We believe that the agency to approach with respect to the question of possibly returning to California for agricultural work would be the War Relocation Authority and no doubt any inquiry in this regard should be referred to the manager of your Relocation Center. The headquarters of that agency are located in the Notel Whitcomb Building, San Francisco, should you care to communicate with them direct.

We might say in passing that we know of no case where an evacue has been permitted to return to the prohibited military area established on the Coast and there is a question as to what degree of exocess you would have in seeking such permission.

FAR SAVINGS SOME

F. E. Dayton, Executive Chairman of the Salinas War Bond Committee announced that he distributed questionnaires regarding the Payroll deduction plan for War Savings Bonds to 424 business firms in Salinas, and only 70 were filled out and returned.

Of the 70 returned, 42 reported that the payroll deduction plan was in operation in their business - 20 stated that it was not, and 8 did not check either way. 29 firms reported that they had 100% of their employees on a payroll deduction plan and 25 stated that this deduction emounted to 10% or more of their gross payroll.

GUAYULE RUBBER COMES INTO ITS OWN

The approval of a 10,000 seed bed nursery at Indic and one at Oceanside of the same size; an 11,000 seed bed nursery in the San Joaquin or Secremento Valleys and the 12,000 seed bed nursery at Selinas, assures at least 40,000 tons of guayule rubber the Fall of 1944, and possibly a great deal more than that. The Bureau of Plant Industry under Dr. Hildreth is achieving phenomenal results in its experiments for shortoning growing periods, fighting diseases, cross-pollination, etc.

An interesting angle however, is that there seems to be a campaign on, in stories out of Washington, D.C., to build up the Japanese stating that they are doing all the work of developing gnayule, propusably with the idea so that they will have a case to demand that they be returned to California after the duration. The truth is that a few seedlings were taken to Manzanar and to Parker Dam but as far as we are able to learn, they have actually done very little with them.





As a matter of record I am writing to confirm my telephone conversation of this afternoon with one of your executives.

I explained to him that we have for some years used the part-time services of a Japanese gardener named Victor Kai who has now been evacuated. Before leaving he asked Mrs. Cochran if he might leave with us his washing machine and garden tools. She agreed to keep them and he delivered his washing machine and two boxes (which I presume contain garden tools) to our home at 88 Sycamore Avenue, San Mateo.

It is my understanding that after he is settled somewhere he might write and ask that we ship these boxes to him.

We are not at all inconvenienced in this matter and will be very happy to keep the washing machine and boxes and ship them, if requested, provided it is proper that we do so.

I feel that you or someone should tell me whether or not we are doing the right thing in keeping the boxes and possibly shipping them, upon request, without having any definite knowledge of their contents.

Mr. Najioka former operated a whoesale and retail plant and seed firm in San Francisco under the name of Oriental Plants & Seed oc. He reports that he was the exclusive agent in this section for a certain grower of strawberry plants in Utah. As such he took orders for strawberries and accepted a deposit on same. This deposit was forewarded to the grower, woodrow Kasuga, Rte 1 Mox 382, Sandy, Utah. Mr. Kajioka wrote to him about the first of march and advised him that the growers would not be able to accept the plants and asked him to refund the 3500.00 which he sent, As yet Mr. Kajioka has not heard from Kasuga nor recleved a check from him.

I checkedone of the contracts that the Japanese signed and about the only provesion in them is an agreement that lets the mursery out in event of any circumstance beyond their control. You undoubtedly have the original of one of the contracts their so you can go over same.



Replying to your letter of the 24th regarding Kazumi Kajioka it would appear that this individual has concocted a story wholly untrue endeavoring to create the impression of an abused and unfortunate oriental. None of the charges which he makes are true. Here is what actually happened.

In the month of July 1941 we did sell this party a car. On or about April 10, 1942 this party stated to the C. I. T. collector that he did not intend to make further payments on account of his contract and that he wished to return the car as a repossession. Accordingly a Release and Quitelaim form was prepared, as is usual in such cases, and he signed the same. A copy of this instrument is enclosed. He was allowed to keep his car for several days after the signing of this instrument and later appeared at our place of business stating again that he would make no more payments and was leaving the car as a repossession. The vehicle was in very poor condition showing signs of having been willfully mistreated. All accessories and equipment had been stripped from the car and the four tires were completely worn out. There was no spare. Eight months previous the car had been delivered to him with a new set of first grade tires.

He states to you that he later appeared and offered to bring his contract up to date. This is not true. He never offered to pay anything on account of his balance. He did state that he understood the Federal Reserve Bank would finance all Criental evacuees, and with that thought in mind asked for the return of his car, without payment. We sent him to the finance company and to the Federal Reserve Bank advising him that we would release the car if he could make a settlement with them. Nothing further was ever heard from this party. We would have been very happy to have had a payment from Kajioka, since the car was in miserable condition, and the Blue Book value was \$565.00 against a centract balance of \$650.00.

This party abused this car, failing to take any care of it whatseever, stripped it of all equipment, and ran all tires to the fabric with the deliberate intention of abandoning it to us. He did so abandon it, and then later on hearing of the efforts of your Benk to assist his countrymen decided to make an effort to use you as a Cat's Few to help him recover some value. We have cooperated with your Bank fully in respect to Japanese cars and your Mr. Albert H. Price of your Gan Francisco office, will, I am sure, bear us out in this. In some cases considerable sums were recovered for the Evacuees at no small trouble and expense to us. But these cars were, without exception, in good condition and attractive to purchasers.

In case this car in question is sold at a loss will it be possible for us to recover our deficiency from Kajioka or the Federal Reserve Bank?

Upon registering for evacuation, it was found that this woman and her husband, Masajiro Kajiura, have worked on the farm of Mr. J. H. Kerby for many years and that Mr. Kerby owed them on two promissory notes, both of which were dated May 1, 1941, and each due six months from date. One was in the amount of \$454.00 and the other in the amount of \$450.00. Both notes were signed by J. H. Kerby. In addition, there was an open book account claim for labor in the amount of \$864.50. Mrs. Kajiura stated that they had called at the WCCA office some time ago but that a young lady had advised them that they should consult an attorney and they had not actually talked to any representative of the Federal Reserve Bank up to this time. Mrs. Kajiura consulted Mr. Wallace Shepard, attorney of this city, concerning her claim and he had presented a claim to Mr. Kerby's attorney, Mr. Harris. Mr. Kerby claimed an off-set against the amounts owning on the notes and the open account and had offered to settle for \$750.00.

The following is a statement of the situation existing between Jesse H. Cave and myself over the legal ownership of a Chevrolet 1 ton truck, registered in the name of Jesse H. Cave and on which he has borrowed a sum of money from the Capitol National Bank of Sacremento on which there is a balance owing of \$600.00 on which the payments are delinquent and the bank demanding payment or repossession.

The truck was purchased by me in August, 1939 from the Capitol Chevrolet Co. for the sum of \$1200. on terms of \$600. down in the form of trade in and cash and the balance on a loan of \$600. to the Elk Grove Branch of the Bank of America. Mr. Cave from whom I had a sub agency of the General Petroleum Corporation also endorsed my note at the bank which I paid up in full in November 1940. Cave for agency reasons and on completion of payments, he became the legal owner by the bank signing off on the pink slip which was given over.

In March, 1941, I borrowed \$450.00 from the Capitol National Bank of Sacramento in order to buy an International "Pick up" truck from Jesse Cave, putting up as security, bath cars; Mr. Cave also signed the note as dealer. All payments on the loan were made by me and completed April 1, 1942. At that time the pank slip on the International was signed over to me by the bank but not the pink slip on the Chevrolet, it still being registered in the name of Jesse Cave. All payments on these leans were made by me and the trucks in my possession. Mr. D. J. Tait, Sacramento Manager of the General Petroleum Corporation knowns the above to be the facts.

On receiving notice of evacuation, I arranged to turn an agency which I had previously secured from the General Petroleum for the Florin District independent of Mr. Cave, to the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. and to lease my trucks to them. I intended to register them in the name of the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. as registered owner and myself as legal owner. For nearly two months I have been trying to secure the pink slip to the Chevrolet from Cave but have met with one evasion after another. Mr. Tait has also endeavored to help me get it but we have had no success. We found out that the pink slip was held by the Capitol National Bank together with one for a car owned by Cave as security for a losm on which there is a balance of \$600.00. They refuse to give it up unless the loan is paid. As the payments are delinquent the bank has placed the matter in the hands of its attorneys for collection. If the truck is repossessed, I will face a loss of from \$800. to \$1000. because of a loan secured by Cave on a car in which he had no interest and on which he borrowed without my consent or knowledge. I am asking your aid in securing this ownership certificate transferred to me so I may complete my arrangments with the Sierra Femal Oil Co. who are now operating the trucks for the agency.

This greatly interferred with the closing of my business transaction in the hands of the Federal Reserve Bank and at the time of departure I had not been able to close my business affairs, for the purpose of which I had been assigned to go on Friday, May 29, 1942.

se are enclosing a copy of a letter received by us from the above-named evacues, together with a copy of the agreement executed April 18, 1942 by the disputant parties and also a copy of our reply to Er. Kamimoto indicating reference to you of this matter.

According to our files, Mr. Kamimoto first approached as April 1, 1942 stating that he had bought 40 acres of land from the California Lands, Inc. in 1939. A mortgage amounting to \$10,800 was to be paid off in annual installments of \$1,200 plus 5% interest. The instrument was held by the Capitol Co. He sought our assistance in making some arrangement with the mortgage holder whereby total income from George Dethlaceen, the lessee, of \$1,600 per year would pay all expenses including taxes. Our former Salines representative, Mr. van Loben Sels, referred his entire case to the Farm Decurity Administration's representative at Mateonville.

Subsequently, Kamimoto informed us that he had given a power of attorney to Jess P. Nielsen of Natsonville. During his residence in the Salinas Assembly Center the evacues again asked our assistance and was interviewed on June 19, 1942. As his problem was entirely of an agricultural character, he was again referred to the Farm Security Administration's representative and indicated that a solution had been effected.

George E. Nishita, mentioned in Kazimoto's letter, first approached us on April 15, 1942 and related that he was purchasing 20 acres with approximately a \$7,000 balance due, payable at the rate of \$600 angually. The visit was primarily of an exploratory nature as he was negotiating for a lease on a basis sufficient to carry the property. We were subsequently advised that he had leased the property to Reginald D. King of Matsonville and was represented under a power of attorney by David F. Wright, 136 Locust Street, Hollister. No further information is possessed by us regarding him.

According to our records, our former Salinas reprementative, Mr. van Loben Sels, discussed your problems with you shortly after the original agreement was made. We believe that that agency will take whatever action is deemed necessary.





Dear Mr. Symma:

I wish to thank you very much for your kindness in siding me in securing the release of my blocked account.

However, there is another thing on which I would like to have your prompt assistance since I think you are responsible for the delay and expense that I am suffering in not being able to obtain delivery of my property which is being stored at the Bekins Moving and Storage Company. I am paying a high price to have goods store unnecessarily since I need the things so badly here. It is very cold here in Munt, and since all of my winter clothes are in storage, I am suffering from the cold. I am willing to pay all transportation charges, but I cannot afford to pay for unnecessary storage.

On September 16, I sent a letter by registered mail requesting the Bekins Storage Company to send my property to me. However, I
received a delayed reply on September 28, from them in which they
stated that you had advised the company not to send the property to
the camp unless we obtained a permit from the W.R.A. authorities. The
W.R.A. authorities state that such permits are unnecessary, and that
it is perfectly in order for me to obtain delivery of my property. Most
of the storage companies have already delivered the property of evaucees
to camp, and even those who had goods in government storage have obtained
their goods.

I have sent several letters to Bekins since requesting them to deliver my property, but I have received no reply. If my goods have not already been released and delivered, I would appreciate your assistance in securing a release of them immediately for we need the clothes very badly and it is costing me unnecessary expense in leaving them in storage.

Reference is made to our most recent letter of September 30, 1942 relating to the above subject.

We have been advised by the Bank of America Mational Trust and Savings Association, West Cakland Branch, that they did issue a contract in the name of the Star Laundry in January, 1941 in the amount of \$673.34, which was paid down to \$355.61 and became delinquent May 17, 1942.

However, this contract does not represent additional equipment but was issued for a sale negotiated by the California Laundry Equipment Company mentioned in our earlier advices. The latter company has paid off the contract in full and informus that they expect to effect a sale of the equipment and a removal from the presides in the near future. The specific items are: one Prosperity Shirt Unit, one Motor and one Hall-bearing Spindler.

The foregoing information conforms substantially with that already relayed to you with one exception; via, that the equipment held under contract by Caucasian interests has not actually been removed from the premises as yet, although such was the advice received by us and given to you. We are informed that the repossession is acceptable to Hiroshi Kamiya but due to the shortage of personnel the contract holders have been unable to dispatch a man for this purpose.

We are still anticipating advice from Mr. Hoffman, the landlord, in conjunction with the list of equipment presently at the site which you have requested.

Star Laundry Red Bluff, California

Mr. Hiroshi Kamiya operator of the above named laundry, which is located in Military Area No. 2, first approached our Chico office in early April.

It appears that subject was lessee of the property, with about four years remaining on the lease. At that time he was anxious to sell the business although no information was available that such area was subject to evacuation.

The bulk of the equipment for the operation of this business had been purchased by him on contract from F. Okawa, formerly of Reno, Nevada, who had returned to Japan in 1940.

The total purchase price of said equipment, a list of which is in our files, amounted to \$4,000.00, which, Kamiya stated, had been reduced to approximately \$2,000.00. Payments had not been made to Okawa since June, 1941 as United States authorities had returned, without advice, any checks subsequently mailed.

The Star Laundry's business had been sharply reduced since December 3, 1941 and on May 22, 1942 Kamiya advised us that efforts to find a buyer were unavailing. From a practical standpoint this office suggested that if a satisfactory buyer could be obtained a sale could be effected in view of Kamiya's status as a United States citizen. It was suggested that a blocked account in the name of Okawa be established and his rightful portion of the proceeds of the sale be deposited to his credit in that account. However, in view of the fact that a reasonable price could not be obtained, these suggestions were of no particular merit.

In addition to the equipment mentioned above, certain items about which there was no complexity of title had been purchased under contract from American business firms.

Two contracts with the California Laundry Equipment Company of Oakland were in effect; one which was negotiated in January, 1941 at a cost of approximately \$582.00 represented a chattel mortgage on shirt machine, collar press and air compressor, which had been reduced to approximately \$355.00; the second contract made in March, 1941, at an original cost of \$225.00, was for an extractor and the present balance is approximately \$78.00.

On July 10, 1942 our Chico representative was again approached by Kamiya, who sought advice in view of his changed status and the imminence of evacuation in Military Area No. 2. His landlord, Mr. Hoffman, was willing to cancel the lease without penalty but having secured a new tenant, was anxious to arrange removal of the equipment in order that he might lease the premises.

Kamiya supplied us with a copy of the mortgage agreement dated April 19, 1938 between himself and Okawa. Among the items included in the contract was a 1934 Ford Delivery on which the duly endorsed certificates of ownership were available. These certificates were forwarded to us, together with the documents, and are presently in our files.

On July 13, 1942 we addressed a letter to the Alien Property Custodian recapitulating this entire problem and seeking any advice or assistance he might be able to render. Up to the present time nothing has been forthcoming from that agency other than that they had forwarded the letter to Washington for exploration.

On July 24, 1942 we received a letter from the California Laundry Equipment Company advising that they dedired our permission to repossess that portion of the equipment which they had originally delivered to Kamiya. There was enclosed with their Letter a copy of a note addressed to them by Kamiya inviting them to repossess the equipment and advising them that the Government had taken over the balance.

This office contacted the California Laundry Equipment Company and advised them that we would in no wise prevent or interfere with repossession. The financial history of the contracts was ascertained as outlined earlier in this memorandum and we advised the California Laundry Equipment Company that further conversations would be held with them during the week beginning July 27, 1942, although it was made clear that nothing would be done to preclude foreclosure.

It is of course obvious that there is a plethora of laundry equipment for sale at the present time. This fact, coupled with the loss of goodwill because of Japanese ownership, has diminished the prices obtainable.

In the writer's opinion, Kamiya should allow repossession of that equipment owned by Caucasians because of the equity which is marginal and any sum he might receive would be nominal at best if sold through other channels.

Two avenues present themselves so far as that equipment under chattel to Okawa is concerned, viz., place it in storage for the duration, looking toward an ultimate renewal of the contract with Okawa after hostilities have ceased; Kamiya could give a power of attorney to some disinterested party for sale of this equipment with half the proceeds to go into a blocked account in the name of Okawa and the balance revert to himself.

If this alternative is used the minimum acceptable price would of course have to be stipulated.

There would undoubtedly be some question about the title in view of Okawa's absence but this is a matter which could be straightened out based on certain understandings.

It is suggested that this latter method presents the most desirable form of disposition, assuming that proper arrangements could be had.



The course, to be filed a CLAIM for missings against defendant Hosoda. We can not see any confidence and faith of S. Hosoda, Defendant. on July 26th, 1925.

On July 15th, 1935. after our trial, Judgment is ordered in favor of (Mrs.) Taki Kajima plaintiff, and against S. Hosoda defendent for \$50. and \$1. costs or return of all the furnitures etc.

Den Morozumi (interpreter of defendant), Shinjiro Hosoda, defendant and one woman run efter us, Morozumi called "Mr. Kajima, wait a minit", when we were on our way home from Van ness side gate of City Hall, after our trial.

And Morozumi stated to us that you don't need wait 5 days, you can take all your things to-day. Also, S. Hosoda has no intention to claim for the rent against you.

S. Hosoda demanded Kajima to settle the metter in humanely, stating himself that he was once agreed with Kajima, a campaign against vice of Japanese association of San Francisco in 1927 - 1928., during the past 10 years.

A woman with defendant, demanded Kajima to take away all our properties from the place of S. Hosoda and settle the matter between S. Hosoda and Kajima. But this proposal was refused by S. Hosoda.

But, S. Hosoda agreed to take away for the JUDGMENT of the Court.

Therefore, myself, my wife with baby went to Hosoda's house for the arrangement of our things, BECAUSE our things piled up in one room upon the request of Hosoda.

AND WE FOUND that in the room where we piled our things are moved away some where else. And the room is used for storing S. Hosoda's old furnitures: 5 old chairs, one desk, two tables, one tall radder, and old bed spring, etc.

THE EFORE, under S. Hosoda's instraction, we went round S. Hosoda the places where our things stored by S. Hosoda.

After we look round three places with S. Hosoda, Kajima questioned to him that EIGHT BOXS BOOKS, TWO BOXS HISTRICAL MATERIALS OF MY PUBLISHINGS, TWO BUREAU - DHOWERFULL THINGS, and ONE TABLE-DHOWERFULL THINGS are not in the places where we looked. WHERE ARE THEY KEPT? It weights more than TON.

S. Rosoda answered that he don't know because he hired man and moved the things under the management of TORUICHI HOSODA his son. and his son will be home in September.

CONSEQUENTLY, we just arranged the things in the barn only. And baby's cloths founded in an uncovered paper box which were kept in a middle drower of bureau, and one Iron, brought home by my wife.

S. Hosoda and D. Morozumi were drinking in the kitchen of Hosoda, when we were on our way home, from the barn of Hosoda. Morozumi requested

Kajima drink with them. Kajima refused Morozumi to drink with them.

Morozumi stated that he wented talk with me. Then, Kajima answered to kim that Kajima will make a call Morozumi for the talk without drinking.

Morozumi ceme out from his drinking seet, and he hold Kajima tight in his both arms, and Morozumi threatened Kajima that:

LISTEN TO ME? DON'T SUE HOSODA ANY MORE AGAINST HIS ACTIONS.
DON'T YOU LISTEN TO ME? DO YOU WAN'T FIGHT WITH ME BY REPUSING MOROZUMI'S REQUEST?

Then, Kajima answered to more zumi that refuseing more zumi's any request or demand, WHY constitute the reason of more zumi fights against Kajima. It may be in your disposal, may be your own selfish. Kajima can not help with it. OTHERWISE STATE THE REASON? WHY SHOULD BE KAJIMA RECOGNIZED WITH ANY DEMAND OF MORE ZUMI?

And then, morozumi his arms off from Kajima, on account of my beby's cry.

And then, Morozumi talked to my wife with his admonition voice, that you better take every things all you want to-day.

ON the 17th day of July, 1935. We want Hosoda's house again for the arrangement receiving my wife and baby's things.

We listed missings at large under the judgment. and Wo mentioned that we can not find things mentioned to S. Hosoda as the same as on July 15th, 1935.

And then S. Hosoda stated his talk in our past 10 years. and S. Hosoda questioned me that WHY DID NOT TAKE LEGAL ACTION IN JULY LAST YEAR? BECAUSE HE HAS NO EXPLANATION FOR THE PROPERTIES IN WEIGHTS OVER ONE TON.

CONSEQUENTLY, Kajima said to S. Mosoda that after the trial in the city hall S. Mosoda demanded Kajima to settle the matter in humanely. If it were your real desire and intention, I am always ready to do so.

BUT in our experiences in past, trying settle the matter between Hosoda and Kajima, always resulted it was invain.

SO THAT, if you have the faith of you for the settlement of the matter, you bring a confident man with you who may could be respond of you.

Ofcause, Kajima will bring a confident man with him, and settle the metter.

S. Hosoda with willingly agreed with it and stated that it is he disires. Then, Kajima leave to Hosoda for the date arrangement of our mettings to settle the metter.

On the 23rd day of July, 1935. We went Hosoda's house for receiving the things under the Judgment. And received the things under the watch of Juro Hosoda, and for the missings, claimed to Juro Hosoda inwritten.

On the 23rd day of July, 1935. Juro Mosoda and S. Hosoda's wife noticed to Kajima that S. Hosoda can not get a confident man for a settle of the matter in humanely what S. Hosoda desired.

So that Kajima made inquire of S. Hosoda into his church, because May 9, 1934. S. Hosoda and Hev. Kawashima talking the baptism of S. Hosoda when Kajima proposed Hosoda to pay rent a partly. And S. Hosoda refused it and he wanted me pay at once.

As a result of my inquire to the church where S. Hosoda attends., S. Hosoda baptized on the first day of April, 1934. By Rev. Kawashina.

Freshly baptized S. Hosoda can not get a confident man for a settle the matter deprived the properties of Kajima, without any due process of law.

As far as Kajima concerned with S. Hosoda since April 1926. He was a normal person in my sight. But now, Baptized S. Hosoda is not repent of his sin and gilty offenced by himself. IN FACT, S. Hosoda might be repent his less sin and gilty offenced in his past. And after S. Hosoda baptized in his phurch, decidedly he get worse of himself. It will be proved him apparently through the court.

WE RESPECT RELIGION, AVOID THE THOUBLES. Kajima can not see any confident and faith at S. Hosoda. It is the reason (Mrs.) Taki Kajima filed a CLAIM for missings against S. Hosoda, on the 26th day of July, 1925.

Also, S. Hosoda gives free talk to the public 3 - 4 times yearly, on the subject of the troubles of Justice and Humanity. What a conflic of himselt is?

STATEMENT OF CONTROVERSY CONCERNING EMPLOYMENT

between

Mrs. T. W. Connelly & Geo. Kenzo Kashiwagi

INTRODUCTION

This case came to me on May 18th at the Control Station, 1501 O'Farrell Street, San Francisco, by the complaint of Geo. Kashiwagi residing at 1696 Haight Street, San Francisco; that he had been in the employ of Mrs. Connolly for the past seventeen years. He contended that he was hired by Mrs. Connolly one or more half day periods each week as a houseboy to clean house and that there was a balance owing in the amount of \$436.50 as a result of such work. Mr. Kashiwagi presented numerous copies of statements which had been rendered to his employer at various times, showing the amounts owing for the period of the statement and the amounts paid on account in each instances.

Mr. Kashiwagi stated he discontinued the employment on or about January 1, 1941 with a balance at that time of \$576.50; that thereafter until about April 1st he performed similar services but was paid in each instance in cash.

He stated that during the period covered in this report he had many times made demand for the balance owing but was assured by Mrs. Connolly that he would be paid and that she urged him not to mention the matter of the amount owing to anyone as he would be taken care of and paid in full. With these promises, small amounts were paid on account as an inducement to continue his employment and services.

Mr. Kashiwagi stated that following April of 1941 he repeatedly continued to make demand for payment by attempted personal inverviews in which further promises were made and thereafter no consideration was given; in fact, the door was repeatedly slammed in his face. Furthermore, he had many times attempted to contact Mrs. Connolly by telephone whereupon the 'phone was hung up and no consideration given. During the latter part of last year, he was called into the District Attorney's office before Deputy District Attorney, Mrs. Evans, at 550 Montgomery Street, San Francisco, and warned by her to make no more personal calls or telephone calls but that if he had something coming, he should take legal procedure. Mr. Kashiwagi further stated that he understood that sometime during 1941 Mrs. Connolly had turned over all of her property and finances to her daughter, Miss Alice Connolly, residing with her mother and a school teacher at the Daniel Webster School, and to her son, Alvin Connolly, now of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C; that during May and June of 1941, Miss Connolly made one or two payments of \$10.00 each on account and that beginning September 15th, Miss Connolly paid him by check, marked "on account" \$10.00 and in four successive payments thereafter, making a total of \$50.00 for this period, until the last payment made on January 1, 1942; furthermore, that Miss Connolly then recognized the account and assured Mr. Kashiwagi that he would be paid in full.

It appears that after January 1st any attempt to collect the amount owing was resisted by both Mrs. Connolly and her daughter, Miss Alice Connolly, with a refusal to discuss the matter in person or over the 'phone and that to cause him to desist any further annoyances, the services of the Burns Detective Agency were employed. He was reported to the F.B.I. and an attempt was made to obtain a warrant for his arrest at the Richmond District Police Station.

Mr. Kashiwagi further stated that he had been employed as houseboy in San Francisco by such persons as Mrs. Angelo J. Rossi, the wife of Mayor Rossi; Mrs. Eleanor Leggat, Mrs. J. H. Greffkens, Mrs. Howard Thurber, Mrs. A. J. Romey, Dr. J. M. McNaught, Mrs. Richard D. Araunt and many other families of reputation in San Francisco.

With this background, Mr. Kashiwagi was then asked to make up a detailed statement of the account from his memorandum of statements rendered to justify his claim. Such a statement, as compiled by Mr. Kashiwagi, is attached hereto and made a part of this report, showing the dates, details of amounts due together with total monthly amounts, the amounts paid on account, the balances due at the end of each month and the final balance of \$436.50.

TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH MRS. CONNOLLY

At about moon on May 18th I 'phoned to Mrs. T. W. Connolly at her residence, 1346 Lake Street, telephone - Skyline 0964, and told her that Mr. Kashiwagi had complained that she was owing to him for employment as houseboy in the approximate amount of \$436.00; that the Federal Reserve Bank was interested in the problems of evacuation and that such matters should be settled amicably between the parties interested; that Mr. Kashiwagi had complained that he had many times attempted to collect the amount owing but had been met with lack of consideration by her and that I was inquiring as to her side of the story that a proper understanding might be reached as to the transaction.

Mrs. Connolly then explained that George Kashiwagi had been employed by her for about seventeen years; that she owed him nothing but that he had continued to disturb her until she had to seek the services of a Burns Detective employed for a couple of months; that she went to the Federal Bureau of Investigation in San Francisco and proved to them that she owed him nothing; furthermore, that she had him before the District Attorney, Mrs. Evans, Deputy, whereupon she also proved to Mrs. Evans that she owed him nothing. On continued annoyances, she swore out a warrant against Mr. Kashiwagi at the Richmond District Police Station. She further stated that she had no money to pay his claim, if there was such amounts owing, as she had turned over all of her business to her daughter, Miss Alice Connolly, and was therefore without any funds.

I then reasoned with Mrs. Connolly that if there were amounts owing, it would be proper that settlement be made and I would like to have her come down to the Control Station to discuss the matter and to look over the statement made by Mr. Kashiwagi. At the beginning of the conversation Mrs. Connolly told me that she had her cancelled checks for all payments made and upon my asking that these be presented, she then said that they had been destroyed and that she had no such documents and that she had turned over all of her business to her daughter.

OTHER CONVERSATIONS

After discussing the matter with Mrs. Connolly, I 'phoned Mrs. Evans, Deputy District Attorney, at 550 Montgomery Street, and found that Mrs. Connolly had complained that George Kashiwagi was bothering them about a bill; that George was called into the office and told by her that he should make no further attempts to 'phone or contact Mrs. Connolly personally, but if he thought they owed him for labor, he should file a claim in court. She also said that she did not discuss or determine the justice of the account, or express an opinion thereon.

I further checked with the Richmond District Police Station and found that Mrs. Connolly had attempted to have an officer make an arrest of Mr. Kashiwagi but that they refused to do so and told Mrs. Connolly that he had a right to ask for the money if such an amount were owing.

I further checked with Mr. A. M. Harris of the Burns Detective Agency in San Francisco and he said that their services were called upon by Mrs. Connolly to "trail George Kashiwagi to find out what he wanted", but that they did not find him. He further said he thought there was something behind the motive of Mrs. Connolly that she was not divulging.

I further checked with Mr. Griffin of the Federal Bursau of Investigation at 111 Sutter Street, San Francisco, and was told that Mrs. Connolly asked them to make an investigation of the background of George Kashiwagi and that he was disturbing them by continued demands for money. Mr. Griffin stated that this request was refused on the statement that if money was owing to Mr. Kashiwagi that they could not concern themselves with the matter.

'PHONE CONVERSATION WITH ALICE CONNOLLY

At about 5:20 P.M., May 18th, I 'phoned Alice Connolly at her mother's home and stated that George Kashiwagi had presented a statement of some \$436.00 owing for houseboy services and inquired as to why this bill had not been paid, after explaining the position of the bank as to its interests in the problems of evacuation.

.

Miss Connolly stated that Mr. Kashiwagi had worked for the family since she was a girl and for at least some seventeen years past; that she was not responsible for any amounts owing by her mother or by the family and that her mother had no funds with which to pay any amounts as her mother's business had been turned over to her and that she did not propose to pay any of the obligations of the family; that they had in the past many servants and had always paid their bills when due. She further stated that she could not understand George's attitude in approaching her to pay the obligations of her mother if such obligations existed; that recently he had made such demands that they were compelled to seek the services of a private detective, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and had been forced to obtain a warrant for his arrest because of his continued harrassing them for amounts claimed to be owing; that she considered it was a case of blackmail to extort monies from the family.

I then told Miss Connolly that Mr, Kashiwagi had prepared a detailed statement based upon the statements rendered from time to time wherein a balance was owing of \$436.50; that on this statement it appeared that she had paid Mr. Hashiwagi in amounts of \$10.00 each the amount of \$50.00 from September 15, 1941 to January 1, 1942, which evidently proved her recognition of the balance owing. Miss Connolly then stated, "Yes, I did this to keep him quiet and if I had thought, I would not have paid him anything after the incident at Pearl Harbor. My uncle, Mr. E. D. Swift of the Swift Lumber Company, told me that I was foolish to pay George any more money after Pearl Harbor."

I then asked Miss Connolly if it was her attitude that the incident at Fearl Harbor relieved her or her family of any further financial obligations to Japanese people in this country. She said, "Yes, I would not have paid him any money if I had thought of how serious Pearl Harbor was".

I then stated to Miss Connolly that from the statement rendered, it is evident that your family is owing to Mr. Kashiwagi in the amount of \$436.50 as an accumulated balance over a period of the last nine or ten years and that the bank desired to know if this amount or any other amount was owing.

She said, "Well, that is what he says is owing. Do you take his word against that of an American? What, are you trying to defend these Japs?" I then explained the position of the bank as entrusted with the duty, under the Evacuation Order, of seeing that no undue advantage was taken of evacuees and that their business and property relations be settled in an orderly manner and on a fair basis. Furthermore, that since he had complained of the amount owing, I would like to have her come down to the Control Station and discuss the matter with the idea in mind of an amicable settlement.

She said that she did not personally owe this Japanese anything; that her mother had turned over all her affairs to her and had nothing with which to pay and that she was not going to pay her mother's obligations or those of the family and that she did not consider that she owed Mr. Kashiwagi one penny. I then asked that her mother come down to the Control Station and go over this statement so as to arrive at the proper conclusion of the amount owing, if any. She further informed me that neither she nor her mother would discuss the matter further and no additional amounts of money would be paid to the Japanese.

CONCLUSION

After these conversations and extended investigation, it is my personal opinion that an attempt has been made to evade paying this obligation for services rendered by intimidation, threats and embarrassments of this Japanese to try and make him give up the pursuit of his just claim. There is a strong conviction in my mind that these people have used the services of this Japanese and abused him at every turn by false promises that he would be paid and asking him not to mention to anyone that amounts were owing from time to time, thus forestalling any attempt by him to make collection prior to this time.

In my conversation with Miss Connolly, I found her most evasive in her conversation, side-tracking questions asked by relating irrelevant matters and a general evasion. In fact, she showed disposition of utter lack of cooperation in the consideration of this matter of determining the true emounts owing. Mr. Kashiwagi related that in every instance of his presenting a statement of account, Mrs. Connolly checked with him from her records which she kept, verifying the exact amounts and balances owing.

I have 'phoned all of the people above enumerated for whom he has worked in the past, including Mrs. Angelo Rossi. In every instance he was highly commended, having been entrusted with the keys to homes and offices to come and go as he pleased in the performance of the work for which he was employed. He was considered as strictly reliable, having performed his duties carefully and honestly, and was in all respects extremely satisfactory.

I am impressed with the fact that repeated promises have been made to forestall any action on his part to collect these amounts until more recently his demands have seemingly become irksome to the extent that they used the Pearl Harbor incident to relieve them from any further obligation to this Japanese, and that they have used every means of attempted intimidation by calling upon the various agencies enumerated herein to scare him into submission.

In the conclusion of this investigation and on the urgent request of Mr. Kashiwagi as to his legal rights, he was informed that he had the right to file his claim with the Labor Commission against Mrs. Connolly and also her daughter, since the affairs of the mother had been turned over recently to the daughter, Miss Alice Connolly, and her son, Alvin Connolly. This was done by Mr. Kashiwagi on the afternoon of May 19th and a hearing has been set for Tuesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, May 26th, 1942, at the Commissioner's office, 515 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, with reference to Mr. Goldsworthy, Deputy.

At the time the Katano's were sent to the Concentration Camp in Arizona they gave us a letter, or order, to rent their property, collect the rent and apply the rent on bills which they owed us.

The Citizen's National Bank of Los Angeles now claim that they hold title to the property through a Sales Contract or Trust Deed.

We wrote to the Citizen's National Bank and asked them to advise us as to their interest in this property so that we could protect the Katano interest while the Katano's were in the Concentration Camp. We have had no answer to our letter and the bank has made further demands upon the renters for payment of rent direct to them.

As we understand it the Katano's owe them bank approximately \$1000.00. The property is worth approximately \$3200.00.

We do not believe the bank should be permitted to confiscate this property with no equity left for the Katano's.

Will you please take this up with the Citizen's National Bank or advise us what steps should be taken to protect this property.

We are in receipt of a letter from our Sacramento Branch Office asking us to write you regarding this case.

On last Friday, May First, we sent the insured's father, Takeo Katayama, a letter, and with it enclosed the official receipt in settlement of the December, 1941 quarterly premium, and also returned to him the certified copy of the insured's birth record which was given to us in connection with the premium payment.

Ever since January 14, 1942, we had been endeavoring to obtain the necessary affidavits and copy of the insured's birth record so that we could accept payment of the December, 1941 premium. 



MEMORANDUM

FISHIM TACKLE STOP

Mr. Russell W. Cantrell, 703 Market Street, telphone Garfield 2411, attorney for Kawabata, called this morning with his client and a friend who had previously talked to us about the case.

The attorney stated substantially as follows:

"He believes that his client's lease on property at 1798 Post Street is automatically cancelled on the date his client is evacuated. That as long as his client paid the rent promptly under his lease, it is not material to the land owner to what extent or amount he liquidated the fishing tackle business contained on the premises.

"That when Kawabata took over the business from Netsu, he gave as part consideration, amount of the deposit previously put up by Netsu on the earlier lease; in other words, in agreeing to forfeit this \$180, it comes out of his funds, and not the sum of \$15 referred to in Stoff's letter of April 13 to the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, attached hereto."

After talking with parties representing both sides of the situation, the following appears to be the present status of the case:

Stoff, representing the owner, has other pro-perties of somewhat similar character under his charge in the Japanese area. He apparently contacted Kawabata shortly after December 7, (which is not denied by Kawabata or his attorney) in an effort to have him sell the store and lease. From conversation with Stoff, I would judge the purchaser he had for the inventory might have been Weinstein, or some other liquidating concern, whose offer would be fairly low.

While Cantrell's client did not state in detail what he had received from liquidating his inventory in the past four months, it would appear to be a substantial amount, and probably in excess of the \$5,000 figure indicated by Weinstein some time ago.

We are handing you herewith the letter you requested.

We talked with the tenant, Yoshiyo Kawabata, who operated a fishing tackle business at 1798 Post Street when War was declared and asked him to sell the store and lease so that the owner could be protected. He said he could get more money selling it retail and was not interested in having a to-let sign on the premises. The lease was made August 15, 1941 when conditions were good and a more advantageous lease could have been obtained. 
