- 3. What is the nature of the property you mention?
- 4. What is the amount of the indebtedness against your property; the original amount, balance owing and payment basis?
- 5. What is the amount of taxes against the property and their status.
- 6. Will you advise whether or not your family have contacted any NCCA office in either Military Area No. 1 or Military Area No. 2, and, if so, what office.
- 7. Has any provision been made for servicing the indebtedness against the property or the tax obligations?

If you will give us this information we will be pleased to respond as fully as possible to your inquiry. It may be said, however, that so far as the evacuation of persons of Japanese ancestry from Military area No. 1 and Military area No. 2 is concerned, no moratorium has been declared on any obligation of such persons, although perhaps as you suggest, the operation of the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief act may have some bearing on your own situation.

Subject: Insurance on Property of Japanese Evacuees

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter dated May 13, 1942 regarding the matter of insurance on the property of your client, Mr. Milton Nagata, and his family.

On numerous occasions we have placed before insurance companies in this city problems similar to your own, and have been assured by the companies that they have no general policy of refusing to write insurance on properties owned by Japanese. They have advised us that each case is treated on its individual merits and only where they feel that the risk is undesirable from a business standpoint have they refused to write insurance or have they cancelled insurance.

In the matter of the farm property you mentioned, it would appear that there may be reasonable grounds for the refusal of an insurance company to write insurance if, in fact, it appears that the risk occasioned by unoccupancy makes the business undesirable.

Undoubtedly you have the services of an insurance broker or insurance brokers who will be in a position to fully explore the possibility of placing insurance with various insurance companies, and it would seem that your approach to the problem should be along that line.

We are uncertain from the tenor of your letter whether you are endeavoring to obtain insurance on household goods of your client and his family placed in our care for storage. As you have already been informed, property of this character received by us is stored at owner's risk and not insured, although private insurance could be made if the owners could find an underwriter willing to accept the risks involved.



Gentlemen:

Subject: Insurance on evacuated property of Japanese

A client of mine, Milton Nagata, an American citizen of Japanese ancestry, and his family consisting of mother and father and two sisters, are being evacuated from their 20 acre farm today. This farm lies between the cities of Visalia and Tulare in Tulare County.

The family is removing a quantity of their personal belongings such as dishes, kitchen ware, and also household equipment consisting of refrigerator, vacuum cleaner and washing machine, and your agent at Tulare is causing these articles to be stored somewhere in a Government Warehouse. The agent informed the family however, that these items of property were stored in the warehouse at the risk of the owner.

I made an effort to obtain fire and theft insurance on this property through local agents but was advised by all of them that no insurance company wishes to carry any insurance on Japanese property.

The farm in question is being rented to a neighbor for purposes of care and cultivation but the buildings will remain unoccupied and the Bankers & Shippers Insurance Company of New York, who have heretofore carried the fire insurance risk, have cancelled the policy. They placed this cancellation upon the ground of unoccupancy, but it is my belief that it is further upon the ground that the property is owned by Japanese. The circumstances are that the neighbor will be on the property practically every day and have access to the house, consequently it is not exactly the same as though the property were left vacant and no one to look after it.

It seems to me that some insurance company should Ansd. accept these risks and that there is an obligation to these evacuated people to give them this protection.

It was a big surprise to me to see all the young peoples apply for job and quite a few of them were weiting on tables one hour after our arrival here. As to the pay, I don't know as yet but I understand carpenters and electricians get the top wages.

My client, Mrs. Minnie Crocker of Oakland, is the owner of certain real property located in the Town of Mt. Eden, Alameda County, California. A portion of this property has been occupied by what is known as the Eden Gakuen, which is a Japanese School Association.

The trustees for the School executed a lease with Mrs. Crocker covering this property, dated December 1, 1936, running for a period of ten years, at a monthly rental of \$15.00 per month. The lease provided that the Japanese School Association would erect a frame building to be used as a school house upon the premises and further provided that if default was made in the payment of the rentals called for under the terms of the lease, that the Lessors had the right to re-enter the premises, and the improvements consisting of this frame dwelling would be retained by the Lessors. The rental has not been paid for the month of June, 1942 and a letter has been written to Mr. F. Nakagawa, c/o P. O. Box 16, Mt. Eden, California, who has been acting on behalf of the School Association, informing him of the default in the payment of the rent and calling to his attention the forfeiture clause in the lease. During the period of time that the Japanese were being prepared for evacuation from the Hayward and Mt. Eden area, your Mr. Gibson contacted me on behalf of the School Association and at the request of Mr. Nakagawa.

Mrs. Crocker is not inclined to be arbitrary about the matter as she has had several Japanese tenants and they have in the main proved satisfactory, but she is desirous of having the matter brought to a definite understanding as quickly as possible, and in the interest of fair play has authorized me to propose that she will

accept a reduced rental of \$10.00 per month, maintaining the rights of the Association in their school property, and their not inconsiderable personal property which is stored therein, providing the Association will allow her to have the use of a small cottage which was originally on the property and used as a house by the school teacher.

She would be agreeable that this arrangement be substituted for the lease during the period of the Japanese evacuation, or the termination of the lease, whichever will be the shorter period of time.

If you are in a position to contact Mr. Makawaga or we also have the names of Shigeto Yamasaki, Tatsuto Furuta, and Kiyoshi Yamamoto who have appeared at one time or another as agents acting for the School Association, I believe if these people understand their position, that they will respond to this proposal and would appreciate any help that you can give us on this matter, and I am sure that it will be to the best interests of the Japanese involved as the improvements on the property are worth money to them.

The history of Nakagawa is as follows: The final payment was due November 15,1941. It was not made. Repeated efforts to collect proved unavailing. Sold on lease contract, purchaser lost rights on failure to perform. Not waiving our rights under the contract, we nevertheless gave him opportunity to refinance or payyoff; finally, when the trailer was brought into our place by him, we tried to sell it at a price that would return him something over and above the balance due. There were collection and selling expenses attendant.

We had opportunity to sell parts of the trailer. Having failed to find a buyer for the complete unit, we deemed it advisable to take advantage of such opportunity in order to first satisfy the obligation due us and also to attempt recovery for Nakagawa.

The efforts at disposal show the following condition:

Mr. Henry Makahara called at this office seeking information and help relative to the following matter.

Mr. Nakahara made a hurried arrangement relative to two acres of straws berries with the owner of Jacks Brecking Shop. Gilroy. It was agreed, so Mr. Makahara says, that Mr. Nakahara was to receive \$50.00 per acre or a total of \$100.00 for his berry patch. This money was to have been paid as soon as the consent to the subleasing was given by Mr. Horace Wikson, the landowner. Mr. Nakahara then went with "Jack" to Jack's attorney and there signed a lease arrangement, but was not himself given a copy of the lease.

Mr. Makahara received a verbal consent from Mr. Wilson to the subleasing. The attorney for Jack was Mr. Sydney Johanen. Gilroy.

A month has now passed and Mr. Nakahara has received nothing from Jack. A letter to Mr. Wilson written by Mr. Nakahara received the written reply from Mr. Wilson that he had assured "Jack" that the subleasing was agreeable to him. No money has been received. I am told by Mr. Nakahara that the San Jose W. C. C. A. office is the center for Gilroy. A letter or phone call to "Jack's Wrecking Shop" Gilroy from your office night clarify the matter.

K. T. Oregg Field Representative Marysville Mr. Weeks, our former Stockton field representative, has referred to us your letter dated October 19, 1942 relating to the disposition of five automobile tires. Our Stockton field office has been closed and all correspondence relating to problems involving this particular area are handled in this office.

We have explored the problem and it appears to be rather confused.

We understand that you left five tires with the Lodi Recap Company for recapping and that Mr. Garcia obtained five tires from that concern which were represented as being the tires you left with them on a certificate issued by the local rationing board. Some confusion appears to have resulted from the fact that you appear to have promised Mesers. Craven and Miranda, as well as Garcia, the same tires.

Mr. Garcia informs us that within three weeks after delivery of the tires to him, three of them blew out and were returned by him to the Lodi Recap Company as defective recaps. It further appears that of the five tires delivered to him, which were four-ply, two were Ford, one Goodyear, one Dunlop and one U. S. Royal; whereas three of the tires you left were six-ply, U. S. Royal.

In view of the fact that you are a resident of a relocation area with the result that your property problems come within the jurisdiction of the assistance rendered by the War Relocation Authority rather than by this bank, we have refrained from pursuing the matter further, particularly as the conflicting promises which we understand have been made by you may have been responsible for some of the confusion.

Mr. Ichiro Nakahara - 2 -November 3, 1942 Rohwer, Arkansas It is our thought that if you feel the value of the tires involved warrants such action and that your arrangement was such as would entitle you to payment for the tires, your procedure would be to take the problem up with the legal aid representatives of your Project and enlist the services of the War Relocation Authority in solving the matter. The facts before us do not disclose a basis for requesting the payment to you by Mr. Garcia of any specific sum. If you submit the matter to the War Relocation Authority we would suggest that you give them a full factual statement, and that you mention that our files contain some information on the matter which we will be pleased to communicate to that agency on request. Dear Mr. Everson:

In replying now to your letter of October 27 re Ichiro Nakahara I wish to reassure you that it will be a pleasure to have you call upon me at any time. It is all in the line of duty, official or otherwise.

If the true answer to the question of what became of the identical tires which Nakahara delivered to the Lodi Recap Company is to be known, I am inclined to believe that an official investigation of the case will be necessary.

Not having retained written memoranda of the various requests made of us by Nakahara, I recall his story as follows: He had left three U.S. six ply tires (two of which were white side wall) and two four ply tires of another make with Lodi Recap Company for recapping. He was quite positive about this. However, he was not so positive about having been consistent in his arrangements for the disposal of these tires.

Nakahara stated that he had lost his mother while making hurried preparations for the evacuation, that he was in much distress at the time, and that conflicting promises may have been made regarding the tires. He delivered his automobile to Isaac Craven, his light truck to Alfred Miranda, and sold his pick-up to J. Garcia, whose address is 517 South Sierra Nevada Street, Stockton. He expressed a desire to have Mr. Craven take delivery of the above tires. Evidently he made like promises to both Garcia and Miranda. When the Lodi Recap Company reported delivery of all five tires to Garcia as far back as last June on a regular rationing order, the question was still further confused by conjecture as to what evidence of title to the tires was presented to the Board by Garcia which would warrant the issuance of such a delivery order.

I have talked to Garcia on the telephone. He states that he secured the above delivery order without presenting any document signed by Nakahara as proof that the tires had been either sold or given to him. He states further that all five tires delivered to him were four ply, and that two were Ford, one Goodyear, one Dunlop, and one U.S. Royal. Within three weeks after delivery three of these tires blew out and he returned them as defective recaps, which accounts, he says, for his inability to deliver three of the tires to Miranda, as requested by Nakahara.

This indicates that all the truth may not yet be known with respect to possible "switching" of the original tires to other channels. This is why I believe that some one in authority should make a further investigation the theorements submitted up to this time are conflicting.

While, as stated to you during your recent call, we wish to avoid bothering you with respect to evacuees problems, we are semewhat at a loss as to how to proceed with Mr. Makahara's problem regarding the disposal of the five tires without additional data.

It appears that Makahara disposed of a truck and left five tires with the Lodi Recap Company, Lodi, for recapping, after having informed Mr. Garcia he could have two of the tires and the balance were to go to an A. Miranda, possibly through the services of Mr. Isaac Craven of Walnut Grove.

Your letter to Makahara dated October 10, 1942 indicates that the five tires were recapped before the freezing order became effective covering recapped tires and thereafter in June, Garcia took delivery of all five tires on a Ration Board order. Mr. Makahara is now concerned about the fact that all of the tires were taken by Garcia and further, that he has not been paid for three of the five tires.

We have no information as to Mr. Garcia's residence and while, if the matter is a complicated one, we would submit it to the War Relocation Authority, we are wondering if you could contact Mr. Garcia and obtain additional information from him which would help in the quick solution of the problem. He can, no doubt, explain why or how he was able to obtain the five tires and no doubt he would be willing to effect some sort of payment to the evacuee.

Of course, we must bear in mind that the property which was the subject matter of the transaction is now subject to O.P.A. restrictions, and that Makahara may not have been able, therefore, to direct the resale of the tires. It may be that the quality of the property before recapping was such that it had little value.

If you could give us a little more information on the transaction we would appreciate it.

Ring Island Ranch of the California Delta Farms Company, for an amount of \$2019.73, the sale being evidenced by a written agreement and inventory, the balance still outstanding on this agreement now being \$2419.73.

The agreement in question is weak at one point in that it does not provide for definite intervening payments to be made before the remaining balance falls due in two years. Mr. webster states that he will be glad to assist you in any way that he can in the collection of the account, but he does not feel certain of being able to accomplish collection. Dear Mr. Van LobenSels:

It is about 2½ months since I left Salinas and I am now located at the Tule Lake Relocation Center, Newell, Calif. I was rather sure that I didn't have to bother you any more, but I'd like to ask you some more favors. I hate to ask you to do so much because I have asked a lot of favors in the past while in Salinas.

I really don't know whether it would do any good or not to tell you I have not as yet received my W.C.C.A. wage for the month of June (\$16.00). Little as it is I really need it because I must have money to buy clothes for the winter months. The W. R. A. has not piad me a cent yet. I am suppose to get \$19.00 per month. No family allowances have been released yet in this camp. Our clothes are gradually wearing out and when a family of 10 persons, need clothes it requires lots of money these days. It is getting rather cold now days. Every morning we see frost. On top of this last week the S. S. White Dental Supply Co. turned her book over to the Calif. credit concern to collect my debt. I have really very little money to depend on now, and it will be worse when I get out of this camp after the war. What am I to do with only the small amount in the reserve with no income as yet. If I were in active practice I would pay the bills I owe, but now no income of any kind and the money just goes one way. Could you in any way help me out by arranging some agreement to the effect that they charge me interest which I would pay during the duration and if when I am able to meet the payment I would do so the first chance I get?

Thank a million for your kind efforts. I should appreciate it very much if you would send a reply at your earliest convenience.

I have paid up about ½ of what I had to pay and I hate to lose all that hard earned money. My present condition is not my voluntary doings and is not deliberate. So there should be some way to keep them from repossessing my equipments. Could you in any way advise or help me out?

I shall appreciate it very much. My present status as to the earning ability is very small and will not be able to do much in the way of making payments so if you could help me out in some way ishall really appreciate it. Thank you again for your kind efforts.

Principal property involved and scope of problem: Dr. Nakahara recently graduated from Calif. U. as a dentist and started business here about a year and a half ago, buying some equipment from the Edwards Dental Supply Co. of S. F. through the San Jose office. He owes about \$1,100 balance on equipment which cost him about \$2,200. It will be impossible for him to continue the regular payments of \$60 per mo., at least for a time. He has asked the bank and the dental company to adjust the payments or postpone them for a period. They proposed that he pay \$500 cash and they would suspend payments for 2 years or that he meet a reduced monthly payment of \$40 regularly. Neither of these propositions appears to be feasible under these circumstances.

Action taken: * Advised Nakahara to again contact the equipment co. and explain his predicament and his financial situation and ask them if they could not be a little more lenient; in view of the fact that they would have control of the equipment could they not waive 2 or 3 payments and then make the payments about \$25 per mo. which the Dr. thought he could meet. He will try this out and report back.



My family number is 24279. The property was located at 208 Palm St. Balboa, Calif. In a letter received from your office, it stated that the property was now stored in long Beach.

The articles I should like most are: unpainted chest of drawers, two cartons of clothes marked No. 4 and 6, cartons numbered #1, 2, 3, 5, 7,8, 9, 10 and 11 in the order mentioned. If you think you can send the remainder I would appreciate it very much. Please, you'll try very hard? Thank you very much for your trouble.

MEMORANDUM TO: WAR RELOCATION AUTHORITY

SUB-ECT: Division of Evacues Property

Attention: Mr. Victor Furth, Assistant Chief

Beforence is made to our past conversations concerning certain evacuess from the Centerville, California, area and their dealings with Mr. W. B. Williams.

According to our records, Mr. Williams had dealings with numerous evacues who were for the most part truck gardeners or ranch operators.

Among these were Mr. and Mrs. S. Motozaki, Mr. B. Yukawa, George Makamara and Mrs. Kimiyo Asakawa.

It appears that in every case which has come to our attention, the sale or lease papers were drawn up by Judge Allen G. Norris of Centerville, who acted as counsel for both the Japanese as seller and Williams as buyer. We were informed that there were additional transactions with parties other than those mentioned above, which we assume were completed without difficulty as no one other than the above approached us.

Apparently Mr. Williams is an extremely busy man as we found it difficult to contact him either by letter, telephone or messenger. During the course of the summer months mumerous appointments were made at Tanforan with him in order to arrange a meeting for settlement of the problems. These appointments were not kept by Mr. Williams on two occasions and we ultimately found it necessary to call Judge Norris and use forceful language in order to obtain Williams' presence at a meeting.

At this meeting, which was held the latter part of July, 1942, Mr. Williams agreed to settle the balance owing the Motozaki family, amounting to approximately \$660. Additionally, in the presence of our representative, Mr. Borden, he agreed to resit the agreed sum of \$250 to George Makasura. Mr. Yukawa and Mrs. Asakawa were both contacted and agreements reached that same day.

Subsequent to this meeting, further delay was encountered, necessitating additional pressure through Judge Norris. However, on September 8, 1982 we received a copy of a letter from Judge Norris to Mrs. Motozaki indicating that transmittal of the balance had been completed, which is corroborated by a letter from Mrs. Motozaki to the Federal Reserve Bank dated September 9, 1942 thanking us for our assistance.

This, according to our records, completes all dealings involving Mr. Williams, except that with George Makasara.

During the evacuation program we were of some assistance to Makamura in the cancellation of a conditional sales contract on his automobile, wherein certain objectionable phraseology was deleted from the contract when a sale was negotiated for his equity. No official assistance was rendered by us in convection with the assignment of his crops or ranch property, which leads us to believe that if any advice was given him it issued in all probability from the Farm Security Administration representative in the Wartime Civil Control Administration office in Hayward, California.

On July 10, 1942 we received a letter from Makamura stating that he had received nothing from Mr. Williams although the sale agreement to which he referred called for immediate payment of a total of \$250.

On July 14, 1942 our Tanforan representative interviewed him and ascertained that Williams had purchased a crop of loganberries, lettuce and strawberries, located on the Dusterberry ranch, southwest of Centerville. Mr. Nakamura displayed a copy of a signed sale agreement between himself and Williams dated May 8, 1942 covering the above transaction and calling for a settlement of \$250.

On July 15, 1942 we addressed a letter to the Farm Security Administration regional director, Mr. Laurence I. Heres, reviewing this transaction and calling his attention to this apparent difficulty. Our closing paragraph stated that ". . . in view of the nature of this problem and in view of Nakamura's statement that Mr. McDonald, former Farm Security Administration representative at Hayward, had been familiar with the transaction, we felt that it was a matter for his exploration . . . " Subsequently, additional interviews with Mr. Nakamura at Tanforan were held and he attended the meeting above referred to, arranged with Mr. Williams during the latter part of July. As mentioned above, verbal assurance was given by Mr. Williams that payment in full would be made.

On August 6, 1942, however, another letter was received from Mr. Makamura stating that as yet no settlement had been received nor had he heard from Williams.

We have advised Makamura verbally through our Tanforan representative that everything was being done to secure a settlement.

For your information, Judge Norris professed ignorance of this particular transaction. According to both Williams and Nakamura the sale agreement was drawn up by Williams at Nakamura's home upon telephonic approval from Judge Norris.

In view of the fact that Makagura has contacted you, together with his isminent removal to a Mar Melocation Project, we feel that you will undoubtedly wish to review this case and possibly take any action you deem advisable.

Yust, your representative at the San Francisco office, whereupon he wired your office for a settlement of the refund, to which we understand no answer has yet been given.

This bank has been charged with the duty of assisting evacuees in making equitable disposition of their property affairs in connection with the evacuation of individuals from the recently designated Military Areas on the Pacific Coast. We shall appreciate your cooperation in the prompt disposition of this matter.

Gee, its unbelievable, but we've been here a week already. I'm still not used to the Japanese people and it certainly seems like a nightmare. I know very little of their language, and that's where my trouble comes in.

Mr. Conway, what did they do with our trunk? Did they send it to Portland for storage until we get relocated? You see, this is our permanent place - at least for the duration, and so we would like to have it sent to us as soon as possible. We really should have brought it with us, but we were afraid we had too much. We didn't, though, because we had the least luggage of all. Some of them even brought sewing machines and linoleums. I surely wish we could have brought it with us.

I'm looking forward to the time when we could go home again to our farm. I miss Chehalis very much.

At the present I am working as a waitress in the mess hall. It's quite easy work. I write more next time, but I think I better close now. I have to go to the kitchen.

Could you tell me what I should do about the trunk, please? Goodbye.

We are informed that repeated attempts have been made by the Nakamuras to obtain this refund of \$50.00, and several letters have been written by the local office to your office with no response. On April 13 this office again took the matter up with Mr. R. J. Yust, your representative at the San Francisco office, whereupon he wired your office for a settlement of the refund, to which we understand no answer has yet been given.

This bank has been charged with the duty of assisting evacuees in making equitable disposition of their property affairs in connection with the evacuation of individuals from the recently designated Military Areas on the Pacific Coast. We shall appreciate your cooperation in the prompt disposition of this matter.



We are glad to advise herewith the details of the transaction wherein we purchased a Plymouth Sedap, serial #3247463 from Mr. Sam Nakamura.

The transaction came about in this way:--

On November 16, 1942 at approximately 1:30 p.m. the local manager for the Commercial Credit Company telephoned me from his office, saying that some Japanese people from Los Angeles were desirous of selling their car, to which we replied that we would be glad to look their car over and made them an offer commensurate with its actual value.

(We have been the leading account in Sacramento for the Commercial Credit Company for sometime and they, therefore, request us to make bids on cars that they have for sale, and have done so for the past four or five years. Although we are new car distributors we have conducted a very large business for the past five years in buying and selling used cars.)

Sometime later in the afternoon the Japanese came to our place of business offering their car for sale. During the conversation, I asked them how much they wanted for their car, they indicated that they expected to get about \$100 for their equity, but they stated they did not know how much they owed, although they had just arrived from the Commercial Credit Company.

I looked their car over and in conversation indicated

that it might be worth about \$400 in its present condition, I would pay the difference between that and the amount they owed in that, we would have to spend approximately \$50 to put the car in saleable condition. Had it been in saleable condition we would possibly give them \$450. They indicated that this would be alright, consequently I agreed to wire the office of Commercial Gredit Company at Los Angeles where they made their original loan for the net payoff, which was all I could do that day and they would have to come back the following day to complete the transaction.

They took the car with them and returned the next day asking if I had heard from the wire to Los Angeles. They then waited for the reply which eventually arrived, stating they had a payoff of \$295.65. Thereon, I offered to give them the indicated \$100 which they said they wanted for their equity, plus any rebate that was secured from their Insurance. This they readily agreed they would do. In accordance with our usual procedure the legal papers were signed and I took them to the Motor Vehicle Department of the State to assure us clearance on the Title. The entire transaction was then complete and they received their \$100 and were told that we would send them the Insurance rebate above mentioned, if they would leave their address. They were unable to do this, at that time, so I gave them my personal card and asked that as soon as possible they send me their address that we might send them their Insurance rebate, which was later received in the amount of \$22.72.

We are still waiting for their address and have their \$22.72.

This brings the transaction up to date.

Since we were questioned by the Federal Reserve Bank about this deal, we have checked with the local manager of Commercial Credit Company who tells us that they originally appeared in his office requesting that they be given permission to take their car out of the State. He agreed to wire for said permission which was refused. They then asked where they could sell this automobile and he consequently referred them to us as stated above. Later it developed that they had stopped in at various Commerical Credit offices on their way up from Los Angeles and repeated the same procedure. This information they did not reveal to the local office, causing them the necessary expense of wires, time, etc.

It is quite apparent that these people on their way up

from Los Angeles were endeavoring both to get permission to take their car out of the State and to sell it for the best possible price. Apparently our offer was the best they had received.

Evidence that our offer was ample for the car in its conditions is shown by the fact that even thought reconditioned the car is still in our place and we have not been able to sell it up to this time.

The following is a brief summary regarding the Nakamura family.

Mr. Nakamura, wife Mary and two minor children were first seen at this agency 3/19/42. They were enroute to Caldwell, Idaho in search of employment. Arriving in Sacramento they were short of funds and found it necessary to sell an automobile. (This case was referred to the Federal Reserve Bank for clearance regarding problem of finances.)

This case has presented a difficult problem as Mr. Nakamura has shown extreme fears and has been confused and shows evidence of mental disturbances. He continually referred to to the fact that he had been cheated by the Lester Motors Company.

As his mental instability became more obvious his wife was encouraged to seek medical advice. He was examined by Dr. Tki on three different occasions and finally on April 15, 1942 Dr. Iki advised his wife to start committment proceedings. Man was committed to the Sacramento County Hospital 4/15/42 for a five day observation on charge of insanity.

Since being admitted to the hospital Mr. Nakamura has presented a difficult problem. Mrs. Reedy, Social Worker, has telephoned and advised this agency that immediate committment is necessary. He has become violent and attempted to attack one of the nurses in the ward.

The problem presented at this time is Mr. Nakamura's family. Assets consist of a 1931 Ford truck and \$35 in cash. It will be necessary for the Public Assistance Division to supply financial aid pending evacuation orders.

Acknowledging receipt of report on Sacramento Case
No. 89 dealing with the affairs of Sam Yasuhiko Nakamura, specifically involving the sale of a 1940 Plymouth Sedan to Lester
Motors, Ltd., 1301 "K" Street, Sacramento, on which a balance
of \$295.65 was due to the Commercial Credit Corporation, Los
Angeles, California, we have carefully reviewed the information
contained in this report.

We are enclosing copy of a memorandum prepared by
Mr. Tyler, which, of course, is for your confidential information only. It outlines quite clearly our interpretation of your report and the easential differences that exist between Mr.
Nakamura and Lester Motors, Ltd. You will note that Lester Motors, Ltd. have actually paid, according to your report, the sum of \$395.65, \$100 of which was paid to Mr. Nakamura only, the remainder having been paid, we assume, to the Commercial Credit Comporation of Los Angeles in retirement of indebtedness due them.

In contrast with this total sum you will note the advice we received from the James F. Waters Company, Plymouth dealers in San Francisco, as to the blue book value and current market for a 1940 Plymouth Sedan.

Aside from the definite misunderstanding that appears to exist between Mr. Nakamura and the buyer as to the price that was to be paid, it would appear to us that Lester Motors, Ltd., might quite fairly pay to Mr. Nakamura some mutually agreed further sum representing the difference between \$395.65 actually paid in cash to Mr. Nakamura and to the holder of the liem, and the value of the cas as stated by James F. Waters Company of \$550 (slightly less than the blue book value).

After you have carefully noted Mr. Tyler's analysis and the apparent unconventional manner in which the transaction was concluded between Letter Motors, Ltd. and Mr. Nakamura, we would suggest that you have a conference with the head of Letter Motors, Ltd. You should at the outset of such meeting secure from them a clean out statement of their handling of the transaction, being careful not to divulge any of the information you have received either from Mr. Nakamura or from the memorandum enclosed.

Page Two Mr. Albert J. Reid April 8, 1942

After carefully recording their understanding of the transaction and how they reached their decision as to fairness of price paid, you might then tactfully indicate that the price they paid was substantially under the existing present market, without, of course, disclosing the source of such market information.

We wish to emphasize that it may be difficult for us from a single report to determine the full facts in the case and to know what action to recommend that would be fair to the parties interested.

After you have held the above suggested conference, we would suggest you advise us fully, indicating as well your opinion of the action that should be finally taken.

MEMORANDUM

Report on Sacramento Case No. 89, dated March 26, 1942, received on Monday, April 6 and recorded as Saturday, April 4, business.

Have reviewed the above report which appears to consist of a misunderstanding of price to be paid Nakamura by Lester Motors, Ltd., 1301 K Street, Sacramento, for a 1940 Plymouth sedan on which there is owing \$295.65 to the Commercial Credit Corporation, Los Angeles.

Nekamura apparently understood that he was selling the car for a total sum of approximately \$745.65, comprising a payment to himself of \$450.00 and Lester Motors, Ltd. paying off the obligation of \$295.65 due the Commercial Credit Corporation of Los Angeles. It is indicated from the report that Lester Motors, Ltd. were buying the car for a gross sum of approximately \$450.00 out of which they were to pay the sum of \$295.65 to the creditor with a balance of approximately \$150.00 to be paid to Nakamura on which they paid down \$100.00, indicating they would send him the balance of \$50.00 plus the unearned premium on insurance. The essential difference between the two viewpoints is approximately \$300.00. Lester Motors, Ltd. now indicate since having paid the sum of \$100.00 they owe him no further balance other than the unearned premium on insurance which might signify that they are endeavoring to buy the car for around \$400.00.

One of the questionable aspects of this situation, assuming the accuracy of the report, is the fact that Lester Motors, Ltd. gave Nakamura no papers or receipts of any kind at the time the transaction was concluded and the payment on account of \$100.00. This might denote gross carelessness or an attempt to conceal the nature of their transaction in dealing with an evacuee. Attached hereto are merely copies of documents purported to have been signed by Nakamura, not duplicate signed copies, which a transaction of this nature customarily requires to be delivered to the seller.

Apparently Makamura's family is hard pressed for money inasmuch as their case is one before the Social Security agency and in charge of Miss Thayer of the Social Welfare Department. Before attempting to find an equitable solution, I requested Mr. Jackson to phone one of the San Francisco Plymouth agencies and find out the approximate present price status and market for a 1940 Plymouth sedan. The James F. Waters Company stated to Mr. Jackson over the telephone as follows:







The deal between Driscoll, Tholcke and these renters, as reported by the F.S.A. is not yet settled and there is nothing to indicate its immediate completion. There are a good many small holdings there that are quite a problem singly or all together.

Action taken: Advised Nakano to sell car if possible and to report transaction here if and when completed. Every effort is being made to help these small leaseholders get some kind of a settlement. Mr. Nakano states this morning that all cases coming to his attention have been satisfactorily settle dna d as far as I know attention—have—been—sat at the present time we have only two cases that are pending.

1 - The TOYOKO ITO case was taken up with the San Francisco office on March 25, 1942, copy of my inquiry enclosed together with a copy of your letter answering and in addition a copy of a report dated 4/17/42.

I have exhausted all efforts to get the GENERAL MOTORS CORPORATION to accept her payments. Their answer in all particulars being no.

2 - JIMMIE SHINTIKA, Rt 6 Box 194, Fowler, California, stated to us on April 17 that he wished to retain his ice box, the purchase price of which was \$225.00. Mr Shintika also states that he paid \$68.00 on account to the C I T CORPORATION and that they have demanded full payment on the ice box.

In checking this case today the C I T Corporation states that Mr. Shintika has not appeared to make his payment.

Please be advised that I believe that some untruth has been stated in some of these cases by both parties concerned.

Gentlemen:

Enclosed you will please find a notice for payment from the CIT Corporation. They have been asking for payment time and time again, and I have referred them to Mr. A. J. Reid, your field representative in Sacramento, many times. But it seems that no satisfactory solution to the problem has been found.

As you probably know, I have had no source of income whatsoever this year because I was evacuated to an Evacuation Center, before I had any time to realize any returns from my farm crop this year. In fact, I was forced to leave my home just at the time my crops were about to be harvested. About \$7,000.00 worth of strawberries were left rotting out in the field, and not even the Federal Farm Agency was able to help me out. So my 1942 crop was a total loss.

The loss of the crops were not the only loss I have suffered. Many of my personal property had to be sold, so that I could buy a few necessities that were absolutely essential preparatory to my evacuation, such as hand bags, blankets, clothing, etc.

At this time I am not in a position to pay this bill. So I would like your help and suggestions as to what course I may take, because I do not wish to lose my home after working hard all these years trying to make it my own. Here in camp I have no income except the \$19.00 per month cash advance given to me in my work as a Senior Clerk for the War Relocation Authority. With this amount I have to do the best I can in buying clothing, shoes, toothpastes, and other necessities for myself and the other members of the family.

Dear Mr. Reid:

I have for acknowledgement both your letters of April 16 and April 21st. For the past 10 days I have tried to sell my Oldsmobile, and had it advertised in both the Union and the Bee.

However, with the used car market loaded with unwanted cars, and with the rest of the evacuees trying to sell their cars also, I haven't been able to find any prospective buyer for my car.

My car is an Olds 1940 4-door touring sedan, and I have already spent \$1100.00 on paying for it. I still have\$485.00 yet to pay, and this is due on May 27th.

So the car in all will cost me around \$1500.00 or \$1600.00. The condition of the car is excellent, and I had intended to keep it for another six or seven years.

BUT THE BYTERS AT THIS TIME ARE UNWILLING TO GIVE ME MORE THAN \$675.00. And I am very reluctant to sell it at that price, because the loss is too great. Sacramento representative came to see evacuee at request of San Jose as to plans for future payments or disposition of car. Owner stated she wished to sell but had no buyer at that time. C.I.T. offered to sell it and took signed agreement to sell and deduct amount owing from sales price. Agreement in writing did not state he would pay them anything over amount due, but they claim he stated that verbally. Evacuee drove car to Sacramento where agent left his car on street and drove evacuee back to her home where she signed agreement. Claim made that Sacramento C.I.T. man stated they would leave almost any day.

Several days after relinquishing car to C.I.T., owner's brother-in-law in San Jose came to evacuee's home as he had buyer in San Jose for \$950.00'. Evacuee gave brother-in-law order on Sacramento office for car, who refused, claiming car was stored in Garden City Garage in San Jose. On returning to San Jose, they discovered that car was supposed to be sold by C.I.T. to a man named Wolf for \$1095.00.







We have heretofore received latters from the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco dated August 22nd, 1942 and September 19th, 1942, of which you have copies. In answer to these letters we are directing this correspondence to you.

As we stated in our letter of August Sth. 1942, we will pay you \$50.00 for a deed in lieu of foreclosure, which sum is the approximate amount of the foreclosure proceedings of the trust deed covered by our above numbered loss. As stated in our letter of August 8th, 1942, it has become necessary to make many repairs on the property because of the condition in which you lest the premises. Since so made said offer of \$50.00 in our letter of August 8th, 1942, we have been advised that upon your leaving the property you did not pay your closing water bill for the quarter year in the sum of \$21.00, which it has been necessary for us to advance. We have been advised that in nearly every case all Japanese evacuees from this district have paid their utility bills in full for the time they occupied the property.

It has also become mecessary since we wrote our letter of August Sth. 1942 to spend approximately \$33.00 for plumbing repairs necessitated by the condition in which you lest the property, in addition to other repairs and cleaning charges that we outlined in our previous letter.

In light of the above figures, we do not believe that it can be expected that we should pay more than a nominal sum for a seed in lieu of foreclosure in connection with our above numbered loan, even though we have been required to pay the necessary expenses that we had not looked for when we made our original effer of \$50.00 for a deed in lieu of foreclosure, we will renew said offer.

> We trust that the above offer of \$50.00 will meet with your approval and that you will so advise the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco in order that this transaction may be consumented as soon as possible in order to clear the files of the Federal Reserve Bank in the matter. ENVONEE



Please note following which is taken from our initial report of 4/21: "Finding that they were dealing contrary to law governing sale of 1942 automobiles, they applied to this Office."

We repeat above notation so as to keep this Office in the clear in the matter. The 1942 Plymouth was bought from Nakata by J. W. Smith, 1139 S. Pilgrim St., through the efforts of Ivers Truck Company.

Efforts put forth by this Office to get the sale approved have failed. In the meantime, buyer claims that seller has converted the \$1,000 paid for the car into Defense Bonds. The deal was made even before they applied to this Office.

As stated above, the only thing that we can tell these people is that they will have to take such steps as may be open to them to have their deal killed.
