time they called at this office, we would allow them the amount of the resale value on the merchandise returned, and if it were possible for us to obtain more than the balance due on the account, we would return that amount to you, but if we found, after the merchandise was returned to our store, that the resale value was less than the balance due on the account, that we would expect you to pay this balance so that your obligations to our Company would be clear. This was in full accord with the members of your family, and they agreed that this was more than fair, and that they would be willing to handle it in that manner. It was also explained to them that the return of this merchandise was entirely voluntary on your part, and that if you did not desire to return such merchandise but wished to continue your monthly payments until the account was liquidated, that this arrangement would be entirely satisfactory to us. It was my understanding that you elected to return the merchandise, as you were unable to take it with you and you did not care to store it.

After this merchandise was brought into our store, we appraised it and found that we were able to resell it for a total price of \$53.56, leaving a balance of \$13.80 on your account.

It is felt by us and the local branch of the Federal Reserve Bank is in accord, that this is a just obligation and should be cleared by you.





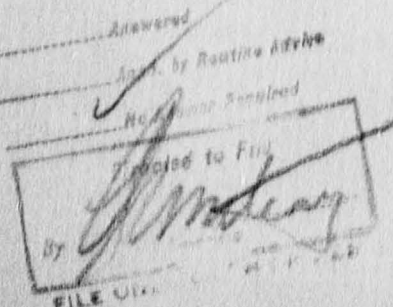

Referring to the problem under discussion at the center today with you, Mrs. Murano, and Mr. Frank Nishikawa, and which problem we understand to be essentially as follows:

You own a home at 228 South Monroe Street, Stockton, on a lot with additional improvements consisting of a barn and a garage. This property is under mortgage to the Hunter Square Branch of Bank of America in an amount of \$1700.00, and this bank has taken over the trusteeship of the property through an operating agreement entered into with you which includes the collection of a monthly rental of \$25.00 from your tenant, K. until further notice to the contrary, in writing, by the lessor.

And lessee covenants with lessor that at the expiration or sooner determination of the term of this lease, she will peacefully yield up the possession of the premises hereinabove described to the lessor, without further demand or notice, in as good order and condition as when the same were entered upon by the lessee, loss by fire and ordinary wear excepted.

The parties hereto further covenant, promise and agree as follows:

1. Lessee agrees that she has inspected any and all buildings upon the demised premises and the lessee accepts said buildings as they exist of the date hereof, and lessor agrees to keep said buildings on said premises in as good condition and repair during the term hereof as the same be now, lessee, however, agreeing to assume and pay for any and all damage to said premises caused by any act of a sub-tenant of said lessee, and the lessee herself, it being specifically understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the lessor shall be responsible only for the ordinary and necessary repairs required in the ordinary use and occupancy of said premises.
2. 3. Lessee agrees to keep said buildings free and clear of all fire hazards, lessor hereby agreeing to keep the said premises insured against loss by fire and lessor further agrees to pay any and all taxes upon said premises during the term hereof; lessee agreeing, however, that in the event the premises or any part thereof shall, during the term of this lease, be destroyed or damaged by fire or other unavoidable accident so as to render the

same unfit for use and habitation, lessor may, at his option, repair or cause to be repaired such damage, or these presents shall be determined and ended.

4. Lessee will promptly pay and discharge all bills and charges for telephone service, electric current, water, garbage, gas and any and all other service furnished upon said demised premises and that she will not permit any claim or lien for labor or material, any writ of attachment or execution, or other claim, lien or charge to become a lien or charge or to be levied against said demised premises during the term hereof and said lessee does hereby agree to save and hold the lessor harmless therefrom.

5. Lessor hereby accords lessee the right to sub-let the hereinabove described dwelling house and apartments or any portion thereof, but lessee shall not assign this lease without the written consent of the lessor first had and obtained, it being understood that the lessee shall, during the term of this lease, sub-let said apartments and dwelling house only to clean and reputable persons.

Lessee further agrees that she will not file a petition in bankruptcy or make any assignment for the benefit of creditors, or permit the leasehold herein to be or become an asset of any receivership in any Court, Federal or State, and in the event of such assignment, sub-lease or agreement, whether voluntary or involuntary, or by operation of law, this lease shall expire and terminate and the lessor and his representative shall be entitled to immediate possession and occupancy of the within premises.

6. Lessee shall not erect or construct buildings or other improvements or fixtures upon the demised premises without the written consent of the lessor first had and obtained, it being specifically covenanted and agreed that lessor shall not be called upon to make any alterations or improvements of any nature whatsoever on said leased premises during the term of this lease.

Should lessee on her part, after said written consent having been first had and obtained of the lessor, add to or affix improvements or fixtures to the leased premises, the same shall immediately become a part of the demised premises and the property of the lessor, and shall not in any wise be removed by the lessee.




We were informed by Togasaki that he has reduced his inventory to around \$10,000 from \$25,000 worth of goods which he took to Visalia in the first instance in leaving Military Area No. 1. In the interim he has purchased approximately \$15,000 in stock.

He contemplates continuing to do a limited business, buying in small quantities, and is endeavoring to make arrangements to go to Denver, Colorado, if he can obtain the permission of the W.C.C.A. for that purpose.

He intends appointing Mr. R. F. Cross, who is a Director of the Bank of America in Visalia and apparently a responsible member of the community, as agent of the Mutual Supply Co. under a general power of attorney to represent him after evacuation, so that someone will be on hand to represent the interests of the Mutual Supply Co. so far as the operation of the warehouse is concerned.

Togasaki was informed that a 30-day operating license in the amount of \$7,000 would be issued.



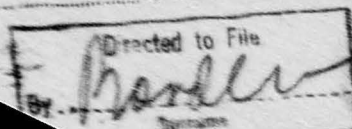
